FROM FR. CHUCK

Today marks the annual observance of the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity. Our readings beautifully address aspects of this profound doctrine of the Church. Moses meets God in a cloud – a common motif of the presence of God in the Old Testament. This most closely resembles the images of God the Father in the New Testament, particularly at the baptism of Jesus and at his transfiguration. In the gospel today we hear of God giving his Son to the world. We are reminded of the several times in John's gospel where Jesus notes his unity with God the Father. "The Father and I are one" (John 10) and "whoever has seen me has seen the Father" (John 14) to name a couple. Our second reading from St. Paul brings in the Holy Spirit, tying all three together, in the words that form the common greeting at the beginning of Mass, made in the name of Jesus Christ, the love of God (the Father) and the Holy Spirit. Many, many reflections on the Trinity have been written over the centuries. Each trying to explain the triune nature of God, three persons, yet one in being, one God. It is hard for us as Christians to grasp this concept and even harder for those who have not been raised or taught to understand it. Yet it is a truth we hold, accentuating the connectedness of all God created. God's very being is communal and we, made in "his image", are communal as well. St. Paul sums it up well: love, grace, and fellowship – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Many in our community experienced the fellowship of music on the Friday before Pentecost as choirs from St. Gall of Gardnerville and St. Rose of Lima, St. Albert the Great and St. Thomas Aquinas of Reno, all gathered here to share the music of the liturgical year. It was a spirited and joyful event, and I am grateful for all who participated. Special thanks to the Women of St. Thomas Aquinas who provided a delightful reception in Righini Hall following the concert. We hope to do it again next year when perhaps more parishes will participate. It is a good opportunity for parish groups to come together and hear each other's music we would not otherwise hear. It also was good for the Cathedral, as the mother church of the diocese, to host such an event.

This coming Tuesday, June 6, at 6:00 PM Bishop Mueggenborg will come to the Cathedral for the Confirmation of 5 of our young people. Daylyn, Belen, Isabella, Karla, and Vanessa have been preparing for at least the past two years for this sacrament. All are welcome to the Confirmation Mass. If you are available, please plan to come and support our youth.

We have concluded the glorious Easter Season and have moved into Ordinary Time, so I want to be sure to again acknowledge the many good people of the parish who work extra hard during this season to make our liturgies wonderful. From greeting, to music, to proclamation, to serving, to the beautiful environment it all happens in - scores of parishioners are freely giving of their time and talent for the rest of us. **THANK YOU ONE AND ALL!**

Although we move into Ordinary Time, we do have several special solemnities right after Easter each year. Today is the first, the Most Holy Trinity, followed next Sunday by the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ and then the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus on Friday, June 16. Solemnities are the highest feast days of the liturgical year and sometimes are holy days of obligation as well, just like every Sunday. For the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ we will have a procession with the Blessed Sacrament following the 9:30 AM Mass. We'll also distribute water, peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, and hygiene kits (compliments of Catholic Charities) to those we meet on the street along the way. Please consider participating in this procession and act of charity. Starting next Sunday, we will also be praying a new prayer after Communion which connects the Body and Blood of Christ we have received to the action of being Christ's Body and Blood in the world. See the note later in the bulletin with that information.

The Knights of Columbus have showered our parish with some extra charity as they have purchased new chairs for Righini Hall. As you may know, the chairs have been patched and re-patched, and some were a bit wobbly. These new chairs stack nicely and load on wheeled racks for easy stowing. The Knights purchased 52 and a special donation bumped us to 60 new chairs. *What a nice gift! Thank you, Knights of Columbus! I hope to see many of you at their miniature golf tournament next Saturday.* 😊

BLESSINGS TO YOU ALL THIS NINTH WEEK IN ORDINARY TIME!



DEL PADRE CHUCK

Hoy celebramos la solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad. Nuestras lecturas abordan aspectos de esta profunda doctrina de la Iglesia. Moisés se encuentra con Dios en una nube, una imagen común de la presencia de Dios en el Antiguo Testamento. Esto se asemeja a las imágenes de Dios Padre en el Nuevo Testamento, particularmente en el bautismo de Jesús y en su transfiguración. En el evangelio de hoy escuchamos de Dios dando a su Hijo al mundo. Se nos recuerda varias veces en el evangelio de Juan donde Jesús nota su unidad con Dios Padre. "El Padre y yo somos uno" (Juan 10) y "el que me ha visto a mí, ha visto al Padre" (Juan 14). Nuestra 2ª lectura de San Pablo trae el Espíritu Santo, uniendo los tres, en las palabras que forman el saludo común al comienzo de la Misa, hecho en el nombre de Jesucristo, el amor de Dios (el Padre) y el Espíritu Santo. Muchas reflexiones sobre la Trinidad se han escrito a lo largo de los siglos. Cada uno tratando de explicar la naturaleza trina de Dios, tres personas, pero un solo Dios. Es difícil para nosotros como cristianos comprender este concepto y aún más difícil para aquellos que no han sido criados o enseñados a entenderlo. Sin embargo, es una verdad que sostenemos, acentuando la conexión de todo lo que Dios creó. El ser mismo de Dios es comunal y nosotros, hechos a "su imagen" también somos comunales. San Pablo lo resume bien: amor, gracia y compañerismo: Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo.

