TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

There is a show on public television in which people search their attics for heirlooms, dust them off, and trek them downtown for ruthless evaluation by teams of antique experts. Occasionally the owners are surprised to learn they have been harboring priceless artifacts: a Tiffany bowl used to catch the car keys, a Van Gogh in the downstairs bathroom. What they lugged downtown in a paper bag, they carry home in bubble wrap and receiving blankets.

It's the same way with treasures in Church life. Lots of things were lugged up into the attic years ago, and it was inevitable that some treasures ended up in the trash. Many Catholics tucked the sacrament of penance away in a dusty corner. We know it's there if we need it, but it is not the weekly routine it once was, like the Saturday bath "whether I need it or not." Today, especially in Lent and Advent or as part of personal preparation for marriage, ordination, or other life transitions, the sacrament of penance is a treasure of the Christian life waiting to be discovered. DAILY MEDITATION: MATTHEW 22:34-40

You shall love the Lord...

You shall love your neighbor. (Matthew 22:37, 39)

Why are these two commandments the greatest? Because they encapsulate everything that God had spoken to Moses and the Israelites. As Jesus told the Pharisees, "The whole law and the prophets depend" on them (Matthew 22:40).

As important as these two commandments are, however, we might be tempted to think they're impossible to follow. That's because too often, we associate love only with warm and fuzzy feelings. But love goes beyond emotion and is sometimes even independent of it. In other words, it's not so much what we feel as how we act.

Today's first reading shows us that to love our neighbor, especially the most vulnerable among us, we must act justly toward them (Exodus 22:20-26). These laws, given to Moses by God himself, may have been what Jesus had in mind when he was talking to the Pharisees that day. Jesus knew that in order to love someone, we don't have to necessarily feel an emotional connection. We don't even have to know them personally. But we do need to care for them and make sure they are being treated justly.

The same is true in our relationship with the Lord. We might be going through a dry spell in our prayer time. Maybe we don't even have the desire to pray. But when we make time to be with Jesus, whatever our feelings at that moment, we are loving him.

Each day, whether you wake up feeling energetic and cheerful or tired and cross, you will be presented with opportunities to love God and your neighbor in concrete ways. Don't pass them up! By itself, each specific action you take might not seem particularly noteworthy. Maybe you don't feel any love as you do them. But in fact, when you extend yourself for another time and again, you are doing exactly what God has called you to do.

"Jesus, help me to see how I can love you and my neighbor today."

CHÚA NHẬT 30 THƯỜNG NIÊN NĂM

SUY NIỆM HẰNG NGÀY: Mt 22,34-40

"Người phải yêu mến Đức Chúa... Người phải yêu mến người thân cận" (Mt 22,37.39)

Tại sao hai điều răn này quan trọng nhất? Bởi vì hai điều răn này tóm lược tất cả những gì Thiên Chúa đã nói với ông Môsê và dân Ítraen. Như Chúa Giêsu đã nói với những người Phariseu: "Tất cả Luật Môsê và các sách ngôn sứ đều tùy thuộc" vào hai điều răn ấy (Mt 22,40).

Hai điều răn này rất quan trọng, tuy nhiên, chúng ta có thể bị cám dỗ để nghĩ rằng chúng không thể tuân theo được. Đó là vì chúng ta rất thường xuyên liên tưởng tình yêu với những cảm giác ấm áp và mơ hồ. Nhưng tình yêu vượt xa cảm xúc và đôi khi thậm chí độc lập với cảm xúc. Nói cách khác điều chúng ta cảm thấy không quan trọng bằng cách chúng ta hành động.

Bài đọc thứ nhất hôm nay cho chúng ta thấy rằng để yêu tha nhân, đặc biệt những người dễ bị tổn thương nhất trong chúng ta, chúng ta phải cư xử công bằng với họ (x. Xh 22,20-26). Những điều luật này, được chính Thiên Chúa ban cho Môsê, có thể là những gì Chúa Giêsu có trong tâm trí khi Người nói với những người Phariseu hôm đó. Chúa Giêsu biết rằng để yêu thương ai đó, chúng ta không nhất thiết phải cảm thấy có một mối liên hệ tình cảm. Thậm chí chúng ta không cần phải biết cá nhân họ. Nhưng chúng ta cần quan tâm họ và đảm bảo họ được đối xử cách công bằng.

