Just before Christmas, the Vatican came out with a document that gave the impression that homosexual couples could receive blessings. A couple practicing homosexuality cannot receive a blessing because the homosexual acts themselves are sinful. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) states: "Basing itself in Sacred

Scripture, which presents homosexual acts as acts of grave depravity, tradition has always declared that homosexual acts are intrinsically disordered. They are contrary to the natural law. They close the sexual act to the gift of life. They do not proceed from a genuine affective and sexual complementarity. Under no circumstances can they be approved" (n.2357). Over the next few weeks, I will pull apart this passage from the Catechism and explore its meaning. We will look at the areas of natural law, the nature of man as a sexual being, and sex as an expression of covenantal love.

What is the natural law? "The natural law is a participation in God's wisdom and goodness by man formed in the image of his Creator. It expresses the dignity of the human person and forms the basis of his fundamental rights and duties" (CCC, n. 1978). This law then governs creation in goodness and is perceived by man because we have the ability to reason. This use of our reason makes us what is called a rational creature. Reason enables us to know what is good and to follow it. "The 'divine and natural' law shows man the way to follow so as to practice the good and attain his end" (CCC, n.1955). What is our end? Eternal life in God, Who is the absolute Good.

The natural law is written in the heart of every human being. It is universal, applies to everyone and is unchanging. What was good at the very beginning, remains good to this day. The natural law is the moral (moral – what is good, not evil) compass etched upon the deepest part of our soul and manifests in what we call the conscience. The natural law is the foundation from whence our conscience finds its voice.

The simple use of reason will discover order in God's creation. Human science itself will attest to this truth that is found even on a subatomic level. We know from the beginning of Genesis that God created everything from nothing. What had not existed, suddenly and deliberately came to exist in goodness. He set in motion a divine law that preserves and regulates life and existence for all things. We find that He set mankind with the task of taking care of His creation (cf. Gen 1:26-28). In order to exercise this authority, He gave us the ability to know and understand through reason the natural law. This law leads us to goodness, and ultimately to Him. However, behaving contrary to the natural law, as seen with homosexual acts, consequently leads to a rejection of God. More next week.


