## FROM FR. CHUCK

**HAPPY EPIPHANY SUNDAY!** As you listen to the gospel today, see if you can come up with the three kings. You won't find them. In fact, there are no kings except Herod, nor the number three, in the story of this special visitation we tell every Epiphany. The word used to describe the visitors is "magi"—far from being kings but seen as those endowed with special knowledge. Matthew uses the word "astrologers", thus it is the star that guides them. The number three is attributed because there are three gifts presented to the infant Jesus but all we know from the story is that there is more than one visitor. You may have heard the names of these three: Balthasar, Caspar, and Melchior. However, the original story does not include this. These names were found in a chronicle written 800 years later and have stuck in traditional Church storytelling about this great event. Whether there were three or even their names are not as important to the story as the powerful symbols used. The star was part of an ancient belief that a new star would appear at the time of a ruler's birth—thus Herod's fear when the magi told him about it. The gifts also tell more of the story. First, gold is presented to mark the royalty of the newborn. Frankincense is next in line to note the holiness of the child Jesus. Myrrh comes last and is the strangest gift for a newborn, an oil for anointing the body of deceased person. It foreshadows the death of Jesus. The Holy Family's flight into Egypt and Herod's attempt to kill the infant Jesus forewarn of the troubles Jesus will have. He'll be rejected by both religious and government leaders and ultimately be put to death.

For believers, the beautiful story of the star and the visitors from the East bearing gifts point to so much more than what is on the surface. There is just one more day of the Christmas Season remaining, Monday, the **Feast of the Baptism of the Lord**. Importantly, we move from the stories of the child Jesus to the adult upon whom the Spirit descends at his baptism. We are in Cycle B of the liturgy so this year we will hear that story from the Gospel of Mark. Unlike Matthew and Luke, Mark's gospel doesn't begin with Jesus' birth, but rather his baptism. He then is immediately driven into the desert by the Spirit, where Jesus' fill face and overcome temptation before beginning his ministry.

Baptism is central to the faith journey of us all and in just about five weeks we will be entering liturgically into the desert ourselves as Lent begins. I ask you to **save the date** now for a mission retreat which will be offered for all Cathedral parishioners in the second week of Lent. Fr. Jim Barry, a wonderful retired pastor from the Archdiocese of Boston, will be our primary presenter for this mission which is entitled "**Live in God's Love – welcome into the Body of Christ**" and will be held February 26, 27, and 28. Fr. Jim will preach at the Masses the weekend before and then there will be two sessions offered each of the following three days. For those who do not go out at night, a session will be offered in the morning from 8:30 to 10:30 AM. The evening session will be 6:30-8:30 PM and will cover the same material as the morning session. Please mark your calendars and plan to participate in this 3-day parish mission retreat.

This week, all priests in the Diocese of Reno will be gathering with our bishop in Gardnerville for our annual **Priests Study Days**. Our retired clergy are also encouraged to attend. Fr. Pablo Gadenz, a scholar of Sacred Scripture, will be our presenter. He was also the keynote speaker and presenter at our Diocesan Conference this weekend. I'm looking forward to his presentations on the Gospel of Mark for us. Meetings for some of the priest leadership will begin at noon on Monday with all the priests coming together for dinner that evening. Tuesday and Wednesday will be our study days and then Thursday is an administrative day with the bishop and some diocesan staff to discuss a variety of topics relevant to our parishes and our priesthood. This is one of the two times each year the priests of our large, spread-out diocese have the chance to come together for several days. Please keep us in your prayers and know that you will be in our prayer as well. Note that there will be no Masses at the Cathedral Tuesday–Thursday. Adoration will be offered as usual on Thursday beginning at 1:00 PM and concluding with Benediction at 5:30 PM. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will follow.

I want to be sure to acknowledge and give thanks to all those who helped make our Christmas liturgies and environment so beautiful. There are many who generously donated lots of extra hours in decorating the church, practicing music, preparing for the Nativity by our Religious Education kids, gathering gifts for the needy and in so many other ways contributing to the Christmas cheer for our entire community. Thank you to one and all!

