## FROM FR. CHUCK

**Happy Veteran's Day weekend!** We honor all the veterans in our community and all those in active service. It has become customary, when seeing a woman or man in military uniform or otherwise identifying as a veteran, to say, "Thank you for your service." It is a nice gesture and acknowledgement but I have heard more than one veteran say, "It's nice, but it often feels less than heartfelt." Like any such greeting or acknowledgement, it can sound empty if there isn't a sincere appreciation behind it. This weekend throughout our land there will be parades and banquets and all sorts of special events that, hopefully, will portray deep gratitude to these men and women who have served and are serving our country in this important and very often selfless way. To all of you, we say THANK YOU!" The best way we give thanks for such service is to do all we can to keep peace as a primary goal in our world, our country and in our own hearts. Afterall, Veteran's Day has its roots in Armistice Day, marking the end of World War I, touted as the "war to end all wars". As many have pointed out, peace is more than the absence of war, it is truly ensuring the dignity of every human being on the planet. St. Paul noted that we are all one body and when one member suffers, we all suffer. To truly honor our military, and to best keep them out of harm's way, is to remember all those who suffer needlessly due to war, oppression and poverty, and do our best to lift them up. "Blessed are the peacemakers," we read in the Gospel of Matthew.

Our theme for this year's **Interfaith Thanksgiving Service**, set for this coming Thursday, November 16, is "Thankful for the Peacemakers". I hope you will plan to come to this annual event that demonstrates how we can live and pray together. It is all the more important this year with the world conflicts and division we see. Trinity Episcopal Cathedral, just a couple blocks from us, is hosting the event this year at 7:00pm. I would recommend parking in our lot and walking over as their parking is even more limited than ours. All are welcome! Please plan to come and bring a friend.

As we move into the wetter and cooler weather of November, it is important to keep in mind that viruses tend to get spread more easily. I hope you have been able to get the flu and most recent COVID vaccines. For infants and older adults, the RSV vaccine is also recommended. These don't prevent getting a virus necessarily, but certainly limit the severity when it does hit you. If you are ill, please stay home from mass so to limit spreading it to others. If you are well but feel more comfortable wearing a mask in larger gatherings like mass, feel free to do so. I note here a few other points relative to our liturgical celebrations.

While it is good to offer a hand when exchanging the Sign of Peace with one another at mass, there are those who are uncomfortable doing that because they are susceptible to illness. Please respect that in one another. At the same time, the Exchange of Peace is not simply a wave to others, it is a sincere gesture to another that s/he may know the peace of Christ within. Eye contact, a bow and the spoken word, "peace be with you" are very important.

Communion is a procession to the altar, the table of the Lord, and the sacred meal we receive together. While receiving Communion on the tongue is an option, it is not holier or more respectful of the Body and Blood we are receiving. The more ancient tradition is receiving in one's hand so that we "take and eat" as the Lord's mandate reminds us. Please be mindful of the minister of the Eucharist and, if you must receive on the tongue, open your mouth and extend your tongue so that the minister can easily give you the Eucharist and be aware that the minister must give Communion to the next person following you.

Finally, we have been offering Communion in the cup as a fuller sign of receiving the Body and Blood of Christ. We do believe that we receive all of Christ's body and blood in either or both forms. It is an option to receive both. However, if you are not receiving from the cup, as you pass by the cup held by a minister, it is appropriate to give a simple bow of the head, recognizing the presence of Christ in the consecrated wine.

I have been on vacation for a couple of weeks so it is good to be back with you this weekend. I am grateful to the priests who assisted in my absence and thank you all for your patience as I catch up on phone calls and appointments. Please mark your calendars for our parish **Thanksgiving Day mass** at 9:00am on November 23 here at the Cathedral. This bilingual mass is always full of good cheer and spirit.

## DEL PADRE CHUCK

"¡Feliz fin de semana del Día de los Veteranos! Honramos a todos los veteranos en nuestra comunidad y a todos los que están en servicio activo. Se ha vuelto costumbre, al ver a una mujer u hombre en uniforme militar o que se identifica como veterano, decir: "Gracias por tu servicio". Es un bonito gesto y reconocimiento, pero he escuchado a más de

