FROM FR. CHUCK

This weekend our Jewish brothers and sisters celebrate Jewish New Year. *Rosh Hashana* began at nightfall on Friday, September 15 and will end at nightfall on Sunday. Known as the head of the Jewish year, in addition to beginning a new year, these days celebrate God's creation of the earth and universe. They're also a part of the "High Holy Days" (*Yamim Nora'im*) of the Jewish people that continue with the solemn observance of *Yom Kippur*, or Day of Atonement, which begins this year after nightfall on Sunday, September 24, ending after nightfall on Monday, September 25. That entails a 25-hour period of fasting from food and drink and a time of prayer in the synagogue.

Jesus was an observant Jew, so I think it is helpful to imagine his life marking these High Holy Days every year, journeying with his people and his Father. *Yom Kippur* remembers the day when Moses came down from Mt. Sinai after seeking forgiveness for what the people had done in worshipping the golden calf. It is a day when Jews go before the Lord in prayer, seeking forgiveness and trusting it will be granted. Surely that is on the mind of Jesus when he tells the parable of the king who decided to settle accounts, which we hear today. Forgiveness is integral in the Kingdom of God, and the first step toward it must be taken in humility. The servant begs for forgiveness of his debt, and it is granted. He then fails to embrace humility but rather, in his arrogance, throttles another servant indebted to him and has him thrown in jail. In this parable we see a 2-fold lesson on the misuse of power over another and on the failure to forgive. The king in Jesus' story gets it right on both counts and the story admonishes us to learn and do the same.

Awareness of the weakness and vulnerability of others is essential in the journey of faith for us all. I was impressed by the throng of people who turned out to see *Sound of Freedom* last Sunday at the Riverside Theater. Every seat was taken so the management brought in additional, temporary seating to safely accommodate as many as possible. People from several parishes attended. Awareness of child sex trafficking was raised by the film and was followed by Melissa Holland, co-founder of Awaken Reno, a non-profit that works directly helping trafficked youth get out of their abusive situations. We took donations raising \$1,500. Before the collection I committed to finding matching funds, so I hope to forward \$3,000 to Awaken this week. Thank you to all who attended and were able to donate. If you didn't get a chance to donate and would like to do so, please mail to the office, give to me or put in an envelope marked "Awaken" in the collection next weekend. Special thanks to our benefactor who funded the theater and film showing for us all!

Another wonderful sign of support flowed from our parish as a result of the visitation from Sr. Dorcas Balogun from the **Sisters of St. Michael the Archangel**. This is the mission community that does powerful outreach in Nigeria. We collected \$5,250 for this ministry and I received a lovely note of thanks for the warm reception she received here. She also noted: "*I want to extend my gratitude to the parishioners for their generosity towards our mission in Nigeria. I pray that God may bless you and the entire faithful of your parish and the Diocese as you support the missionary work of the Sisters of St. Michael the Archangel.*" Good job one and all!

Yet another note of generosity was expressed in our collection for the Maui fire victims. We sent a \$5,207.67 check to **Catholic Charities of Hawaii** to assist those in this crisis. Bishop Larry Silva sent a lovely note in appreciation, saying, in part: "*Please know how grateful I am that you took up a collection in the parish and were able to send over \$5,000 to Catholic Charities Hawaii! Please extend my gratitude to all your generous and caring parishioners.*"

If you've come into the church through the west vestibule you've probably noticed our new **AED** (Automated External Defibrillator) sign and box. Thanks to the kindness of a concerned parishioner, the staff received training and the parish received the AED machine, which we had in the Sacristy. In the event of a heart emergency, this machine can save a life while medical personnel are on their way. Please locate the AED box so that you can be ready to help if such an emergency arises and special thanks to our donor!

I'm indeed edified by the kindness, concern, and generosity of many of our parishioners, friends and visitors. We are blessed in countless ways and when blessings are shared, we all grow and benefit. ☺

Please note that the priests will be attending a Day of Recollection at Holy Family parish in Yerington on Thursday, September 21st. Our presenter will be Msgr. John Cihak from the Archdiocese of Portland. He will be speaking on priestly identity today. This annual fall day of recollection is always a good opportunity for the priests scattered around northern Nevada to come together in prayer, reflection, and fellowship. (**NOTE THAT THERE WILL BE NO 12:10 PM MASS AT THE CATHEDRAL THAT DAY. HOWEVER, ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT WILL OCCUR AS USUAL AT 1:00 PM.**)

In addition to it being the Feast of Saint Matthew, Thursday is also **International Day of Peace**, which was established in 1981 by a unanimous resolution of the United Nations. With the war in the Ukraine and the many conflicts ongoing in Africa, the Middle East and other parts of the world, it is good to set aside a day to pray and to take some action in support of peace between and within all nations. The choice of the date for our Day of Reflection being offered by our Life, Peace & Justice Commission next Saturday flows from this day of hope for peace.

