

The month of November (<u>Overview</u> - <u>Calendar</u>) is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Church commemorates all her faithful children who have departed from this life, but have not yet attained the joys of heaven. St. Paul warns us that we must not be ignorant concerning the dead, nor sorrowful, "even as others who have no hope ... For the Lord Himself shall come down from heaven ... and the dead who are in Christ shall rise.

The Church has always taught us to pray for those who have gone into eternity. Even in the Old Testament prayers and alms were offered for the souls of the dead by those who thought "well and religiously concerning the resurrection." It was believed that "they who had fallen asleep with godliness had great grace laid up for them" and that "it is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins." Sunday, Nov 09, 2025 "The Lord of hosts is with us". (Psalm 46:8)

Meditation: The Basilica of St. John Lateran is named for the Lateran hill on which it stands. This cathedral church of Rome is dedicated to both John the Baptist and John the Evangelist and stands as a symbol of the persistence of the entire Church. Dedicated in AD 324, soon after Emperor Constantine allowed Christians to meet without persecution, the Lateran Basilica also reminds us of God's enduring faithfulness to his people. It has remained for more than seventeen hundred years as a sign that "the Lord of hosts is with us; our stronghold is the God of Jacob" (Psalm 46:8).

Consider the significance of this building. This was the first place where God's people could assemble publicly and testify to Jesus' presence in the celebration of the Eucharist. Here, and at every Mass, Jesus himself is present under the appearances of ordinary bread and wine. He comes to us in this humble way so that he can be with us in the ordinary circumstances of our everyday lives. This tremendous miracle is a consoling reality and a spiritual stronghold for each of us: Jesus is present, in lowly Eucharistic form, in every tabernacle in the world!

This is why we design churches to be beautiful sacred spaces: to mark them as fitting dwellings for Jesus and to remind us that he is always with us. He dwells among us and offers himself to us every day.

Today, let's thank God for all the astounding things he has done. But above all, let's rejoice in his constant faithful presence among us! And let's open our hearts to receive and adore him, present in the Eucharist.

"Thank you, Jesus, for the gift of your Body and Blood. You are my stronghold, Lord, and you will never leave me."

Chúa Nhật ngày 09/11/2025 "Đức Chúa ở với chúng ta". (Tv 46,8).

Suy niệm: Is Vương cung thánh đường Thánh Gioan Latêranô được đặt tên theo tên ngọn đồi Latêranô trên đó nó được tọa lạc. Nhà thờ chính tòa này của Roma được cung hiến cho cả Thánh Gioan Tẩy Giả và Thánh Gioan – tác giả Tin Mừng, và tồn tại như một biểu tượng về sự kiên vững của toàn thể Giáo Hội. Được cung hiến vào năm 324 sau Công Nguyên, ngay sau khi Hoàng đế Constantine cho phép các Kitô hữu gặp gỡ nhau mà không bị bách hại, Vương cung thánh đường Latêranô cũng nhắc nhở chúng ta về sự trung tín bền bỉ của Thiên Chúa đối với dân Người. Nhà thờ ấy đã duy trì hơn một ngàn bảy trăm năm như một dấu chỉ rằng: "Chính Chúa Tể càn khôn ở cùng chúng ta. Thiên Chúa nhà Giacóp là thành lũy bảo vệ ta" (Tv 46,8).

Hãy suy gẫm ý nghĩa của tòa nhà này. Đây là nơi đầu tiên mà dân Thiên Chúa có thể quy tụ cách công khai và làm chứng cho sự hiện diện của Chúa Giêsu trong việc cử hành Thánh Thể. Ở đây và trong mỗi Thánh Lễ, chính Chúa Giêsu hiện diện dưới hình bánh và rượu bình thường. Người đến với chúng ta cách khiêm nhường để Người có thể ở với chúng ta trong những hoàn cảnh bình thường của cuộc sống hằng ngày. Phép lạ vĩ đại này là một thực tại an ủi và là một thành trì tinh thần cho mỗi người chúng ta: Chúa Giêsu đang hiện diện, dưới hình thức Thánh Thể khiêm hạ, trong mọi nhà tạm trên thế giới!

The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome (November 9) TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

What is the name of the pope's cathedral? If you said the Vatican, or St. Peter's, you were off by a few miles, since the answer is the Basilica of St. John, the Lateran, the "Mother Church" of all the churches of the world and the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome. It takes its name from the Lateran family, the Trumps of their day, who somehow ran afoul of the Emperor Nero. He seized all their property, including their vast Roman palace and estate. We don't know how Plautius displeased Nero so badly, but eventually all the Lateran property came to Constantine, the first Christian emperor, through his wife, Fausta. Early in the fourth century, when Christianity was at last legalized, Constantine gave the property to the church. Soon the great meeting halls were expanded and adapted.

Over the centuries, the church building has been sacked by armies, ruined by fire, torn down, and rebuilt. The oldest and most unchanged part of the Lateran is a vast, separate baptistery with steps leading down to a huge green basalt pool. Imagine what a triumphal moment the dedication of this public church building was for a community that had worshiped in secret for so long! This week's feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica is really about the tradition of consecrating space for worship, and so by extension, a feast for your parish church building and, given the beautiful second reading, for its baptistery as well.—Rev. Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

New religious faith gives fresh lenses for viewing human customs, and the wisdom to transform them. In the ancient world, the Romans feared the dead. Funeral customs were designed to hasten the departure of souls to the next world. Cremation was the rule, although burial increased in popularity in the second century. Procession from the place of death to the place of cremation or burial was the most important part of the funeral. Those who carried the funeral bier carried it low, close to the ground, to promote the soul's departure to the nether world.

Christians, on the other hand, did not fear the dead, but cherished them as they consigned them to Christ's love and protection. Gradually, they began to reject customs rooted in fear. Christians carried their dead to their resting places singing, with the bier carried high, away from the ground and toward the heavens. For the Christian, the grave was a sign of hope and a place of remembrance. Superstitious Romans feared burial places, and so the Christians cherished them as places of remembrance and prayer, and in time, even celebrated the Eucharist there. In November, many of us visit the cemetery for prayer and the autumn clean-up. By cherishing our dead, we are responding in faith to a vital part of our Christian tradition.—James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.