Muchos en nuestra comunidad experimentaron la comunión de la música el viernes antes de Pentecostés cuando los coros de algunas de nuestras parroquias hermanas se reunieron aquí para compartir la música del año litúrgico. Fue un evento animado y estoy agradecido por todos los que participaron. Un agradecimiento especial a las Mujeres de Santo Tomás que brindaron una recepción en el Righini Hall después del concierto. Esperamos hacerlo de nuevo el próximo año, cuando quizás participen más parroquias. Es una buena oportunidad para que los varios grupos parroquiales se reúnan y escuchen la música de los demás que de otra manera no escucharíamos. También fue bueno para la Catedral, como la iglesia Madre de la Diócesis, albergar tal evento.

El este martes, 6 de junio, a las 6:00 PM, el Señor Obispo Mueggenborg Confirmará a 5 de nuestros jóvenes. Daylyn, Belén, Isabella, Karla y Vanessa se han estado preparando durante al menos los últimos dos años. Todos son bienvenidos a la Misa de Confirmación. Hemos concluido la gloriosa temporada de Pascua y nos hemos movido al Tiempo de Ordinario, por lo que quiero reconocer nuevamente a los tantos feligreses que trabajaron muy duro durante esta temporada para hacer que nuestras liturgias sean maravillosas. Aunque pasamos al Tiempo Ordinario, cada año tenemos varias solemnidades especiales justo después de Pascua. Hoy es la primera, la Santísima Trinidad, seguida por el Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo y luego el Sacratísimo Corazón de Jesús. Las solemnidades son los días festivos más altos del año litúrgico y, a veces, también son días santos de obligación, como lo son todos los domingos. Para la Solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo tendremos una procesión con el Santísimo Sacramento siguiendo la Misa de las 9:30 AM. También distribuiremos agua, sándwiches de mantequilla de maní y mermelada, y kits de higiene (cortesía de Caridades Católicas del norte de Nevada) a aquellos que encontremos en la calle en el camino. Por favor, considere participar en esta procesión y acto de caridad. 
Communal Thanksgiving Prayer After Communion

Bishop Mueggenborg started us last year on the 2-year Eucharistic Revival with the temporary insertion of a special prayer after Communion. His intention and hope was to foster renewed awareness of the real presence of Christ in the bread and wine we share, the Body and Blood of Christ. For the 2nd year of the Eucharistic Revival, there will continue to be a period of 30 seconds of silence after the reception of Communion and the reposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle and the prayer will change, to raise awareness of the call in all those who receive to become the body and blood of Christ in the world.

At the end of the sacred silence, the bishop has asked all of us to offer a communal prayer of Thanksgiving using the following prayer based on a reflection by St. Teresa of Avila.

“Lord Jesus, having received your most sacred Body and Blood, grant us the grace to become what we receive. Help us to remember that in the world, you have no body now but ours, no hands, no feet on earth but ours. Ours are the eyes with which you look with compassion on this world, ours are the feet with which you walk to do good, ours are the hands with which you bless the world. Ours are the hands, ours are the feet, ours are the eyes. We are your body. Make our hearts like unto thine. Amen”

May we become more attentive to the opportunities every day in our community and world to be the hands, feet, eyes and body of Christ in our world.



ORACIÓN COMUNITARIA DE ACCIÓN DE GRACIAS DESPUÉS DE LA COMUNIÓN

El año pasado, el Obispo Mueggenborg inició el Avivamiento Eucarístico de 2 años con la inserción temporal de una oración especial después de la Comunión. Nuestras son las manos, nuestros son los pies, nuestros son los ojos. Somos tu cuerpo. Haz nuestros corazones semejantes al tuyo. Amén.”

Que cada día estemos más atentos a las oportunidades en nuestra comunidad y en el mundo de ser las manos, los pies, los ojos y el cuerpo de Cristo en nuestro mundo.
