TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today we have the summertime celebration of the Transfiguration of the Lord. The story of the Transfiguration is proclaimed twice each year; once on the Second Sunday of Lent, and then again on August 6. In Lent, the revelation of Jesus' glory foreshadows the triumph of Easter. During the summer, this feast comes—significantly—forty days before the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

In the Gospel proclaimed on this day, Peter wants to know if he should build "three tents." In Hebrew, the tents are sukkot, rickety harvest shacks also called in English "tabernacles" (from the Latin word for "little shelters") that harvesters set up in fields so they can stay there to work day and night. Harvest booths are built and ornamented for the Jewish festival of Sukkot. One aspect of this festival is eager anticipation for the ingathering of all peoples (including ancestors Moses and El ijah) under God's own sukkot shalom, the tent of peace. In some patristic traditions, the late summer and early autumn of the church year are imagined as an extended ingathering festival that begins today and reaches fulfillment at Epiphany.

Consecration to the Immaculate Heart



Pope Paul VI, on the floor of the Vatican Council at the close of the third session, renewed publicly the consecration of the Church and the world to Mary's Immaculate Heart. He said that his thoughts turned to the whole world "which our venerated predecessor Pius XII . . . not without inspiration from on high, solemnly consecrated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. . . . O Virgin

Mary, Mother of the Council, to you we recommend the entire Church." When he visited Fatima on May 13, 1967, the same Pope recalled this "consecration which we ourselves have renewed on November 21, 1964 — we exhort all the sons of the Church to renew personally their consecration to the Immaculate Heart of the Mother of the Church and to bring alive this most noble act of veneration through a life ever more in accord with the divine will and in a spirit of filial service and of devout imitation of their heavenly Queen."

Before making a consecration it is most desirable to make a careful preparation extending over some period of time. One good way to make that preparation is described in the last part of St. Louis de Montfort's True Devotion book.

The most essential thing is not making an act of consecration, with or without some solemnity, though that is important. The essential thing is to live that consecration.

Living a consecration could be described as following three attitudes or spirits:

Union — Imitation of Jesus and Mary, so as to become like them, and trying to develop as constant as possible a realization of His and her presence.

Dependence — Give to Jesus and Mary the right to dispose of everything we have, temporal and spiritual.

Obedience — Jesus and Mary have the right to ask us to do anything at all, even without reward. In consecration, we recognize that right, give it on a basis of love, and plan to carry it out with fullest generosity.

St. Maximilian Kolbe liked to speak of the relation of consecration to our baptismal promises, in which we promised to renounce satan and all his works, and to follow Jesus, by whom we are "sealed" in baptism as His property. Consecration is the fullest kind of response to and carrying out of these promises. Mary, in view of her Immaculate Conception, was most fitted to respond most fully, and that she did, with a fullness and perfection beyond our ability to visualize - for we recall that Pius IX told us that even at the start of her existence, her holiness was so great that "none greater under God can be thought of, and no one but God can comprehend it." 18th SUNDAY

The Transfiguration Of The Lord July 30, 2023; MATTHEW 17,1-9

Meditation: "Listen to my beloved Son".

1/ The Lord Jesus came to fulfill all that Moses and the prophets spoke

Jesus on three occasions told his disciples that he would undergo suffering and death on a cross to fulfill the mission the Father gave him. As the time draws near for Jesus' ultimate sacrifice on the cross, he takes three of his beloved disciples to the top of a high mountain. Just as Moses and Elijah were led to the mountain of God to discern their ultimate call and mission, so Jesus now appears with Moses and Elijah on the highest mountain overlooking the summit of the promised land. Matthew's Gospel tells us that Jesus was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his garments became white as light (Matthew 17:2).

2/ Jesus reveals his glory to the apostles and to us

Why did Jesus appear in dazzling light with Moses and Elijah? The book of Exodus tells us that when Moses had met with God on Mount Sinai the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God (Exodus 34:29). Paul the Apostle wrote that the Israelites could not look at Moses' face because of its brightness (2 Corinthians 3:7). After Elijah, the greatest of the prophets, had destroyed all the priests and idols of Baal in the land, he took refuge on the mountain of God at Sinai. There God showed Elijah his glory in great thunder, whirlwind, and fire, and then spoke with him in a still guiet voice. God guestioned Elijah, "What are you doing here?" And then directed him to go and fulfill the mission given him by God. Jesus, likewise, appears in glory with Moses and Elijah, as if to confirm with them that he, too, is ready to fulfill the mission which the Father has sent him to accomplish.

