CHÚA NHẬT XI THƯỜNG NIỀN A

JESUS GIVES HIS DISCIPLES
AUTHORITY TO HEAL AND SET FREE

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Eastern Christians have no sacrament of "confirmation," but they have always had the custom of richly anointing the newly baptized in myron, or sacred chrism. They also give even infants a taste of the Precious Blood, thereby doing away with any notion of "First Communion" in later childhood.

In the West, although we too have an anointing with chrism for the newly baptized, for centuries we have normally reserved a second anointing for the bishop, sometimes many years after baptism. There are many reasons for this, not the least of which is the fact that in early times the bishop was the ordinary person to officiate at baptism, not the presybyter (priest). The bishop did it all, from plunging the catechumens into the font, to pouring chrism over them, to immediately celebrating the Eucharist. When bishops began to cede some of their ministry to the ranks of presbyters, they desired to maintain a strong relationship with baptism. Thus it was decided that the solemn post@baptismal anointing, the laying on of hands, and the prayer for the gifts of the Holy Spirit were to be detached from infant baptism. So, to the present day, we have two anointing after baptism: one by the priest, and the other normally by the bishop. By the fifth century, the word "confirmation" had surfaced to refer to this second anointing.

6/2023 THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

The Sacred Heart and Our Spiritual Life

Devotion to the Sacred Heart is a wonderful historical expression of the Church's piety for Christ, her Spouse and Lord: it calls for a fundamental attitude of conversion and reparation, of love and gratitude, apostolic commitment and dedication to Christ and his saving work.



Devotions to the Sacred Heart of Jesus are numerous. Some have been ex-

plicitly approved and frequently recommended by the Apostolic See. Among these, mention should be made of the following:

Personal Consecration: Personal consecration, described by Pius XI as "undoubtedly the principal devotional practice used in relation to the Sacred Heart" (*Miserentissimus redemptor*).

Family Consecration: Family consecration to the Sacred Heart, in which the family, by virtue of the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony already participating in the mystery of the unity and love of Christ for the Church, is dedicated to Christ so that he might reign in the hearts of all its members (*Aliae concessiones*).

Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus: The Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, approved for the whole Church in 1891, which is evidently biblical in character and to which many indulgences have been attached (*Aliae concessiones*).

Act of Reparation to the Sacred Heart: The act of reparation, a prayer with which the faithful, mindful of the infinite goodness of Christ, implore mercy for the offences committed in so many ways against his Sacred Heart (*Aliae concessiones*).

The Practice of the First Fridays: The pious practice of the first Fridays of the month which derives from the "great promises" made by Jesus to St. Margaret Mary. At a time when sacramental communion was very rare among the faithful, the first Friday devotion contributed significantly to a renewed use of the Sacraments of Penance and of the Holy Eucharist. In our own times, the devotion to the first Fridays, even if practiced correctly, may not always lead to the desired spiritual fruits. Hence, the faithful require constant instruction so that any reduction of the practice to mere credulity is avoided and an active faith encouraged so that the faithful may undertake their commitment to the Gospel correctly in their lives. They should also be reminded of the absolute preeminence of Sunday, the "primordial feast" (Sacrosanctum Concilium), which should be marked by the full participation of the faithful at the celebration of the Holy Mass.

Jesus Gives His Disciples Authority to Heal and Set Free (Matthew 9:36-10:8)

The power of the Gospel to heal and set free

When Jesus proclaimed the good news of God's kingdom he also demonstrated the power of the Gospel with supernatural signs and wonders. Jesus healed people who suffered physical, emotional, and mental illnesses. He freed people from spiritual bondage to sin and demonic powers. Jesus gave his disciples the same authority he had to heal and set people free from spiritual bondage. The Gospel (which literally means "good news") which Jesus proclaimed is just as relevant and real today, the kingdom of heaven is at hand. If we believe in the Lord Jesus, the Word of God made flesh, and in the power of the Gospel, we will know and experience the freedom, joy, and power he gives us that enables us to live and witness as his disciples. No one can buy heaven; but if we know the love and mercy of Jesus Christ, then we already possess heaven in our hearts! Do you believe that Jesus can change and transform your life and share with you the power and authority of God's kingdom?

