## FROM FR. CHUCK

**Holy Week is upon us!** With the celebration of the Mass for Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord we enter into the most solemn week of the Church year. Each day is called “holy” because we are treading together on the holy ground of the events that shaped our very faith in the risen Jesus Christ. His suffering, death, and resurrection is remembered during this Holy Week and in the remembering we relive these events and apply their meaning to our lives. The most sacred days of this Holy Week are the Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter, which begins with the Great Vigil on Saturday evening. I strongly encourage everyone to come to church on each of these days if at all possible.

**Holy Thursday** Mass will begin at 7:00 PM and tells the stories of the first Passover and Jesus’ *“mandatum,”* in the washing of the feet, “If I, therefore, the master and teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash one another’s feet.” John 13:14. All will be invited at this liturgy to wash and be washed as we remember this powerful call to service and its intimate connection to the Eucharist itself. The conclusion of this liturgy is a solemn procession with the Holy Eucharist through the church, outside and down into Righini Hall to the Altar of Repose. Mass will not be celebrated again until the Easter Vigil. The Eucharist is reserved at this altar for Holy Communion on Good Friday or for the sick. This liturgy is also the first time we sing the Gloria since Lent began. A couple of extra things to bring with you to Mass on Holy Thursday: a bell of any size, so that you can ring it during the refrain of the Gloria, and a towel for the washing of your feet. There will be time following the procession into the hall for quiet prayer, in anticipation and reflection for the next day.

**Good Friday** begins in silence. The sanctuary is stripped bare as this is the day of the Passion of the Lord. We will observe three hours of devotion in the afternoon. We will begin at noon with the bilingual Stations of the Cross we have been using during Lent. Following that will be a spoken and sung meditation on the Seven Last Words of Christ. We will be joined by Episcopalian, Methodist, Lutheran and African Methodist Episcopal pastors, along with our parish clergy, to give a brief reflection on one of the Words, interspersed with song. This is a long-tradition for Good Friday and will begin at 12:45 PM. The Good Friday Liturgy will begin at 2:00 PM and will include a reading from the Passion in the Gospel of John, Adoration of the Cross and Holy Communion. The Hispanic community will present the Live Stations of the Cross at 5:00 PM, beginning in the church and continuing outside. If it is not possible for you to come in the afternoon, the Good Friday Liturgy will be repeated at 7:00 PM. It’ll begin in Righini Hall for those who prefer English and in the church for those who prefer Spanish. Both groups will come together in the church for the Adoration and Holy Communion. This is a profound day, framed in prayer and fasting. On this day, we abstain from meat and eat only one main meal. **The Easter Vigil begins at 8:00 PM (NO 4:30 PM Mass)** because it is to happen after sundown. We begin with the lighting of the fire, the new Paschal Candle, and the proclamation of Christ our Light. This “mother of all liturgies” includes the Exultet, an ancient chant of our salvation through Christ and the sacred stories of Scripture from creation to resurrection. Bishop Mueggenborg will preside. He’ll baptize two adults and welcome into the Catholic Church two others. He will also give the Sacrament of Confirmation on these adults as well as seven other Catholic

adults. As the Mass continues these all will receive Holy Communion with the entire assembly. The liturgy is long but truly beautiful and a liturgical summary of our faith. The church will begin in darkness and, at the singing of the Gloria, become fully lit. Bring your bell to ring again during the Gloria. The Easter Vigil begins the long Easter Season. Our Easter Sunday schedule will keep the regular Sunday Mass times.

As we come to the end of Lent, I want to thank all those who have played an extra part in helping us mark this holy season. The Stations of the Cross each Friday have been nicely attended. Special thanks to those who took on the soup and supper each week. These include the Women of St. Thomas Aquinas, the Knights of Columbus, our parish staff, the RCIA team, Elect, Candidates and Sponsors and the Religious Education teachers, staff, and families. The Religious Education students also provided our last Friday evening Stations of the Cross enactment. Many thanks to you all and to the lectors and cantors who assisted with the stations.

As an entrance into these holy times, I invite you to join me for a couple of quiet evenings of reflection on Monday and Tuesday of Holy Week in Righini Hall. We will share prayer, a video by a storyteller of a boyhood friend of Jesus that we'll start on Monday and continue Tuesday. We'll begin at 6:30 PM and conclude by 8:00 PM. The church will remain open until 9:00 PM for quiet prayer. ***Please call the parish office to sign up for these days for planning purposes.***

## DEL PADRE CHUCK

¡La Semana Santa está aquí! Con la celebración de la Misa del Domingo de Ramos de la Pasión del Señor entramos en la semana más solemne del año eclesiástico. Cada día es llamado "santo" porque juntos estamos pisando en el terreno santo de los eventos que dieron forma a nuestra fe en Jesucristo resucitado. Su sufrimiento, muerte y resurrección se recuerda durante esta Semana Santa y en el recuerdo revivimos estos eventos y aplicamos su significado a nuestras vidas. Los días más sagrados de esta Semana Santa son el Triduo: Jueves Santo, Viernes Santo y Pascua, que comienza con la Gran Vigilia del sábado por la noche. Recomiendo encarecidamente a todos que vengan a la iglesia en cada uno de estos días si es posible.