Jesus went to the mountain knowing full well what awaited him in Jerusalem – betrayal, rejection, and crucifixion. Jesus very likely discussed this momentous decision to go to the cross with Moses and Elijah. God the Father also spoke with Jesus and gave his approval: This is my beloved Son; listen to him. The Father glorified his son because he was faithful and willing to obey him in everything. The cloud which overshadowed Jesus and his apostles fulfilled the dream of the Jews that when the Messiah came the cloud of God's presence would fill the temple again (see Exodus 16:10, 19:9, 33:9; 1 Kings 8:10; 2 Maccabees 2:8).

Meditation: "Các con hãy nghe Lời Người".

1/ Đức Giêsu đến để hoàn thành tất cả những gì Moisen và các ngôn sứ nói tới

Đức Giêsu đã nói với các môn đệ ba lần rằng Người sẽ chịu đau khổ và chịu chết trên thập giá để hoàn thành sứ mạng Cha đã giao phó cho Người. Khi gần đến thời gian hy tế cuối cùng của Đức Giêsu trên thập giá, Người đem ba môn đệ yêu dấu đi lên đỉnh núi cao. Giống như Moisen và Elia được dẫn lên núi Thiên Chúa để nhận thức rõ ơn gọi và sứ mạng chủ yếu của mình, rồi Đức Giêsu xuất hiện với Moisen và Elia trên đỉnh núi cao nhất quan sát vùng đất hứa. Tin mừng của thánh sử Matthew nói với chúng ta rằng Đức Giêsu đã biến hình trước mắt họ và mặt Người chiếu sáng như mặt trời và áo của Người trở nên trắng tinh như ánh sáng (Mt 17,2).

2/ Đức Giêsu bày tỏ vinh quang của Người cho các tông đồ và cho chúng ta

Tại sao Đức Giêsu xuất hiện trong ánh sáng chói ngời với Môisen và Êlia? Sách Xuất hành nói với chúng ta rằng khi Môisen giáp mặt với Thiên Chúa trên núi Sinai da mặt ông chiếu sáng bởi vì ông đang nói chuyện với Thiên Chúa (Xh 34,29). Thánh Phaolô tông đồ viết rằng dân Israel không thể nhìn vào mặt ông Môisen vì nó chiếu sáng (2Cor 3,7). Sau khi Êlia, vị ngôn sứ vĩ đại, đã tiêu diệt các đạo sĩ và ngẫu tượng của Baan, ông ẩn vào núi Thiên Chúa ở Sinai. Tại đó Thiên Chúa đã cho Êlia thấy vinh quang của Người nơi sấm sét, gió rít, và lửa, và rồi nói chuyện với ông trong giọng nói nhẹ nhàng: Qua nhiều lời trao đổi, Thiên Chúa hỏi Êlia "Ngươi làm gì ở đây?" Và rồi hướng dẫn ông ra đi và thực hiện sứ mạng mà Người sai ông đi để hoàn thành vì danh Thiên Chúa. Cũng thế, Đức Giêsu xuất hiện trong vinh quang với Môisen và Êlia, như thể để xác nhận với các ngài rằng Người cũng sẵn sàng thực hiện sứ mạng mà Cha đã sai Người đến để hoàn thành.

Đức Giêsu đi lên núi, Người biết rõ những gì đang đợi Người ở Giêrusalem: sự phản bội, chống đối, và đóng đinh. Đức Giêsu dường như đã thảo luận sự quyết định quan trọng đi tới thập giá này với ông Môisen và Êlia. Chúa Cha cũng ngỏ lời với Đức Giêsu để tỏ sự đồng thuận của mình: Đây là Con yêu dấu của Ta, các ngươi hãy vâng nghe lời Người. Đám mây che phủ Đức Giêsu và các môn đệ đã ứng nghiệm giấc mơ của người Do thái là khi Đấng Mêsia đến, đám mây của sự hiện diện Thiên Chúa sẽ che phủ đền thờ một lần nữa (Xh 16,10- 19, 9- 33, 9- 1V 8,10- 2Mac 2,8).


