From The Desk of Deacon Mike

Through the years, I have found the majority of people I encounter through our Jail Ministry to be **baptized** individuals. Therefore, they are our brothers and sisters, members of the Body of Christ.

Does Jesus truly want His followers to go behind bars and minister to members of His Body who have committed crimes? Here are two relevant Scripture verses showing how God's plan of salvation extends behind the jail doors to those society often judges to be incorrigible.

MATTHEW 25:34-40

"Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty, and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes, and you clothed me, I was sick, and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.'

"Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?'

"The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these my brethren, you did for me."

MARK 2:17

Jesus said to them, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."

It is clear that God desires all to be saved and with the help of His grace no life is beyond His reach. As Catholic Christians we believe that Jesus offers hope, healing, and a new purpose for each life. He can make even the most broken people and situations whole again, replacing the cycle of crime with a cycle of renewal.