Điều này cũng đúng trong mối tương quan của chúng ta với Chúa. Chúng ta có thể đang trải qua giai đoạn khô khan trong giờ cầu nguyện của mình. Có lẽ, chúng ta thậm chí không có khao khát cầu nguyện. Nhưng khi chúng ta dành thời gian ở với Chúa Giêsu, lúc đó bất kể chúng ta cảm thấy như thế nào, chúng ta vẫn đang yêu mến Người.

Mỗi ngày, cho dù bạn thức dậy với cảm giác tràn đầy năng lượng và vui vẻ hay mệt mỏi và khó chịu, bạn sẽ đều có những cơ hội để yêu mến Chúa và tha nhân cách cụ thể. Đừng bỏ qua những cơ hội ấy! Bản thân mỗi hành động cụ thể mà bạn làm dường như chẳng có gì đặc biệt đáng chú ý. Có thể bạn chẳng cảm thấy có chút tình yêu nào khi bạn làm những điều đó. Nhưng thực tế, khi bạn mở rộng lòng mình ra hết lần này đến lần khác, bạn đang làm chính xác những gì Thiên Chúa đã mời gọi bạn làm.

"Lạy Chúa Giêsu, xin hãy giúp con biết hôm nay con có thể yêu mến Chúa và yêu thương tha nhân như thế nào!"

All Saints Day November 01st

During the year the Church celebrates one by one the feasts of the saints. Today she joins them all in one festival. In addition to those whose names she knows, she recalls in a magnificent vision all the others "of all nations and tribes standing before the throne and in sight of the Lamb, clothed with white robes, and palms in their hands, proclaiming Him who redeemed them in His Blood."

The feast of All Saints should inspire us with tremendous hope. Among the saints in heaven are some whom we have known. All lived on earth lives like our own. They were baptized, marked with the sign of faith, they were faithful to Christ's teaching and they have gone before us to the heavenly home whence they call on us to follow them. The Gospel of the Beatitudes, read today, while it shows their happiness, shows, too, the road that they followed; there is no other that will lead us whither they have gone.

"The Commemoration of All Saints" was first celebrated in the East. The feast is found in the West on different dates in the eighth century. The Roman Martyrology mentions that this date is a claim of fame for Gregory IV (827-844) and that he extended this observance to the whole of Christendom; it seems certain, however, that Gregory III (731-741) preceded him in this. At Rome, on the other hand, on May 13, there was the annual commemoration of the consecration of the basilica of St. Maria ad Martyres (or St. Mary and All Martyrs). This was the former Pantheon, the temple of Agrippa, dedicated to all the gods of paganism, to which Boniface IV had translated many relics from the catacombs. Gregory VII transferred the anniversary of this dedication to November 1.

A Guide to Plenary Indulgences for the All Souls' "Octave", November 1-8

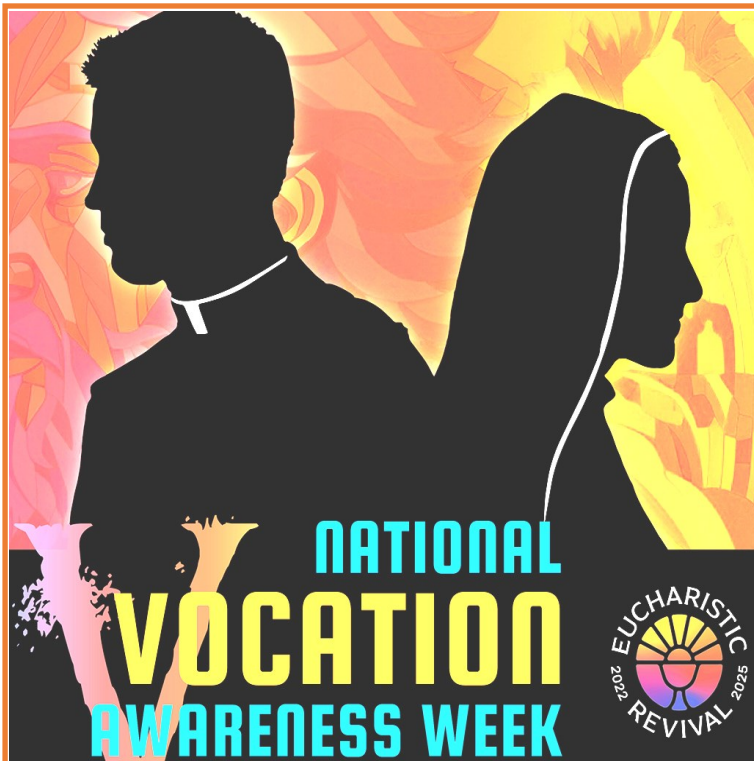
- ♦ **Visiting a Cemetery:** An indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. The indulgence is plenary each day from November 1-8; on other days of the year it is a partial indulgence.
- ♦ **Visiting a Church on November 2:** A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the faithful who, on All Souls' Day (or, according to the judgment of the ordinary, on the Sunday preceding or following it, or on the solemnity of All Saints), devoutly visit a church or an oratory and recite an Our Father and the Creed.
- ♦ **Praying for the Faithful Departed:**
 - * A partial indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the faithful who,
 - * devoutly visit a cemetery and at least mentally pray for the dead;
 - * devoutly recite lauds or vespers from the Office of the Dead or the prayer Eternal rest.(Manual of Indulgences, fourth edition, 1999)

