FROM FR. CHUCK

I just looked at my liturgical calendar for this Sunday and it says, “**World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly**”. In 2021 Pope Francis established this day to be celebrated on the 4th Sunday in July. The day was likely chosen due to its proximity to the memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, (July 26) the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary and thus grandparents of Jesus, as told in Church tradition. The theme for this year’s celebration selected by the pope is “His mercy is from age to age.” Calling for this day, Pope Francis said, “*the Holy Spirit even today stirs up thoughts and words of wisdom in the elderly.*” The voice of the elderly “is precious,” he said, “because it sings the praises of God and preserves the roots of the peoples.”

The U.S. Bishops recently approved the transfer of the celebration of this day to the weekend after Labor Day in September to coincide with National Grandparents Day in the United States, celebrated by many communities across the country. Still, let us pray with the Church around the world this weekend for all our grandparents and the elderly, especially those who are such great witnesses of faith to us. In many cultures, including here in the United States, it is often the grandparents who make sure the faith remains alive in the family and many of the elderly who are not grandparents remain great support for us all. When it is especially miserable weather, summer, or winter, and I see some of those struggling under the burden of years making the effort to come to Mass, I think it strengthens all of us to keep showing up and to live out our faith in all parts of our lives. I consider the elderly as the special “pray-ers” of the parish. I know some of you will say, “I wish I could do more in the Church, but I just don’t have the energy anymore.” Prayer is never more needed than now and your commitment to do that for the Church is a great gift to us all! Happy Day to all the elderly and all the grandparents around the world and may God grant rest, peace, and light to all those who have already gone before us!

May we also strive to ensure that all the elderly have their basic needs met and know the love of community and of God - especially those who are weak and have no one to support and care for them. This day of focus surely is to give thanks for their lives, but it is equally important that we uphold their dignity in our eyes and in our world.

The gospel today continues with the seeds motif as Jesus talks about the seeds of wheat and the seeds of weeds. Last week the focus was on what type of ground would the seeds of the Lord fall upon. This week the focus is on what type of seeds are being sown. Although we strive to cultivate only the good seed in our lives, inevitably, the bad seed creeps in and can threaten our faith lives. Those can be the seeds of indifference and addiction as well as temptation, greed, control, self-centeredness, and violence. Yet, like the master in the story, the Lord does not give up on us when that bad seed grips our lives. He allows the good to grow around it, perhaps the good will overwhelm the bad and bring us along the right path to the Lord. The subtlety is in the seed – we can’t always tell which is bad. The spiritual journey is a delicate one that requires careful attention and openness to the call of the Lord. Prayer, the sacraments, and reflection with others who are faithful and true to the gospel will help us along the way. Periodic evaluation is essential as we look at the fruit of our faith. One of the great things about Jesus’ parables is that they speak to everyday lives. They speak of hope, love, forgiveness, and the absolute generosity of God. When the harvest is of the Lord, the fruit reveals the same gifts.

A dear parishioner and the mother of one of my long-time friends has passed from among us. **Louise Bierce**, faithful wife of 45 years to Bill Bierce, passed away last week. Bill and Louise have been members of the Cathedral parish for virtually 45 years, attending the first Mass every Sunday morning. Louise lost her first husband to cancer at a young age and raised her boys, Paul and David, through their teen years before meeting and marrying Bill, who also is a Knight of Columbus. Louise’s mom, Caroline Costello, was a long-time member of the parish as well, until her death several years ago. Paul and I are classmates from Our Lady of the Snows middle school days through high school, with David just a year behind. Let us pray for this wonderful, faithful lady and give thanks for her presence in the parish these many decades. There will be a rosary vigil service at Walton’s on 2nd and Vine at 6:00 PM on Wednesday, July 26. The funeral Mass will be here at the Cathedral at 10:00 AM on Thursday, July 27. May she rest in peace.

Hoy celebramos: "El Día Mundial de los Abuelos y los Ancianos". Establecido en 2021 por el Papa Francisco para celebrarse el 4º domingo de julio. El día probablemente fue elegido debido a su proximidad al memorial de San Joaquín y Santa Ana, (26 de julio) los padres de la Santísima Virgen María y, por lo tanto, abuelos de Jesús, como dice la tradición de la Iglesia. El tema de la celebración de este año es "Su misericordia es de época en época". Al llamar a este día, el Papa Francisco dijo que "*el Espíritu Santo también hoy despierta pensamientos y palabras de sabiduría en los ancianos*". La voz de los ancianos "*es preciosa*", dijo, "*porque canta las alabanzas de Dios y conserva las raíces de los pueblos*".

