

A CHRISTMAS REPRISE

The Church's celebration three weeks ago of the Baptism of the Lord signaled the "official" end of the Christmas season. Today's feast of the Presentation of the Lord seems to extend the Incarnation celebration a bit longer. In fact, some have called this feast a "second Epiphany."

The first reading recalls the anticipation of Advent, as Malachi writes, "Lo, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me." The reading from Hebrews reminds us of the Incarnation, proclaiming that Jesus had a "share" in our own "blood and flesh." The Gospel finds the infant Jesus on his first visit to Jerusalem and his human parents once again surprised and in awe over the events surround his birth.

In the simplicity of the manger, in the grandeur of the temple, in the domesticity of Nazareth, Jesus comes. May we come to know him and so be filled with "wisdom" and the "favor of God."

Blessing of the candles is held when we celebrate the purification of Our Lady on the 40th day after the birth of Our Lord, and of the Presentation of the offering of Our Lord to the Eternal Father in the temple. The wax of the candles signifies the virginal flesh of the Divine Infant; the wick figures His soul and the flame His Divinity.

Saint Blaise of Sebaste, Turkey. Suffering and illness have always been among the greatest problems that trouble the human spirit. We feel and experience pain as all people, yet our faith helps us to grasp more deeply the mystery of suffering and to bear pain with greater courage. Part of the plan laid out by God's providence is that we should fight



strenuously against all sickness and carefully seek the blessings of good health, so that we may fulfill our role in human society and the Church. The prayer from the Blessing of the Throats is:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
