FROM FR. CHUCK

A JOYFUL CELEBRATION OF THE SOLEMNITY OF JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE TO ALL! It is the last Sunday of the Church year. We conclude it with the acknowledgment that Jesus Christ is our king. Next week we will move out of Cycle A of the Church year with the Gospel of Matthew as our primary Sunday storyteller and into Cycle B with the Gospel of Mark and the First Sunday of Advent, beginning a new Church year. While today's readings make clear the power and authority of God over all he has created, they challenge us with a call to serve the king by caring for the "least ones" – the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the stranger, the sick, and the imprisoned. When we do this, we are serving the king. Kings generally act out of a sense of entitlement, it goes with the title. Hence, it is not a stretch to say that those least ones have a claim on all of us who are able to serve them. This puts our normal way of thinking on its head. We tend to think that if we give to the poor or visit someone who is sick, we are operating with largess, we are doing something beyond what we are obliged to do. Rather, the gospel of Jesus Christ would say it is our obligation, we are expected to do as much if we are subjects and disciples of this king. A wonderful challenge to us all!

Living and working in a parish downtown gives me occasion to think about these least ones all the time. We see and minister to many strangers who are hungry or thirsty or do not have warm clothing. As do many, I ask what can be done? There are a lot of agencies out there trying to help and they get overwhelmed or run out of funds but often it is the people we see wandering the streets who get overwhelmed first. One of the things some of us in the parish have been talking about is the formation of a ministry I've called "Walk with Me". It would be a commitment to journey with someone who is on the street or nearly on the street to help them get the support they need. It would need to be individualized and will require some training for those leading. I'm calling those people the "walkers" and those who are in need the "seekers." If you think you might be interested in being a part of this ministry, there will be a meeting in Righini Hall on Wednesday, November 29, at 7:00 PM. Let me know if you have any questions or think you'd like to be a part of this outreach. There will be several ways to help.

November 28, has become known as "Giving Tuesday" as a sort of "gift-giving season" begins. Our diocese is participating in the #iGiveCatholic Giving Day campaign, beginning online from 12:00 AM to 11:59 PM. This year, we are focusing the campaign for the Cathedral on the Stained-Glass Window project, which will require upwards of \$125,000 to repair and secure our beautiful windows. This project will include installing outer protective covering for the windows as well as reinforcing, stabilizing, and cleaning the inside. If you or someone you know may be able to donate to this project, funds may be mailed in or by going to reno.igivecatholic.org and type in St. Thomas Aquinas Cathedral in the location. All donations will help toward this important project for our beautiful, historic church.

Next Sunday, At the 9:30 AM Mass, we will celebrate the **Rite of Acceptance**. This is the first formal step for all those participating in the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA, also known as RCIA). We have 16 people who began this process several months ago to learn more about the Catholic faith and consider being received fully into the Church. This includes five adults who are not baptized, a couple of people baptized into another Christian denomination who would like to become Catholic, and others baptized Catholic who have not been catechized nor received the Sacraments of Confirmation, Holy Communion or Reconciliation. By participating in this ritual, the candidates state a belief that God is calling them on this journey toward full reception into the Church. They then will continue through the periods of preparation to the Easter Vigil when the sacraments will be celebrated with them. Please pray for those on this journey and for their sponsors.

I hope that you had a good Thanksgiving celebration. It was wonderful to see many at our Thanksgiving Day Mass, coming together around the Eucharistic table, grateful for the gifts of this life and a faith community to acknowledge them. Most appropriate, as the very word "Eucharist" means thanksgiving. A special thanks to all who helped with the beautiful liturgy.

¡DESEÁNDOLES UNA GOZOSA CELEBRACIÓN DE LA SOLEMNIDAD DE JESUCRISTO, REY DEL UNIVERSO! El último domingo del año eclesiástico, y lo concluimos con el reconocimiento de que Jesucristo es nuestro Rey. La próxima semana concluimos el Ciclo A con el Evangelio de Mateo como nuestro narrador principal del domingo y entraremos al nuevo año eclesiástico con el Ciclo B, con el Evangelio de Marcos y el 1er Domingo de Adviento. Las lecturas de hoy dejan en claro el poder y la autoridad de Dios sobre todo lo que ha creado y nos desafían con un llamado a servir al rey, cuidando de los "más pequeños" - los hambrientos, los sedientos, los desnudos, los extranjeros, los enfermos y los encarcelados. Cuando hacemos esto, servimos al rey. Los reyes generalmente, por su título, actúan por un sentido de derecho. Por lo tanto, no es una exageración decir que los más pequeños tienen derecho a que todos los que somos capaces, les sirvamos. Esto pone de cabeza nuestra forma tradicional de pensar. Tendemos a pensar que si damos a los pobres o visitamos a alguien que está enfermo, estamos actuando con generosidad, estamos haciendo algo más allá de lo que estamos obligados a hacer. Más bien, el evangelio de Jesucristo diría que es nuestra obligación por ser súbditos y discípulos de este rey. ¡Un reto maravilloso para todos nosotros!

