

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

From outer space, the United States must seem peculiarly aglow these nights: we have strung lights on every tree within reach. Sometimes, even tietacks and earrings twinkle with "microlights." Clearly, something is afoot: there is a deep-down yearning for the world to change. Yet, John the Baptist would probably be unplugging most of these lights if he had the chance. In today's Gospel he turns people away from his baptism of repentance. "Give some evidence that you mean to reform!" he cries.

What meaning do our holiday lights convey for you? In the deep and dark countryside, a single candle glowing in a window can be seen for miles. It signals welcome and readiness; it is a beacon guiding strangers to the door, a token of a warm hearth, a loving embrace, a sign that those who have placed the candle are awake and waiting. This year, set the timers aside, and each night as you light the candles in your windows, pray: "May Christ find an eager welcome here. May this household be filled with the light of his word." One candle at a time, our faith community can reclaim the meaning of the lights of Advent hope.

Meditation: (Mk 1,1-8)

"The baptism of repentance and purification in the Holy Spirit"

Called to hear and obey the Word of God

John broke the prophetic silence of the previous centuries when he began to speak the word of God to the people of Israel. His message was similar to the message of the Old Testament prophets who chided the people of God for their unfaithfulness and who tried to awaken true repentance in them. Among a people unconcerned with the things of God, it was his work to awaken their interest, unsettle them from their complacency, and arouse in them enough good will to recognize and receive Christ when he came. Are you eager to hear God's word and to be changed by it through the power of the Holy Spirit?

Jesus tells us that John the Baptist was more than a prophet (Luke 7:26). John was the voice of the Consoler who is coming (John 1:23; Isaiah 40:1-3). He completed the cycle of prophets begun by Elijah (Matthew 11:13-14). What the prophets had carefully searched for and angels longed to see, now came to completion as John made the way ready for the coming of the Messiah, God's Anointed Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. With John the Baptist, the Holy Spirit begins the restoration to the human race of the "divine likeness", prefiguring what would be achieved with and in the Lord Jesus.

Let the Holy Spirit purify and transform your mind and heart

John's baptism was for repentance — turning away from sin and taking on a new way of life according to God's word. Our baptism in Jesus Christ by water and the Spirit results in a new birth and entry into God's kingdom as his beloved sons and daughters (John 3:5). The Lord Jesus comes to baptize each one of us in his Holy Spirit so that we may walk in his truth and holiness and radiate the joy of the Gospel to all we meet. God's word has power to change and transform our lives so that we may be lights that point others to Jesus Christ. Like John the Baptist, we too are called to give testimony to the light and truth of Christ. Do you point others to Jesus Christ in the way you live, speak, and treat others?

"Lord, let your light burn brightly in my heart that I may know the joy and freedom of your kingdom. Fill me with your Holy Spirit and empower me to witness the truth of your Gospel and to point others to Jesus Christ."

CHÚA NHẬT II MÙA VỌNG - NĂM B

Suy Niệm: (Mc 1,1-8)

"Phép rửa thống hối và thanh tẩy trong Chúa Thánh Thần".

Được gọi để lắng nghe và vâng giữ lời Chúa

Gioan đã phá vỡ sự im lặng có tính tiên tri của hàng thế kỷ trước, khi ông bắt đầu nói lời Chúa cho dân Israel. Sứ điệp của ông cũng tương tự sứ điệp của các ngôn sứ trong Cựu ước, những người đã lên tiếng khiển trách dân Thiên Chúa về sự bất trung của họ, và cố gắng khơi dậy lòng thống hối chân thật trong họ. Giữa những người không hề quan tâm tới những gì của Thiên Chúa, công việc của ông là đánh thức sự chú ý của họ, quấy rối tính tự mãn của họ, và khơi dậy trong họ thiện chí để nhận ra và tiếp nhận Đức Kitô khi Người đến. Bạn có chỉ cho người khác biết Đức Kitô trong cách bạn sống, việc làm, và lời nói không?

