

### APRIL - THE HOLY SPIRIT

### **Symbols of the Holy Spirit**

1/ Water: The symbolism of water signifies the Holy Spirit's action in Baptism.

**2/ Anointing:** The symbolism of anointing with oil also signifies the Holy Spirit, to the point of becoming a synonym for the Holy Spirit.



**3/ Fire:** While water signifies birth and the fruitfulness of life given in the Holy Spirit, fire symbolizes the transforming energy of the Holy Spirit's actions.

**4/ Cloud and light:** These two images occur together in the manifestations of the Holy Spirit.

**5/ The seal:** is a symbol close to that of anointing. "The Father has set his seal" on Christ and also seals us in him.

**6/ The hand:** Jesus heals the sick and blesses little children by laying hands on them. In his name the apostles will do the same. Even more pointedly, it is by the Apostles' imposition of hands that the Holy Spirit is given.

**7/ The finger**: "It is by the finger of God that [Jesus] cast out demons." If God's law was written on tablets of stone "by the finger of God," then the "letter from Christ" entrusted to the care of the apostles, is written "with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone, but on tablets of human hearts." The hymn Veni Creator Spiritus invokes the Holy Spirit as the "finger of the Father's right hand."

**8/ The dove:** At the end of the flood, whose symbolism refers to Baptism, a dove released by Noah returns with a fresh olive-tree branch in its beak as a sign that the earth was again habitable. When Christ comes up from the water of his baptism, the Holy Spirit, in the form of a dove, comes down upon him and remains with him. The Spirit comes down and remains in the purified hearts of the baptized.

## SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER SUNDAY OF DIVINE MERCY MEDITATION: 04/16/2023

### "... praising God and enjoying favor with all the people". (Acts 2:47)

What a beautiful vision! The first believers' experience of the Spirit was so life-changing that they felt compelled to come together to worship the Lord and love one another as family.

But this ideal situation didn't last long. Only a short time later, prejudice and tribalism crept in, leading some to neglect the needs of the poorer widows among them (Acts 6:1). Later, some members of this mostly Jewish Christian community began telling Gentiles – falsely – that they had to be circumcised if they wanted to "be saved" (15:1). This attempt to treat Gentiles as second-class citizens caused "no little dissension" among the believers (15:2).

Stories like these might make us wonder, If the first Christians couldn't live together, what hope does our Church have?

But today is Divine Mercy Sunday. Today we celebrate the good news that God is always ready to forgive and to heal divisions. Take the early Church, for example. By all counts, it should not have lasted more than a decade or two. But in fact, it not only survived but continued to grow and spread. That's because God's mercy, poured out at every Eucharist and every time his people gathered together, softened believers' hearts and moved them to resolve their conflicts peacefully and lovingly. What a powerful testament to a God whose merciful love triumphs over every imaginable obstacle!

Even today, God's mercy continues to flow. Every division and conflict can be overcome as we come together to worship him, confess our need for him, and strive to make love our aim. Every sin can be washed away and every relationship restored! Jesus, our merciful Savior, is always ready to help us love one another.

### CHÚA NHẬT HAI PHỤC SINH KÍNH LÒNG THƯƠNG XÓT CHÚA SUY NIỆM: 04/16/2023

### "(Họ)... ca tụng Thiên Chúa và được toàn dân thương mến" (Cv 2,47).

Quả là một viễn cảnh đẹp! Kinh nghiệm về Thánh Thần của các tín hữu đầu tiên là cuộc sống biến đổi nhiều đến độ họ cảm thấy được thúc đẩy đến với nhau để thờ phượng Chúa và yêu thương nhau như một gia đình.

Nhưng tình huống lý tưởng này đã không kéo dài. Chỉ một thời gian ngắn sau đó, định kiến và chủ nghĩa bộ tộc đã len lỏi vào, khiến một số người bỏ lơ nhu cầu của những bà góa nghèo khó hơn trong số họ (x. Cv 6,1). Sau đó, một số thành viên của nhóm cộng đồng Kitô Giáo hầu hết là người Do Thái này đã bắt đầu nói với những Người Dân Ngoại – một cách sai lầm – rằng họ phải chịu cắt bì nếu họ muốn "được cứu độ" (Cv 15,1). Nổ lực đối xử với những Người Dân Ngoại như những công dân hạng hai đã gây ra "mối bất đồng không nhỏ" giữa các tín hữu (x. Cv 15,2).

Những câu chuyện như thế này có thể khiến chúng ta thắc mắc, nếu các Kitô hữu đầu tiên không thể sống với nhau, thì liệu Giáo Hội có niềm hy vọng nào không?

Nhưng hôm nay là Chúa Nhật Lòng Chúa Thương Xót. Hôm nay, chúng ta cử hành tin vui Thiên Chúa luôn luôn sẵn sàng tha thứ và chữa lành các mối chia rẽ. Bạn hãy lấy Giáo Hội sơ khai làm điển hình. Theo tất cả các trình thuật, có lẽ nó không kéo dài hơn một hay hai thập kỷ. Tuy nhiên, trên thực tế, nó đã không chỉ sống sót mà còn tiếp tục phát triển và lan rộng. Đó là nhờ lòng thương xót của Thiên Chúa, đã tuôn đổ ra nơi mỗi Thánh Lễ và mỗi lần dân Chúa tụ hợp với nhau, làm mềm lòng các tín hữu và thúc đẩy họ giải quyết những cuộc xung đột của họ cách bình an và yêu thương. Quả là một lời tuyên bố hùng hồn về một Vị Thiên Chúa mà tình yêu thương xót của Người chiến thắng mọi rào cản có thể tưởng tượng được!

Ngay cả ngày nay, lòng thương xót của Thiên Chúa vẫn tiếp tục tuôn chảy. Mọi sự chia rẽ và xung đột có thể được khắc phục khi chúng ta cùng nhau đến thờ lạy Người, thổ lộ với Người nhu cầu và nỗ lực muốn sống yêu thương của chúng ta. Mọi tội lỗi có thể được tẩy sạch và mọi mối tương quan được phục hồi! Chúa Giêsu, Đấng Cứu Độ đầy lòng thương xót của chúng ta, luôn luôn sẵn sàng giúp chúng ta yêu thương nhau.

"Lạy Chúa Giêsu Kitô, Con Thiên Chúa giàu lòng xót thương, xin hãy lôi kéo dân của Chúa lại với nhau trong tình yêu!"

### OUR FASCINATING FAITH DIVINE MERCY

Saint John Paul II named the Second Sunday of Easter "Sunday of Divine Mercy" in response to Saint Faustina Kowalska's Divine Mercy devotion, which offered spiritual comfort to hearts worldwide. But Pope Francis challenges us to make the comfort that we receive a gift we gladly share, saying that because mercy was first shown to us we are therefore called to show mercy ourselves. The clearest expression of merciful love, says Francis, is pardoning others. He acknowledges how difficult it can be to forgive sometimes, but if we are to achieve peace in our hearts, pardon is the tool that has been put into our very fallible hands. The necessary condition for living joyfully? We must let go of anger, hatred, revenge, and violence. A tall order in a world seemingly bent on the destruction of every peaceful impulse. May Divine Mercy Sunday remind us that Jesus made mercy our life's ideal and a criterion for our faith's credibility: "Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy" (Matthew 5:7).


