We continue with the role of blood sacrifice in covenant making. Blood is A WORD the sign of life and the shedding of it is an 🕻 offering of life to God. As mentioned last week, the offering of lifeblood takes place through

death. This is because death entered the world as the natural result of sin. If sin never happened, there would be no need for blood sacrifice because everyone would already be in union with God. There would be no need for Christ to sacrifice Himself and offer His blood to the Father in atonement for our sins.

However, we all know that sin has entered the picture and every human being will taste death. Blood sacrifice is necessary in God's covenant making with us. The covenant transforms our fallen nature and grafts us to the divine nature of God as His children. He doesn't initially remove death but experiences it Himself through His Son Jesus for our sake in order to eliminate its long-term effect condemnation.

The covenantal blood sacrifice's most perfect expression is seen in Christ the Divine Bridegroom dying for His Bride the Church. He offers Himself in total and complete love for the good of His Bride. On the Cross, Jesus removes His Bride's sinful impurity and makes her holy by paying the price of her sin, which is death. Christ's blood is not a symbol of life but actually imparts the gift of divine life because He is both God and man. Hence, Christ's blood of the new and eternal covenant is the seal upon our soul of everlasting love. St. Paul in his letter to the Ephesians emphasizes the mystical marriage between Christ and His Bride the Church, made holy through His shed blood and seen in miniature in the lives of married Catholics (ref. Ep 5:21-33).

Which brings us to the covenant between husband and wife. As mentioned last week, covenantal blood is spilled between husband and wife through sexual union. God has so constructed our humanity that in our flesh is written the expression of covenantal love through blood sacrifice. Blood is shed every time husband and wife make love, even if only on a microscopic level. This is why God wants men and women to be virgins before they get married, because their sexual union is the blood sacrifice of their covenant.

The new and eternal covenant in Jesus Christ is the bond of love between husband and wife when they get married in the Catholic Church (it takes three to get married - Jesus, husband and wife). Therefore, He is present to their love-making. When expressed within the confines of good moral actions (that is, not done lustfully or with contraceptives) their sexual union becomes an act of worship to God.

In addition to the gift of creating children, sexual union has as its fruit the worship of God and an increase of grace for the spouses. However, the misuse of it between those not married results in an implicit act of worship to Satan. Yes, this is true. When Catholics have sex outside of a sacramental marriage, they are covenanting themselves under a lie, with no permanency in love (no martial oath) or blessing from God. That act then comes under the domain of the Father of Lies. Next week I'll address the fourth element of covenant making: the Meal.