Tại sao Chúa Giêsu nói rằng Gioan tẩy giả còn hơn hẳn một ngôn sứ (Lc 7,26). Gioan là tiếng nói của Đấng an ủi sẽ đến (Ga 1,23; Is 40,1-3). Ông đã hoàn tất quá trình của các ngôn sứ, bắt đầu từ Êlia (Mt 11,13-14). Những gì các tiên tri đã hết sức tìm kiếm, và các thiên thần khao khát nhìn thấy, giờ đây đã đi đến chỗ hoàn thành khi Gioan dọn đường cho Đấng Mêsia sắp đến, người Con được xức dầu của Thiên Chúa, Đức Giêsu Kitô. Với Gioan tẩy giả, Chúa Thánh Thần bắt đầu phục hồi cho con người hình ảnh "giống Thiên Chúa", tiên báo trước những gì phải được thành tựu với và trong Chúa Giêsu.

Hãy để Chúa Thánh Thần thanh tẩy và biến đổi lòng trí ban

Phép thanh tẩy của Gioan dành cho sự thống hối – từ bỏ tội lỗi và bước đi trên con đường sự sống mới, dựa theo lời Thiên Chúa. Phép rửa của chúng ta bằng nước và Thần Khí trong Đức Giêsu Kitô đem lại sự sống mới và bước vào vương quốc Thiên Chúa như những người con của Người (Ga 3,5). Chúa Giêsu đến để thánh tẩy mỗi người chúng ta trong Thánh Thần của Người để chúng ta có thể bước đi trong sự thật và sự thánh thiện của Người và chiếu tỏa niềm vui Tin mừng cho những ai chúng ta gặp gỡ. Lời Chúa có quyền năng thay đổi và thánh hóa cuộc đời chúng ta, để chúng ta có thể trở thành ánh sáng chỉ cho người khác biết Đức Giêsu Kitô. Giống như Gioan tẩy giả, chúng ta cũng được kêu gọi làm chứng tá cho ánh sáng và chân lý của Đức Kitô. Bạn có chỉ cho người khác biết Đức Giêsu Kitô trong cách bạn sống, lời nói, và việc làm không?

Lạy Chúa, xin cho ánh sáng của Chúa cháy bừng lên trong lòng con, để con có thể nhận biết niềm vui và tự do của vương quốc Chúa. Xin đổ tràn đầy Thánh Thần Chúa trên con và ban sức mạnh để con làm chứng cho chân lý của Tin mừng và chỉ cho người khác biết Đức Giêsu Kitô.

December 12th Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe

In the winter of 1531, a poor, 57-year-old Aztec Indian living five miles outside of Mexico City encountered a miraculous happening on his way to morning Mass. First he heard strange music coming from Tepeyac Hill, and then he heard a woman's voice



calling his name. Juan Diego climbed the hill and encountered a young woman, appearing to be of his own people in physical appearance and dress. The woman identified herself as the Virgin Mary, and told Juan Diego to ask the bishop of Mexico City to build a church on the hill to assist in the conversion of the nation and be a source of consolation to the people.

Juan Diego obeyed the request, but the bishop was skeptical regarding the message, even though he perceived that Juan was a humble, and well meaning Catholic. Juan reported the bishop's doubt to Our Lady at Tepeyac Hill, and she asked him to return to the bishop once again, bearing the same message. The bishop once again heard the story, and told Juan Diego to ask Our Lady for a sign that it was indeed herself that wished for the church to be built.

When he returned to the hill, Mary gave Juan Diego such a sign. Miraculously, roses appeared on the hill in the middle of winter, and Juan gathered them in his tilma, or cloak. Our Lady arranged the roses in his tilma with her own hands, and Juan returned to the bishop's presence. When Juan released the tilma, allowing the flowers to fall to the floor, it was revealed that a miraculous image of Our Lady had imprinted itself on his tilma (see above).

The bishop immediately fell to his knees, and came to believe in Juan Diego's message. A church was built on the spot of the apparition, as Mary had requested, and 8 million people converted to Catholicism in a short period of time upon hearing of or viewing the miraculous image of Our Lady.

The tilma of Juan Diego has been the subject of much modern research. The tilma, woven out of coarse cactus fiber, should have disintegrated after 20 years, but although over 500 years have passed the tilma is still in perfect condition. The pupils of Mary in the picture reflect the Indians and clergy present at the time of the first revelation of the image. No paint was used, and chemical analysis has not been able to identify the color imprint. Additionally, studies have revealed that the stars on Mary's mantle match exactly what a Mexican would have seen in the sky in December of 1531.
