

Twenty - ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Although the hours of daylight are rapidly dwindling, many people would say that these October days bring the year's most splendid weather. Americans are riders and joggers, not strollers, and so the pleasures of the season are often lost on us. This is not the case with many Jewish people, who observe an ancient rule in walking to synagogue on the Sabbath. On city streets and suburban sidewalks in many cities, we may notice around sunset the nicely dressed families walking and chatting on Friday afternoon. After a short prayer at dusk, the families stroll home again for a relaxing and festive meal. They return to synagogue in the morning and then spend an afternoon in family leisure until three stars appear in the night sky and Sabbath ends.

Catholics, on the other hand, pile into the car and drive even a short distance to Mass; some even divide the family to participate at different hours. For Jews, the leisurely walk marks a dividing line between hectic life commitments and a day of abundant joy and enrichment. Before we became an automobile culture, Catholics embraced a similar pace, and in most places walked to church. These lovely days of fall invite us to tap into an old and lifegiving tradition. If you live within a mile of your church, walk next week. If you must drive, park at a good distance and walk the rest of the way. Talk about your life, greet strangers, notice the crunch of leaves under your shoes. You may be surprised at how different Sunday Mass feels when it is framed by leisure!

Sunday, October 19, 2025 "Always to pray and not lose heart". (Luke 18, 1)

<u>Meditation:</u> Jesus' words in today's Gospel can sound impossible: Pray always? Without growing weary? How can we do that? It's so easy to grow weary in prayer, especially in those situations when God seems slow to answer. How do we not give up? What can we do when prayer feels hard? Let's see what our readings tell us.

Be open to receiving help from your brothers and sisters. In the first reading, Moses lifts up his staff in prayer on a mountaintop while Joshua and his army battle Israel's enemy, the Amalekites, in the valley below. But Moses begins to grow weary, so Aaron and Hur support his arms so that he can keep praying (Exodus 17:12). Because of his friends, Moses was able to persist, and that gave Israel the advantage over their enemy. It's not always easy to ask for help when we're struggling. But asking someone to pray for us—or with us—opens the door to God's grace! A friend can intercede for us and offer support when we're weary. Through their presence, they can show us that God is with us.

Turn to the Scriptures. In the second reading, Paul offers words of encouragement to his young disciple, Timothy. Paul senses that his martyrdom is near (2 Timothy 4:6), so he urges his friend to rely on something that is undying: the word of God. "All Scripture," he says, "is inspired by God" (3:16). Scripture has divine power and can bring us hope when we are weary. It can bolster our faith and fill our minds with God's truth. When we want to give up, we can remember, "My help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth" (Psalm 121:2).

Rely on God. Whenever we struggle in prayer, we can ask God for his strength. Jesus himself intercedes for us, and the Spirit helps us in our weakness (Romans 8:26). Like the widow in today's Gospel, we can keep bothering the Lord until he comes through. He's our loving Father. He will always help us. We are never alone!

Chúa Nhật, ngày 19. tháng 10 năm 2025 "Hãy cầu nguyện luôn đừng nản chí". (Lc 18, 1)

Suy niệm: Lời Chúa Giêsu trong Tin Mừng hôm nay nghe có vẻ khó tin: Cầu nguyện luôn sao? Mà không mệt mỏi? Làm sao chúng ta có thể làm được điều đó? Thật dễ dàng để mệt mỏi khi cầu nguyện, đặc biệt là trong những tình huống mà Chúa dường như chậm trả lời. Làm sao chúng ta không bỏ cuộc? Chúng ta có thể làm gì khi cầu nguyện trở nên khó khăn? Hãy cùng xem các bài đọc cho chúng ta biết điều gì.