Recientemente, los obispos de los Estados Unidos aprobaron la transferencia de este día al fin de semana después del Día del Trabajo, para que coincida con el Día Nacional de los Abuelos en los Estados Unidos, celebrado en todo el país. Oremos pues este fin de semana por nuestros abuelos y ancianos, especialmente aquellos que son testigos de fe para nosotros. En muchas culturas, incluso aquí en los Estados Unidos, a menudo, los abuelos son quienes se aseguran de que la fe permanezca viva en la familia y muchos de los ancianos que no son abuelos siguen siendo un gran apoyo para todos nosotros. Cuando tenemos un clima especialmente miserable, verano o invierno, y veo a algunos de los que luchan bajo la carga de años haciendo el esfuerzo de venir a Misa, creo que nos fortalece para seguir asistiendo a Misa y vivir nuestra fe en todas las partes de nuestras vidas. Considero a los ancianos como los "orantes" especiales de la parroquia. Sé que algunos de ustedes dirán: "Ojalá pudiera hacer más en la Iglesia, pero ya no tengo la energía". ¡Ahora más que nunca, la oración y su compromiso de orar por toda la Iglesia, es un gran regalo para todos! ¡Feliz día a todos los ancianos y abuelos del mundo y que Dios conceda descanso, paz y luz a todos aquellos que ya nos han precedido!

Esforémonos por asegurar que todos los ancianos tengan solventadas sus necesidades básicas y conozcan el amor de la comunidad y de Dios, especialmente aquellos que son débiles y no tienen quien los sostenga y cuide. Este día de enfoque es para dar gracias por sus vidas, pero es igualmente importante que defendamos su dignidad ante nuestros ojos y ante nuestro mundo.

El evangelio de hoy continúa con el tema de las semillas. Jesús habla de las semillas de trigo y las semillas de la cizaña. La semana pasada la atención se centró en qué tipo de tierra caerían las semillas del Señor. Esta semana la atención se centra en qué tipo de semillas sembrada. Aunque nos esforzamos por cultivar solo la buena semilla en nuestras vidas, inevitablemente, la mala semilla se arrastra y puede amenazar nuestras vidas de fe. Esas pueden ser las semillas de la indiferencia y la adicción, así como de la tentación, la codicia, el control, el egocentrismo y la violencia. Sin embargo, el Señor no se da por vencido con nosotros cuando esa mala semilla se apodera de nuestras vidas. Él permite que lo bueno crezca a su alrededor, tal vez lo bueno abrumará a lo malo y nos llevará por el camino correcto hacia Él. La sutileza está en la semilla, no siempre podemos saber cuál es mala. El camino espiritual es delicado y requiere una cuidadosa atención y apertura a la llamada del Señor. La oración, los sacramentos y la reflexión con otras personas que son fieles al Evangelio nos ayudarán en el camino. Una evaluación periódica es esencial para mirar el fruto de nuestra fe. Una de las grandes cosas de las parábolas de Jesús es que hablan de la vida cotidiana. Hablan de esperanza, amor, perdón y la generosidad absoluta de Dios. Cuando la cosecha es del Señor, el fruto se revela en los mismos dones.

Una de nuestras feligreses y la madre de uno de mis amigos por mucho tiempo falleció. **Louise Bierce**, fiel esposa de Bill Bierce durante 45 años, falleció la semana pasada. Bill y Louise han sido miembros de la Catedral durante 45 años, asistiendo a la primera Misa los domingos por la mañana. Louise perdió a su primer esposo al cáncer a una edad temprana y crió a sus hijos, Paul y David, durante su adolescencia antes de conocer y casarse con Bill, un Caballero de Colón. La madre de Louise, Caroline Costello, también fue feligrés aquí hasta su muerte hace varios años. Paul y yo fuimos compañeros de clase desde la secundaria hasta la preparatoria, con David solo un año atrás. Oremos por esta maravillosa y fiel señora y demos gracias por su presencia en la parroquia durante tantas décadas. El velorio y el rosario serán en Walton's el la calle 2^a, este miércoles 26 de julio a las 6:00 PM. La Misa será aquí en la Catedral el jueves 27 de julio a las 10:00 AM. Que descansen en paz.

INTRODUCTION TO THE MASS #5—THE BIBLE IN THE MASS

“LORD, TO WHOM SHALL WE GO? YOU HAVE THE WORDS OF ETERNAL LIFE.” JOHN 6:68 NIV

Nearly every part of the Mass is Biblical—indeed if you were to take every Bible reference out of the Mass, it would only last about 30 seconds. Indeed, the word ‘Testament’ (i.e. Old/New Testament) and the word ‘Covenant’ are synonyms. They are translations of the same word in both Hebrew and Greek. Christ established the New Covenant in the “Paschal Mystery,” and the Mass makes us present to that New Covenant. So in a way, the Mass is the Bible in ritual form.