Vivir y trabajar en una parroquia en el centro de la ciudad me da la constante oportunidad de pensar en los más pequeños. Aquí, vemos y servimos a muchos extraños que tienen hambre o sed, o no tienen la ropa adecuada para sobrevivir los elementos. Al igual que muchos, pregunto ¿qué se puede hacer? Hay muchas agencias que intentan ayudar, pero se ven abrumadas o no tienen fondos para ayudar, pero a menudo son las personas que vemos rondando por las calles las que se sienten más abrumadas. Un grupo de feligreses y yo hemos discutido sobre la formación de un ministerio que hemos llamado "Camina Conmigo". Este ministerio consistirá en un compromiso de navegar con alguien que vive en la calle o casi en la calle y ayudarle a obtener el apoyo que necesita. Tendría que ser individualizado y requerirá cierta capacitación para los líderes. Llamo a esas personas los "caminantes" y a los necesitados los "buscadores". Si usted cree estar interesado en ser parte de este ministerio, habrá una reunión en el Salón Parroquial, Righini Hall, el miércoles 29 de noviembre a las 7:00 PM. Por favor, hágame saber si tiene alguna pregunta o si le gustaría ser parte de este ministerio. Habrá varias maneras de ayudar.

El 28 de noviembre se ha nombrado como "Giving Tuesday", (*Martes para Dar*) ya que comienza una especie de "temporada de regalos". Nuestra diócesis está participando en la campaña #iGiveCatholic Giving Day, que comienza en línea de las 12:00 AM a 11:59 PM. Este año, estamos enfocando la campaña para la Catedral en el proyecto de las ventanas, que requerirá más de \$125,000. Este proyecto incluirá la instalación de una cubierta protectora exterior, refuerzo, estabilización y limpieza del interior. COLLECTION TO BENEFIT THE RETIREMENT FUND FOR RELIGIOUS

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Across the United States, hundreds of religious communities- Priests, Brothers, Sisters, and Nuns- lack financial resources to meet the retirement and healthcare needs of aging members. Many elderly religious spent their youth working for small stipends, with little for retirement savings. Simultaneously, the decrease in religious vocations means that few religious are able to serve in compensated ministry. Today, retired religious outnumber wage-earners by three to one.

The Retirement Fund for Religious (RFR) attempts to provide for those religious who gave their lives to the church. Most donations to the RFR are distributed as Direct Care Assistance, going to individual religious for immediate eldercare needs or saved for long-term expenses. Nearly 25,000 elderly sisters, brothers, and religious order priests benefit annually from this fund. Roughly 95% of the RFR budget aides senior religious. The remainder is used for administration of the funds and promotion of the nationwide RFR appeal.

Donating to this fund is a great way to help the growing number of elderly religious who due their service to God were unable to save for their retirement. **This second collection will be taken on December 9/10.**

COLLECTION TO BENEFIT ONE CHURCH—ST. PETER CANISIUS CATHOLIC CHURCH IN SUN VALLEY, NV

As we approach the end of the year, I want to draw your attention to a new special collection entitled *One Church*. This will be an annual 2nd Collection taken up on Christmas throughout the Diocese of Reno to benefit a particular ministry with outstanding need. This 1st annual *One Church* Christmas Collection will be taken up for St. Peter Canisius Parish.

Although the actual Second Collection will occur at all Christmas Masses, parishes are asked to place the special **One Church** donation envelopes in pews during each of the four (4) Sundays of Advent so that parishioners can make their donation earlier by using the special envelope and placing it in the regular parish collection. Providing this special donation envelope during the four Sundays of Advent will help raise awareness of both need and the pending Second Collection at Christmas.

During the Advent and Christmas season, we can reflect the generosity of God the Father who sent His only Son through our support of a parish community in need of financial assistance. As one Catholic family in northern Nevada, this is an opportunity for us to demonstrate our unity and our concern for each of our brothers and sisters.

I ask that you take a few moments to understand why St. Peter Canisius parish is deserving of our support. Established in the 1950's, St. Peter's has now outgrown the worship and facility space needed for its members. Facts about St. Peter Canisius include:

- St. Peter's has the largest congregation in the diocese, averaging more than 600 attendees at each Mass, but current seating capacity is only 227 people.
- ♦ St. Peter's currently has 875 students between the ages of 7-17 enrolled in religious education and Sacramental preparation classes, but only has 2 small classrooms and 2 bathrooms.
- A capital campaign is underway to increase the seating capacity of the Church to 800 by expanding the current facility. Construction is underway and a new Church will be rededicated in the Fall of 2024. They need help to offset the immense cost of modern construction.