DEL PADRE CHUCK

Este fin de semana nuestros hermanos judíos celebran el Año Nuevo judío. *Rosh Hashaná* comenzó al anochecer del viernes 15 de septiembre y terminará al anochecer del domingo. Conocido como el culmen del año judío, además de comenzar un nuevo año, estos días celebran la creación de Dios de la tierra y el universo. También son parte de los "Días Santos Mayores" (*Yamim Nora'im*) del pueblo judío que continúan con la observancia solemne de *Yom Kipur*, o Día de la Expiación, que comienza este año después del anochecer del domingo 24 de septiembre, terminando después del anochecer del lunes 25 de septiembre. Eso implica un período de 25 horas de ayuno de comida y bebida y un tiempo de oración en la sinagoga.

Jesús era un judío observante, así que creo que es útil imaginar su vida marcando estos Días Mayores cada año, viajando con su pueblo y su Padre. *Yom Kipur* recuerda el día en que Moisés bajó del Monte Sinaí después de buscar el perdón por lo que el pueblo había hecho al adorar al becerro de oro. Es un día en que los judíos van ante el Señor en oración, buscando el perdón y confiando en que se les concederá. Seguramente eso está en la mente de Jesús cuando cuenta la parábola que escuchamos hoy, del rey que decidió ajustar cuentas. El perdón es parte integral del Reino de Dios y el primer paso debe darse con humildad. El siervo ruega por el perdón de su deuda, y se le concede. Luego no abraza la humildad, sino que, en su arrogancia, estrangula a otro sirviente en deuda con él y lo encarcela. Aquí hay una doble lección sobre el mal uso del poder sobre otro y sobre la falta de perdón. El rey en la historia de Jesús lo hace bien en ambos aspectos y la historia nos llama a aprender y hacer lo mismo.

La conciencia de la debilidad y la vulnerabilidad de los demás es esencial en el camino de la fe para todos nosotros. Me impresionó la multitud de personas que acudieron a ver *Sound of Freedom* el domingo pasado en el Teatro Riverside. Se ocuparon todos los asientos, por lo que la gerencia trajo asientos temporales para acomodar de manera segura a la mayor cantidad posible. Asistieron personas de varias parroquias. La conciencia sobre el tráfico sexual infantil fue aumentada por la película y fue seguida por Melissa Holland, cofundadora de Awaken Reno, una organización sin fines de

lucro que trabaja directamente ayudando a los jóvenes traficados a salir de sus situaciones abusivas. Recibimos \$1,500 en donaciones. Antes de la colecta, me comprometí a igualar las donaciones recibidas, así que espero enviar \$3,000 a Awaken esta semana. Gracias a todos los que asistieron y pudieron donar. Si no tuvo la oportunidad de donar y le gustaría hacerlo, envíe su donación por correo a la oficina, entréguemela a mi directamente o póngala en un sobre marcado "Awaken" en la canasta de la colecta el próximo fin de semana. ¡Un agradecimiento especial al benefactor que financió la proyección de la película para todos nosotros!

Otro maravilloso signo de apoyo de nuestra parroquia por la visita de Sor Dorcas Balogun de las **Hermanas de San Miguel Arcángel**. Una comunidad misionera que hace un poderoso alcance en Nigeria. Recolectamos \$5,250 para este ministerio y recibí una hermosa nota de agradecimiento por la cálida recepción que recibió aquí. También señaló: "Quiero extender mi gratitud a sus feligreses por su generosidad hacia nuestra misión en Nigeria. Ruego para que Dios los bendiga a ustedes y a todos los fieles de su parroquia y de la Diócesis mientras apoyan el trabajo misionero de las Hermanas de San Miguel Arcángel". ¡Buen trabajo todos y cada uno!

De hecho, estoy agradecido por la amabilidad, la preocupación y la generosidad de tantos de nuestros feligreses, amigos y visitantes. Somos bendecidos grandemente y cuando se comparten las bendiciones, todos crecemos y nos beneficiamos. ☺