## **DEL PADRE CHUCK**

**¡FELIZ DOMINGO DE LA EPIFANÍA DEL SEÑOR!** Al escuchar el evangelio hoy, vea si puede identificar a los tres Reyes. No los encontrará. De hecho, no hay reyes excepto Herodes, ni el número tres, en la historia que contamos cada Epifanía. La palabra utilizada para describir a los visitantes es "magos", lejos de ser reyes, sino vistos como aquellos dotados de conocimientos especiales. Mateo usa la palabra "astrólogos", por lo tanto, es la estrella la que los guía. El número tres se atribuye porque hay tres regalos presentados al niño Jesús, pero todo lo que sabemos de la historia es que hay más de un visitante. Es posible que haya escuchado los nombres: Baltasar, Gaspar y Melchor. Sin embargo, la historia original no los incluye. Estos nombres se encontraron en una crónica escrita 800 años después y se han quedado en la narración tradicional de la Iglesia sobre este gran acontecimiento. El hecho de que fueran tres o incluso sus nombres no es tan importante para la historia como los poderosos símbolos utilizados. La estrella formaba parte de una antigua creencia de que una nueva estrella aparecería en el momento del nacimiento de un gobernante, de ahí el temor de Herodes cuando los magos se lo contaron. Los regalos también cuentan más de la historia. Primero se presenta oro para conmemorar la realeza del recién nacido. El incienso señala la santidad del Niño Jesús. La mirra se menciona por último y es el regalo más extraño para un recién nacido, un aceite para ungir el cuerpo de una persona fallecida. Prefigura la muerte de Jesús. La huida de la Sagrada Familia a Egipto y el intento de Herodes de matar al niño Jesús advierten de los problemas que vendrán. Será rechazado tanto por los líderes religiosos como por los gubernamentales y, en última instancia, condenado a muerte.

Para los creyentes, la hermosa historia de la estrella y los visitantes de Oriente que llevan regalos apuntan a mucho más de lo que está en la superficie. Solo queda un día más de la temporada navideña, el lunes, **la fiesta del Bautismo del Señor**. Es importante destacar que pasamos de las historias del Niño Jesús al adulto sobre quien el Espíritu descenderá en su bautismo. Litúrgicamente estamos en el Ciclo B, así que este año escucharemos esa historia del Evangelio de Marcos. A diferencia de Mateo y Lucas, el evangelio de Marcos no comienza con el nacimiento de Jesús, sino con su bautismo. Inmediatamente es conducido al desierto por el Espíritu, donde Jesús llena el rostro y vence la tentación antes de comenzar su ministerio.

El bautismo es fundamental para nuestro camino de fe y en solo cinco semanas entraremos en el desierto cuando comience la Cuaresma. Les pido que **reserven la fecha** para un retiro misionero que se ofrecerá a los feligreses de la Catedral en la segunda semana de Cuaresma. El Padre Jim Barry, un maravilloso párroco jubilado de la Arquidiócesis de Boston, será nuestro presentador principal para esta misión que se titula **"Vivir en el amor de Dios – Bienvenidos al Cuerpo de Cristo"** y se llevará a cabo el 26, 27 y 28 de febrero. El Padre Jim predicará en las Misas el fin de semana previo y luego se ofrecerán dos sesiones cada uno de los siguientes tres días. Para aquellos que no salgan por la noche, se ofrecerá una sesión a las 8:30 a 10:30 AM. La sesión vespertina será de 6:30 a 8:30 PM y tratará el mismo material que la sesión de la mañana. Por favor, marque su calendario y planee participar en este retiro parroquial de 3 días.

Esta semana, los sacerdotes en la Diócesis de Reno nos reuniremos con el obispo para nuestros **Días Anuales de Estudio**. También se anima a los sacerdotes jubilados a asistir. El Padre Pablo Gadenz, Catedrático de las Sagradas Escrituras, será nuestro presentador. También será el orador principal y presentador en la Conferencia Diocesana este fin de semana. Espero con ansias sus presentaciones sobre el Evangelio de Marcos. Las reuniones comenzarán el lunes al mediodía. El martes y miércoles serán días de estudio y el jueves un día administrativo con el obispo y algunos miembros del personal diocesano para discutir una variedad de temas relevantes para nuestras parroquias y nuestro sacerdocio. Esta es una de las dos veces al año en que los sacerdotes tienen la oportunidad de reunirse. Por favor, manténganos en sus oraciones y sepá que usted estará las nuestras. Tenga en cuenta que no habrá Misas en la Catedral de martes a jueves. La adoración al Santísimo será como de costumbre el jueves a partir de la 1:00 PM y concluirá con la bendición a las 5:30 PM. Seguirá el Sacramento de la Reconciliación.

Quiero asegurarme de reconocer y dar gracias a todos aquellos que ayudaron a que nuestras liturgias navideñas y el ambiente fueran tan hermosos. Hay muchos que generosamente donaron horas extras en la decoración de la iglesia, practicando música, preparándose para la Natividad por parte de nuestros niños de Educación Religiosa, recolectando regalos para los necesitados y de muchas otras maneras contribuyendo a la alegría navideña de toda nuestra comunidad. ¡Gracias a todos y cada uno!

In Peru, missionaries working in the Peruvian Amazon bring the Gospel to the Ashaninka & Matsigenka communities of about 60,000 people.

Such encounters and engagement with the peoples of South America are made possible when Catholics in our diocese are generous to the Collection for the Church in Latin America. Your participation in the collection truly becomes a way to share your faith and support evangelization efforts among all peoples. 