un veterano decir: "Es agradable servir, pero en algunas ocasiones sus palabras no se siente sinceras". Como cualquier saludo o reconocimiento, puede sonar vacío si no hay una sincera apreciación detrás. Este fin de semana en toda nuestra nación habrá desfiles y banquetes y todo tipo de eventos especiales que, con suerte, mostrarán profunda gratitud a estos hombres y mujeres que han servido y están sirviendo a nuestro país de esta manera tan importante y a menudo desinteresada. A todos ustedes, les decimos ¡GRACIAS! La mejor forma de agradecer tal servicio es hacer todo lo posible para mantener la paz como objetivo principal en nuestro mundo, nuestro país y en nuestros propios corazones. Después de todo, el Día de los Veteranos tiene sus raíces en el Día del Armisticio, que marca el fin de la Primera Guerra Mundial, promocionada como la "guerra para acabar con todas las guerras". Como muchos han señalado, la paz es más que la ausencia de guerra, realmente garantiza la dignidad de todos los seres humanos en el planeta. San Pablo señaló que todos somos un solo cuerpo y cuando un miembro sufre, todos sufrimos. Para honrar verdaderamente a nuestro ejército, y para mantenerlos fuera de peligro, es recordar a todos aquellos que sufren innecesariamente debido a la guerra, la opresión y la pobreza, y hacer todo lo posible para levantarlos. "Bienaventurados los pacificadores", leemos en el Evangelio de Mateo.

Nuestro tema para el Servicio de Acción de Gracias Interreligioso de este año, programado para este próximo jueves 16 de noviembre, es *"Agradecidos por los pacificadores"*. Espero que planeen venir a este evento anual que demuestra cómo podemos vivir y rezar juntos. Es aún más importante este año con los conflictos mundiales y la división que vemos. La Catedral Episcopal de la Trinidad, a solo un par de cuadras de nosotros, está organizando el evento este año a las 7:00 pm. Recomiendo que se estacionen en nuestro estacionamiento y caminar hasta allá, ya que su estacionamiento es aún más limitado que el nuestro. ¡Todos son bienvenidos! Por favor, planeen venir y traer a un amigo.

A medida que entramos en el clima más húmedo y fresco de noviembre, es importante tener en cuenta que los virus tienden a propagarse con más facilidad. Espero que hayan podido recibir las vacunas contra la gripe y COVID más recientes. Para los bebés y adultos mayores, también se recomienda la vacuna RSV. Estas no necesariamente previenen la obtención de un virus, pero ciertamente limitan la gravedad cuando te contagias. Si estás enfermo, por favor quédate en casa para limitar la propagación a otros. Si te encuentras bien, pero te sientes más cómodo usando una máscara en reuniones más grandes como la misa, no dudes en hacerlo. Aquí menciono algunos otros puntos relativos a nuestras celebraciones litúrgicas.

Aunque es bueno ofrecer una mano al intercambiar el Signo de la Paz con los demás en la misa, hay quienes se sienten incómodos al hacerlo porque son susceptibles a las enfermedades. Respeten eso en los demás. Al mismo tiempo, el Intercambio de Paz no es simplemente un saludo a los demás, es un gesto sincero a otro para que pueda conocer la paz de Cristo dentro de sí. El contacto visual, una reverencia y la palabra hablada, "la paz esté contigo", es muy importante.

La Comunión es una procesión hacia el altar, la mesa del Señor, y el sagrado alimento que recibimos juntos. Aunque recibir la Comunión en la lengua es una opción, no es más sagrada o respetuosa del Cuerpo y la Sangre que estamos recibiendo. La tradición más antigua es recibir en la mano para que podamos "tomar y comer", como nos recuerda el mandato del Señor. Por favor, sean conscientes del ministro de la Eucaristía y, si deben recibir en la lengua, abran la boca y extiendan la lengua para que el ministro pueda darles fácilmente la Eucaristía y tengan en cuenta que el ministro debe dar la Comunión a la siguiente persona después de ustedes.

Finalmente, hemos estado ofreciendo la Comunión bajo las dos especies (Cuerpo y Sangre) de Cristo. Creemos que recibimos todo el cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo en cualquiera o ambas formas. Es una opción recibir ambos. Sin embargo, si no están recibiendo de la copa, al pasar junto a la copa que sostiene un ministro, es apropiado hacer una simple inclinación de la cabeza, reconociendo la presencia de Cristo en el vino consagrado.

He estado de vacaciones durante un par de semanas, así que es bueno estar de vuelta con ustedes este fin de semana. Estoy agradecido con los sacerdotes que asistieron en mi ausencia y gracias a todos por su paciencia mientras me pongo al día con las llamadas telefónicas y las citas. Por favor, marquen en sus calendarios nuestra misa de Acción de Gracias parroquial a las 9:00 am el 23 de noviembre aquí en la Catedral. Esta misa bilingüe siempre está llena de buen ánimo y espíritu.


