OUR HOPE AND GOD'S PROMISE

The Church uses these waning November days and darker skies as the season to remind us of the last things. Today's feast, the Solemnity of All Saints, is the centerpiece of three days that point to doctrines we proclaim each time we say the Apostles' Creed: "We believe in the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting." And while the days and our hearts may be dark, the readings today are bright with the light of faith. John's vision in the book of Revelation reveals dazzling angels and white-robed saints gathered in triumph around the throne of God. In the responsorial psalm we sing our longing to see God's face, and in the second reading John writes that we are God's children and will, in fact, see God "as he is" (1 John 3:2). This is our hope. This is God's promise. Today we celebrate the triumph of those who already gaze on the face of God. Tomorrow we cry out for mercy with those in purgatory, who, like us on earth, still long to see God's face.



Cầu nguyện và cộng tác cứu trợ nạn nhân lũ lụt

Kính gửi Cộng đồng Dân Chúa tại Việt Nam và hải ngoại.

Như chúng ta đã biết, trong những ngày qua, đồng bào miền Trung (từ Hà Tĩnh đến Quảng Ngãi) đã và đang chịu ảnh hưởng nặng nề do mưa lũ với nhiều thiệt hại về người, nhà cửa, cây trồng và vật nuôi... Theo báo cáo của Tổng cục phòng chống thiên tai, thiệt hại ban đầu do mưa lũ những ngày qua tính đến 18g ngày 10/10/2020, như sau:

09 người chết, 11 người mất tích và 07 người bị thương;

33.387 nhà bị thiệt hại, trong đó 04 nhà bị hư hỏng hoàn toàn.

Trồng trọt: 224 hecta lúa bị ngập, 2.368 hecta hoa màu bị ngập; Nuôi trồng thủy sản bị thiệt hại: 881 hecta; Gia súc, gia cầm bị chết, cuốn trôi: 58.060 con.

Theo trung tâm dự báo Khí tượng thủy văn quốc gia, những ngày tới sẽ còn có các đợt áp thấp nhiệt đới gây mưa lớn ở miền Trung. Đứng trước nguy cơ lũ chồng lũ và những cảnh mất mát đau thương nêu trên, Ủy ban Bác ái Xã hội – Caritas Việt Nam (UBBAXH-Caritas Việt Nam) thiết tha kêu gọi mọi thành phần Dân Chúa, trong nước cũng như ở hải ngoại tích cực cầu nguyện và quảng đại giúp đỡ đồng bào miền Trung vượt qua những khó khăn, khắc phục hậu quả thiên tại.

Trong tinh thần hiệp thông, UBBAXH-Caritas Việt Nam xin chia sẻ sự mất mát về người và của với anh chị em tại những khu vực ảnh hưởng do bão và mưa lũ. Nguyện xin Thiên Chúa giàu lòng thương xót đón nhận những người đã qua đời, và an ủi những người đang đau buồn trước sự ra đi của người thân.

Sự chia sẻ của anh chị em, vừa thực hiện giáo huấn yêu thương của Chúa, vừa thể hiện truyền thống tốt đẹp "lá lành đùm lá rách" của người Việt Nam. THE SOLEMINITY OF ALL SAINTS

All Saint's Day (or officially The Solemnity of All Saints) is instituted to honor all the saints, known and unknown. In early days the Christians were accustomed to solemnize the anniversary of a martyr's death for Christ at the place of martyrdom. The earliest certain observance of a feast in honor of all the saints is an early fourth-century commemoration of "all the martyrs." Later, the Church acknowledged other paths to sanctity or sainthood.

Today's feast honors the obscure as well as the famous, the known and the unknown —even the saints each of us have known. While most saints have a particular feast day on the Catholic calendar (usually, though not always, the date of their death), not all of those feast days are observed. And saints who have not been canonized those who are in Heaven, but whose sainthood is known only to God — have no particular feast day. In a special way, All Saints Day is their feast.

SAINT MARTIN DE PORRES (1579-1639)

November 3



An old illustration pictures Martin de Porres, finger to his lips—"Shhhh!"—as several mice peek out of sacristy vestment drawers, preparing to join a rodent "procession" following him out of church! Martin's rescue of these unwelcome guests, and statues depicting him, **ST. MARTIN** broom in hand, feeding a dog, cat, bird, **De Porres** and mouse from the same dish symbolize his life and sanctity. Initially denied

entrance by the Dominicans because of his mixed race (Spanish father, Panamanian mother), Martin cherished society's marginalized. For him, menial tasks, lovingly done, were sacred. Great and lowly alike feasted on his charity. Enemies were reconciled by this "poor mulatto" (his self-description), kind even to those whose racism demeaned him. Apprenticed to a surgeon-barber in his youth—thus patron saint of hair stylists and public health providers—Martin dispensed healing and dignity to Lima's poorest, serving in them the Christ he adored for hours in the Blessed Sacrament. By the time he died, all Peru called him Martin the Charitable, a title even those of us who will never be called "saint" might still aspire to.