**La Misa del Jueves Santo comenzará a las 7:00 PM** y narra las historias de la primera Pascua y el "*mandatum*" de Jesús, en el lavatorio de los pies: "Si yo, siendo el Señor y el maestro, les he lavado los pies, también ustedes deben lavarse los pies unos a otros". Juan 13:14. Todos están serán invitados al lavatorio de los pies y a lavar los pies de alguien mientras recordamos este poderoso llamado al servicio y su íntima conexión con la Eucaristía misma. La liturgia concluye con una procesión solemne hacia el Righini Hall hasta el Altar del Reposo. La Misa no se volverá a celebrar hasta la Vigilia Pascual. La Eucaristía está reservada en este altar para la Sagrada Comunión del Viernes Santo o para los enfermos. Esta liturgia es también la primera vez que cantamos el Gloria desde que comenzó la Cuaresma. Un par de cosas extra para traer con usted a la Misa del Jueves Santo: una campana de

cualquier tamaño, para que pueda tocarla durante el estribillo del Gloria, y una toalla para el lavatorio de sus pies. Habrá tiempo después de la procesión hacia la sala para la oración en silencio, en anticipación y reflexión para el día siguiente.

**El Viernes Santo** comienza en silencio. El santuario está completamente desnudo ya que este es el día de la Pasión del Señor. Observaremos tres horas de devoción por la tarde. Comenzaremos al mediodía con las Estaciones de la Cruz bilingües que hemos estado usando durante la Cuaresma. Despues de eso habrá una meditación sobre las Últimas Siete Palabras de Cristo. Nos acompañarán pastores episcopales, metodistas, luteranos, junto con nuestro clero parroquial, para dar una breve reflexión sobre una de las palabras, intercalada con canciones. Esta es una tradición antigua para el Viernes Santo comenzando a las 12:45 PM. La Liturgia del Viernes Santo comenzará a las 2:00 PM e incluirá una lectura de la Pasión, la Adoración de la Cruz y la Sagrada Comunión. La comunidad hispana presentará las Estaciones de la Cruz en vivo a las 5:00 PM, comenzando en la iglesia y concluyendo en el jardín. Si no le es posible venir por la tarde, la Liturgia del Viernes Santo se repetirá a las 7:00 PM. Comenzará en Righini Hall para aquellos que prefieren el inglés y en la iglesia para aquellos que prefieren el español. Luego, ambos grupos se reunirán en la iglesia para la Adoración y la Sagrada Comunión. Este es un día profundo, enmarcado en la oración y el ayuno. En este día, nos abstene mos de comer carne y comemos solo una comida principal. **La Vigilia Pascual comenzará a las 8 PM (NO Misa de 4:30 PM)** porque va a suceder después de la puesta del sol. Comenzamos con el encendido del fuego, el nuevo Cirio Pascual y la proclamación de Cristo nuestra Luz. Esta "madre de todas las liturgias" incluye el Exultet, un antiguo canto de nuestra salvación a través de Cristo y las historias sagradas de la Escritura desde la creación hasta la resurrección. El obispo Mueggenborg presidirá la película. Bautizará a dos adultos y acogerá en la Iglesia Católica a otros dos. También dará el Sacramento de la Confirmación a estos adultos, así como a otros siete adultos católicos. A medida que la Misa continúe, todos recibirán la Sagrada Comunión con toda la asamblea. La liturgia es larga pero verdaderamente hermosa y un resumen litúrgico de nuestra fe. La iglesia comenzará en la oscuridad y, con el canto del Gloria, se iluminará completamente. Traiga su campana para que la vuelva a sonar durante el Gloria. La Vigilia Pascual comienza el largo tiempo de Pascua. Nuestro horario del Domingo de Pascua mantendrá los horarios regulares de la Misa dominical.

Al llegar al final de la Cuaresma, quiero agradecer a todos aquellos que han jugado un papel adicional en ayudarnos a marcar esta temporada santa. Las Estaciones de la Cruz de cada viernes han sido muy bien atendidas. Un agradecimiento especial a aquellos que sirvieron la sopa cada semana. Estos incluyen a las Mujeres de Santo Tomás de Aquino, Caballeros de Colón, el personal parroquial, el equipo de RICA, Electos, Candidatos y Patrocinadores y los maestros, el personal y las familias de Educación Religiosa. Los estudiantes de Educación Religiosa también patrocinaron el ultimo convivo parroquial junto con una actuación del Vía Crucis. Muchas gracias a todos ustedes y a los lectores y cantores que ayudaron con las estaciones.

Como entrada a estos tiempos santos, los invito a unirse a mí para un par de noches de reflexión el lunes y el martes de la Semana Santa en Righini Hall. Compartiremos la oración, un video de un narrador de un amigo de la infancia de Jesús que comenzaremos el lunes y continuaremos el martes. Comenzaremos a las 6:30 PM y concluiremos a las 8:00 PM. La iglesia permanecerá abierta hasta las 9:00 PM para la oración en silencio. **Por favor comuníquese con la oficina parroquial para confirmar su asistencia para mejor planificación.**


## Eucharistic Prayer #3—Sanctus

"And they [the seraphim] were calling to one another: 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory.' At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke." Isaiah 6:2-4

The 'Sanctus' is a profound moment in the Mass, in which we come to recognize that we are entering into Heaven. As such, we quote two very important passages of the Bible. The first is the acclamation of the angels praising God before the throne of grace. As such, we become cognizant that we are entering into something transcendent, joining our voices to those of angels. The 2<sup>nd</sup> is the proclamation of blessing to him "who comes in the name of the Lord" (c.f. Psalm 118:26) which was said by the crowds as Christ entered into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. This is the same crowd who five days later would call out to have Christ crucified. And this is something powerful to meditate on—that though we sing with the angels, we cannot ignore the ever present temptation to abandon the Lord when the crowds turn against Him.