♦ **Indulgence Requirements:**

- * To gain a plenary indulgence, in addition to excluding all attachment to sin, even venial sin, it is necessary to perform the indulgent work and fulfill the following three conditions: sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intention of the Sovereign Pontiff.
- * A single sacramental confession suffices for gaining several plenary indulgences, but Holy Communion must be received and prayer for the intention of the Holy Father must be recited for the gaining of each plenary indulgence.
- * The three conditions may be fulfilled several days before or after the performance of the prescribed work; it is, however, fitting that Communion be received and the prayer for the intention of the Holy Father be said on the same day the work is performed.
- * The condition of praying for the intention of the Holy Father is fully satisfied by reciting one Our Father and one Hail Mary. A plenary indulgence can be acquired only once in the course of the day, a partial indulgence can be acquired multiple times.
- * If a visit to a Church or an oratory is required to obtain an indulgence attached to a particular day, this may be accomplished from noon of the preceding day until midnight of the particular day. (Manual of Indulgences, fourth edition, 1999 (Enchiridion Indulgentiarum))

All Souls Day November 02nd

The Church, after rejoicing yesterday with those of her children who have entered the glory of heaven, today prays for all those who, in the purifying suffering of Purgatory await the day when they will be joined to the company of saints. At no place in the liturgy is stated in more striking fashion the mysterious union between the Church triumphant, the Church militant and the Church suffering; at no time is there accomplished in clearer fashion the twofold duty of charity and justice deriving for every Christian from the fact of his incorporation in the mystical Body of Christ. By virtue of the consoling doctrine of the communion of saints the merits and prayers of each one are able to help all; and the Church is able to join her prayer with that of the saints in heaven and supply what is wanting to the souls in Purgatory by means of the Mass, indulgences and the alms and sacrifices of her children.

The celebration of Mass, the sacrifice of Calvary continued on our altars, has ever been for the Church the principal means of fulfilling towards the dead the great commandment of charity. Masses for the dead are found in the fifth century. But it was St. Odilo, fourth abbot of Cluny, who was responsible for the institution of the general commemoration of all the faithful departed; he instituted it and fixed its celebration on November 2, the day after All Saints. The practice spread to the rest of Christendom.

Daily in a special Memento in the Canon of the Mass, at which the priest remembers all those who have fallen asleep in the Lord, the priest implores God to grant them a place of happiness, light and peace. Thus there is no Mass in which the Church does not pray for the faithful departed; but today her thoughts are directed towards them in a particular fashion, with the maternal preoccupation of leaving no soul in Purgatory without spiritual aid and of grouping them all together in her intercession. By a privilege that Benedict XV's decree has extended to the whole world every priest can today celebrate three Masses; for the liberation of the souls in Purgatory the Church multiplies the offering of the sacrifice of Christ, from which she draws forever on behalf of all her children, infinite fruits of redemption.

Highlights and Things to Do

- ♦ attend Masses often and pray for the faithful departed
- ♦ remember your family and friends who are deceased
- ♦ make an extra sacrifice for them; pray the rosary for the most forgotten soul in Purgatory.
- ♦ **Especially, visiting a cemetery and praying for the faithful from November 1 through November 8 will gain a plenary indulgence that can be applied only to the souls in Purgatory. (more details in page 6 of the bulletins)**

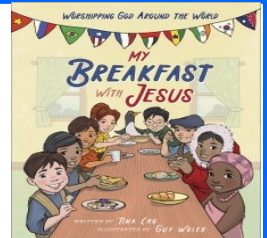

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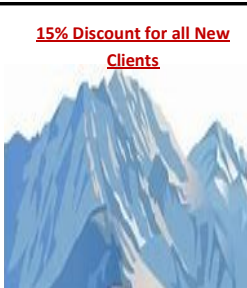