Jesus chose ordinary people to do extraordinary work

Jesus commissioned his disciples to carry on the works which he did – to speak God's word and to bring his healing power to the weary and oppressed. In the choice of the twelve apostles we see a characteristic feature of God's work – Jesus chose very ordinary people. They were non-professionals, had no wealth or privileged position. They were chosen from the common people who did ordinary things, had no special education, and no social advantages. Jesus wanted ordinary people who could take an assignment and do it extraordinarily well. He chose these men, not for what they were, but for what they would be capable of becoming under his direction and power. When the Lord calls us to serve, we must not think we have nothing or very little to offer. The Lord takes what ordinary people, like us, can offer and uses it for greatness in his kingdom. Do you believe that God wants to work in and through you for his glory?

"Lord Jesus, you have chosen me to be your disciple. Take and use what I can offer, however meager it may seem, for the greater glory of your name."

Đức Giêsu ban cho các môn đệ quyền chữa bệnh và giải thoát (Matthew 9:36-10:8)

Sức mạnh của Tin Mừng để chữa bệnh và giải thoát

Khi Chúa Giêsu công bố tin mừng về vương quốc của Thiên Chúa, Ngài cũng bày tỏ q uyền năng của Phúc âm bằng những dấu lạ điềm thiêng siêu nhiên. Chúa Giêsu chữa lành những người bị bệnh về thể lý, tình cảm và tinh thần. Ngài giải thoát con người khỏi ách nô lệ tinh thần đối với tội lỗi và quyền lực của ma quỷ. Chúa Giêsu ban cho các môn đệ cùng một thẩm quyền mà Ngài có để chữa lành và giải thoát người ta khỏi ách nô lệ tâm linh.

Tin Mừng (có nghĩa đen là "tin vui") mà Chúa Giêsu công bố cũng phù hợp và thực tế ngày nay, vương quốc thiên đàng đang đến gần. Nếu chúng ta tin vào Chúa Giêsu, Ngôi Lời Thiên Chúa nhập thể, và tin vào sức mạnh của Tin Mừng, thì chúng ta sẽ biết và cảm nghiệm được sự tự do, niềm vui và sức mạnh Ngài ban cho chúng ta để chúng ta có thể sống và làm chứng như môn đệ của Ngài. Không ai có thể mua lấy thiên đàng; nhưng nếu chúng ta biết tình yêu và lòng thương xót của Chúa Giêsu Kitô, thì chúng ta đã có thiên đàng trong tâm hồn mình rồi! Bạn có tin rằng Chúa Giêsu có thể thay đổi và biến đổi cuộc đời bạn và chia sẻ với bạn quyền năng và thẩm quyền của vương quốc Thiên Chúa không?

Chúa Giêsu đã chọn những người bình thường để làm việc phi thường

Chúa Giêsu ủy thác cho các môn đệ tiếp tục công việc mà Ngài đã làm – nói lời Thiên Chúa và đem quyền năng chữa lành của Ngài đến cho những người mệt mỏi và bị áp bức. Trong sự lựa chọn mười hai tông đồ, chúng ta thấy một nét đặc trưng trong công việc của Thiên Chúa – Chúa Giêsu đã chọn những người rất bình thường. Họ là những người không chuyên nghiệp, không giàu có hay địa vị đặc quyền. Họ được chọn từ những người bình thường làm những công việc bình thường, không được giáo dục đặc biệt và không có lợi thế xã hội.

Chúa Giêsu muốn những người bình thường có thể nhận nhiệm vụ và hoàn thành nó một cách xuất sắc. Ngài đã chọn những người này, không phải vì họ là ai, mà vì những gì họ có thể trở thành dưới sự chỉ đạo và quyền năng của Ngài. Khi Chúa kêu gọi chúng ta phục vụ, chúng ta không được nghĩ rằng mình không có gì hoặc có rất ít để cống hiến. Chúa lấy những gì mà những người bình thường, giống như chúng ta, có thể cống hiến và sử dụng nó cho sự vĩ đại trong vương quốc của Ngài. Bạn có tin rằng Thiên Chúa muốn hành động trong và qua bạn vì sự vinh hiển của Ngài không?

"Lạy Chúa Giêsu, Chúa đã chọn con làm môn đệ của Chúa. Xin đón nhận và sử dụng những gì con có thể dâng tiến, tuy nhiên nó có vẻ ít ỏi, vì vinh quang lớn hơn cho danh của Chúa."