Hãy mở lòng đón nhận sự giúp đỡ từ anh chị em mình. Trong bài đọc một, Môisen giơ gậy cầu nguyện trên đỉnh núi trong khi Giôsuê và quân đội của ông chiến đấu với kẻ thù của Israel, quân Amalek, ở thung lũng bên dưới. Nhưng Môisen bắt đầu mệt mỏi, nên Aharon và Hur đã đỡ tay ông để ông có thể tiếp tục cầu nguyện (Xh 17,12). Nhờ có bạn bè, Môisen đã có thể kiên trì, và điều đó đã mang lại cho Israel lợi thế trước kẻ thù của họ. Không phải lúc nào cũng dễ dàng để cầu xin sự giúp đỡ khi chúng ta gặp khó khăn. Nhưng việc cầu xin ai đó cầu nguyện cho chúng ta — hoặc cùng cầu nguyện với chúng ta — sẽ mở ra cánh cửa đến với ân sủng của Chúa! Một người bạn có thể cầu thay cho chúng ta và hỗ trợ khi chúng ta mệt mỏi. Qua sự hiện diện của họ, họ có thể cho chúng ta thấy rằng Chúa ở cùng chúng ta.

Hãy hướng về Kinh Thánh. Trong bài đọc thứ hai, Thánh Phaolô đã dành những lời khích lệ cho người môn đệ trẻ tuổi của mình, Timôthê. Thánh Phaolô cảm thấy cuộc tử đạo của mình đã gần kề (2Tm 4,6), vì vậy ngài thúc giục người bạn của mình hãy nương tựa vào một điều bất diệt: Lời Chúa. Ngài nói: "Tất cả những gì viết trong Kinh Thánh đều do Thiên Chúa linh hứng" (3,16). Kinh Thánh có quyền năng thiêng liêng và có thể mang lại hy vọng cho chúng ta khi chúng ta mệt mỏi. Kinh Thánh có thể củng cố đức tin của chúng ta và lấp đầy tâm trí chúng ta bằng chân lý của Chúa. Khi chúng ta muốn bỏ cuộc, chúng ta có thể nhớ rằng: "Ơn phù trợ tôi đến từ Đức Chúa, Đấng tạo thành trời đất" (Tv 121,2).

Hãy nương tựa vào Chúa. Bất cứ khi nào chúng ta gặp khó khăn trong lời cầu nguyện, chúng ta có thể cầu xin Chúa ban sức mạnh. Chính Chúa Giêsu cầu bầu cho chúng ta, và Chúa Thánh Thần giúp đỡ chúng ta trong sự yếu đuối của chúng ta (Rm 8,26). Giống như bà góa trong Tin mừng hôm nay, chúng ta có thể tiếp tục nài nỉ Chúa cho đến khi Người đến. Người là Cha yêu thương của chúng ta. Người sẽ luôn giúp đỡ chúng ta. Chúng ta không bao giờ đơn độc!

Friends, therefore witnesses

Christian witness arises from friendship with the Lord, who was crucified and rose for the salvation of all. This witness is not to be confused with ideological propaganda, for it is an authentic principle of interior transformation and social awareness. Jesus chose to call his disciples "friends." He made known to them the Kingdom of God, asked them to remain with him, to become his community, and sent them to proclaim the Gospel (cf. Jn 15:15, 27). So when Jesus tells us, "Be witnesses," he is assuring us that he considers us as his friends. He alone fully knows who we are and why we are here; young people, he knows your heart, your indignation in the face of discrimination and injustice, your desire for truth and beauty, for joy and peace. Through his friendship, he listens to you, motivates you, and guides you, calling each of you to a new life.

The gaze of Jesus, who always wants nothing but our good, precedes us (cf. Mk 10:21). He does not want us to be servants, nor "activists" of a political party; he calls us to be with him as friends, so that our lives may be renewed. And witness arises spontaneously from the joyful newness of this friendship. It is a unique friendship that grants us communion with God, a faithful friendship that helps us discover our dignity and that of others, an eternal friendship that not even death can destroy, because the risen and crucified Lord is its source.

