This Saturday, October 7, was the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary. The Church celebrates the miraculous intercession of Mary through the praying of the Rosary that won a decisive battle for the Church. Pope Pius V asked for all Catholics to pray the Rosary for victory against the Muslims that

Rosary for victory against the Muslims that were over-running the Mediterranean. The main force left to combat them was from Spain.

The Muslims had a huge fleet and the Spanish, a much smaller one. Everyone prayed the Rosary, and in 1571 A.D., the small Spanish fleet defeated the Muslim armada at the Battle of Lepanto. That victory halted the Muslim advance into the rest of Europe. Our Lady came through for the Church and preserved Catholicism. She was first hailed as Our Lady of Victory, but this celebration was changed to Our Lady of the Rosary.

The Rosary is one of the most beautiful and powerful prayers present to mankind. It contains all the major mysteries of our salvation. Praying the Hail Mary and Our Father comes straight from the Scriptures. The Hail Mary prayer is composed of excerpts from the Gospel of Luke and the Our Father is found in both the Gospel of Matthew and Luke. The mysteries themselves are taken from Scripture and Tradition.

On a very basic level, when we pray the Rosary, we are praying Scripture, which is the revealed Word of God. We allow the action of the Holy Spirit to fill us with this Divine Word, Who is really Christ Himself. All the Scriptures point to Him. With the Rosary, we are immersing ourselves in the Word of God and through the Blessed Virgin Mary, enter into the infinite mystery of God Himself. Our Lady first conceived the Eternal Word of the Father in her heart before He ever became flesh in her womb. Praying the Rosary then, allows the Word of God, Jesus Christ, to enter our hearts through the same Holy Spirit that entered Mary's heart. We become imitators of Mary, who is the Spouse of the Holy Spirit and the perfect disciple of her Son, Jesus.

With our hearts and minds filled with the Word of God as was Our Lady's heart and mind, we can honestly claim victory over the forces bent on destroying us. The Blessed Virgin Mary is a loving Mother who will obtain every help necessary for us to be fruitful and victorious in the battle for our soul. All of us are in the spiritual battle whether we realize it or not. Through the Rosary, our Lady obtains graces for us from her Divine Son and the Holy Spirit so we may be fully equipped to carry out God's will and destroy any effect of the kingdom of the devil in our soul.

Mary was not only conceived without sin, but also never chose to sin at any point in her life. The power and triumph of her Son over sin was seen perfectly in her. She will obtain this grace of complete faithfulness to God's will for each of her children. We simply need to turn regularly to Momma and ask for her help. The Rosary is a marvelous and powerful way of letting her act in our life.