Bạn hữu, vì thế là chứng nhân

Chứng tá Kitô giáo nảy sinh từ tình bạn với Chúa, Đấng chịu đóng đinh và sống lại để cứu độ mọi người. Chứng tá ấy không phải là hình thức tuyên truyền ý thức hệ, nhưng là một nguyên lý đích thực của việc biến đổi nội tâm và nhận thức xã hội. Chúa Giêsu đã muốn gọi các môn đệ là "bạn hữu". Người đã tỏ cho họ biết mầu nhiệm Nước Thiên Chúa và mời gọi ở lại với Người, để hình thành cộng đoàn của Người và để sai họ đi loan báo Tin Mừng (x. Ga 15, 15.27). Vì thế, khi Chúa Giêsu nói: "Anh em hãy làm chứng tá", Người khẳng định với chúng ta rằng Người coi chúng ta là bạn hữu của Người. Chỉ mình Người mới biết rõ chúng ta là ai và vì sao chúng ta hiện hữu: Người hiểu thấu lòng của các bạn trẻ, niềm thao thức của các con trước bất công và phân biệt, khát vọng chân lý, cái đẹp, niềm vui và hòa bình của các con. Bằng tình bạn của Người, Chúa Giêsu lắng nghe, khích lệ và hướng dẫn các con, mời gọi mỗi người đến với cuộc sống mới.

Cái nhìn của Chúa Giêsu – Đấng luôn luôn và chỉ mong điều thiện hảo cho chúng ta – luôn đi bước trước (x. Mc 10,21). Người không muốn chúng ta trở thành nô lệ hay những "nhà hoạt động" cho một phe nhóm, nhưng gọi chúng ta ở lại với Người như bạn hữu, để cuộc đời chúng ta được đổi mới. Và chính từ niềm vui của tình bạn này mà chứng tá phát sinh một cách tự nhiên. Đó là một tình bạn độc nhất vô nhị, đem lại cho chúng ta sự hiệp thông với Thiên Chúa; một tình bạn trung tín, giúp chúng ta khám phá phẩm giá của chính mình và của tha nhân; một tình bạn vĩnh cửu, mà ngay cả cái chết cũng không thể phá hủy, vì nguồn gốc của nó là Chúa chịu đóng đinh và phục sinh.

From the Pastor's Desk

"Is anyone among you suffering?
He should pray. Is anyone in good spirits?
He should sing praise." -James 5:13

We have different ways that we can pray together for someone who is sick or has a special intention:

- 1. Mass Petitions: Different from a Mass Intention. During the petitions at Mass, also called the Prayer of the Faithful or Universal Prayer, there is a special petition where we pray for all who are sick and suffering, or for national disasters, or for a tragedy that happens unexpectedly. The names of those whom we are praying for are mentioned. Those who have recently passed away (within a couple of weeks) can also be added to the prayer for the deceased. However, if it is a death anniversary, a Mass intention should be offered instead.
- 2. <u>Mass Intention</u>: A Mass intention can be offered for someone, living or deceased, or as a thanksgiving or special intention. Mass intentions can be requested in any of our regular Masses that we offer.

Mass intentions should be requested weeks ahead. Therefore, the weekend Mass intention can be offered once a month by the same petitioner. This will allow others to offer their intentions unless no one else requests by Wednesday each week. They can be placed for the weekday Mass, too.

Canon Law requires one Mass every Sunday and one Mass on each Holy Day must be reserved for the intention of the "People of the Parish." The Mass is known as "Pro Populo." So, parishioners can schedule a Mass intention during the year and each person can request a maximum of 5 specific intentions per year. Only one intention can be taken for each Mass. A single intention may be for multiple individuals, e.g., for the deceased members of the Smith family.

The **recommended** donation for a Mass intention is \$20. (if you want to send a Mass card); \$10 (no card)

To that end, of the original \$400,000 funding shortfall that required our church to borrow necessary monies, has been reduced to approximately \$150,000. In other words, nearly 2/3 of the debt has been eliminated!

We want to thank each of you for helping to make this happen! Many sponsors and donors have been exceptionally generous. For anyone who has not yet participated as a donor or sponsor, there are still opportunities for either. Whether it's an engraved paver, a sponsored item, (such as an iron garden arch, a prayer seat, a garden bench) or a donation, we ask all to be a part of HML.

Please note that the two garden wings are now priced as pieces, or components, in lieu of being priced only as a "whole" at \$50,000. The church is also accepting payment plans (up to 3 years) for all components. See new pricing inside this bulletin.


