

## FROM FR. CHUCK

**Happy Laetare Sunday!** Today marks the half way point in our observance of Lent, three weeks behind us, three weeks to come. Therefore, we rejoice, quietly, still aware of the journey ahead, but grateful that we have come this far together. If you have fallen in your chosen Lenten observance or you haven't really gotten started, begin now. Much remains in the season that will culminate in Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum, the most solemn time of year for Christians.

The first reading from Chronicles presents an important reminder for us about the sabbath. The people had lost their way, were unfaithful to the Lord and his commands. They were overrun by the Babylonians and taken captive. In essence, they had lost their sabbath, that is, their connection to God, and the day set aside to honor the Lord, to rest and to give thanks. In many ways we have lost our sabbath day in the world also. It is very good we come to mass, but how do we use the rest of the day? Some among us are required by their employers to work on Sunday. Professional offices are generally closed but so many other businesses are open. Before or after mass it can be like just another day. We live in a multi-faith environment so the sabbath means different things to different people on different days. However, it is still crucial for us to mark the day especially with prayer and rest and praising God, the day we also celebrate the Resurrection. Our sabbath begins at sundown on Saturday, thus our evening mass on that day. Like the observance of Lent, the Lord's Day beckons to us to do something different, not in penance but in thanksgiving. I encourage those who are required to work on Sunday to stay open to opportunities to getting the day off in the future. When that is not possible, I think it is important to consider making a sabbath on another day of the week, in addition to whatever limited way it can be observed while working on Sunday. The Lord knows we need rest and we know we need to give God thanks. Would that all peoples of faith not compromise their sabbath, I believe it would make a powerful statement in our world about priorities and acknowledging that God exists and is Lord over all.

Our parish mission retreat the week before last was an excellent time out for reflection, prayer and the sharing of our faith. We had over 100 participants for three days, some in the morning and more in the evening. Fr. Jim Barry led us in pondering who is God for us, who and what is Trinity, and how do we listen to the Holy Spirit. We considered that for ourselves, individually, but with a focus on us as Church, the People of God, as a parish and worldwide. Facilitators helped with rich discussions around the tables. Ritual prayer was a beginning and conclusion for each gathering. Thank you, again, for all who took part in those days. We want to continue the dialogue about how the Holy Spirit is moving us as a parish and how we can stay more attentive to the Spirit. On this Sunday, **March 10, at 1:30pm** all are invited to Righini Hall to do just that. I would also like to see us plan a time for feedback to Pope Francis and the ongoing Synod on Synodality. A note later in the bulletin talks about a couple of parishes hosting listening sessions for the synod and there is a link to on line information about the synod. I encourage everyone to look at this for information on what has happened thus far as well as the questions for input in our later discussions in our parish. If possible, please plan to come to our gathering on Sunday. It may be short notice for many of you, so if you can't come, please consider coming to future gatherings. They will involve prayer and dialogue together. The questions we will be reflecting on this Sunday are: **1) How do we create ways or structures in the parish to listen to each other regularly to build up the community and our unity in Christ? 2) How do we use those ways and structures in dialogue to engage the world around us?**

Many of us recently received the mailing kicking off the **Catholic Services Appeal** in the Diocese of Reno for 2024. The theme this year is “**We Are His Body**” – a most fitting theme as we have been praying at mass the prayer inspired by St. Teresa of Avila for the past nine months. We will be kicking off CSA in our parish next weekend, March 16-17. Our parish goal this year is \$126,953. Some of you already have made your pledges and donations, giving us a nice foundation of over \$20,000 for our kick-off. If you have not yet made your pledge, I invite you to bring the envelope you received from the Diocese, along with your pledge and initial donation to mass next weekend. We will have baskets available and will take a few moments in prayer to bring our gifts to the altar of the Lord. CSA is the annual appeal that supports the various ministries of our diocese, which in turn support the ministries in our parishes. As one Church throughout northern Nevada, all that we do flows from our bishop and he needs our financial and spiritual support to shepherd and feed the Body of Christ.

## DEL PADRE CHUCK

¡Feliz Domingo de Laetare! Hoy marca el punto intermedio en nuestra observancia de la Cuaresma, con tres semanas detrás de nosotros y tres semanas por venir. Por lo tanto, nos regocijamos, en silencio, aún conscientes del viaje que nos espera, pero agradecidos de haber llegado hasta aquí juntos. Si has fallado en tu observancia de la Cuaresma elegida o aún no has comenzado realmente, comienza ahora. Mucho queda en la temporada que culminará en la Semana Santa y el Triduo Sacro, el momento más solemne del año para los cristianos.

La primera lectura de Crónicas nos presenta un recordatorio importante sobre el sábado. El pueblo había perdido su camino, era infiel al Señor y a sus mandamientos. Fueron conquistados por los babilonios y llevados cautivos. En esencia, habían perdido su sábado, es decir, su conexión con Dios y el día reservado para honrar al Señor, descansar y dar gracias. De muchas maneras, también hemos perdido nuestro día de descanso en el mundo. Es muy bueno que vengamos a misa, pero ¿cómo usamos el resto del día? Algunos entre nosotros están obligados por sus empleadores a trabajar los domingos. Las oficinas profesionales generalmente están cerradas, pero tantos otros negocios están abiertos. Antes o después de la misa, puede ser como cualquier otro día. Vivimos en un entorno multirreligioso, por lo que el sábado significa cosas diferentes para diferentes personas en diferentes días. Sin embargo, sigue siendo crucial para nosotros marcar el día especialmente con oración, descanso y alabanza a Dios, el día en que también celebramos la Resurrección. Nuestro sábado comienza al atardecer del sábado, por lo tanto, nuestra misa vespertina en ese día. Al igual que la observancia de la Cuaresma, el Día del Señor nos llama a hacer algo diferente, no en penitencia sino en acción de gracias. Animo a aquellos que están obligados a trabajar los domingos a estar abiertos a oportunidades para tener el día libre en el futuro. Cuando eso no sea posible, creo que es importante considerar hacer un sábado en otro día de la semana, además de cualquier forma limitada en que se pueda observar mientras se trabaja el domingo. El Señor sabe que necesitamos descanso y sabemos que necesitamos dar gracias a Dios. Ojalá que todos los pueblos de fe no comprometan su sábado, creo que haría una declaración poderosa en nuestro mundo sobre prioridades y reconocimiento de que Dios existe y es Señor sobre todo.

Nuestra misión de retiro parroquial la semana anterior fue un excelente momento de reflexión, oración y compartir nuestra fe. Tuvimos más de 100 participantes durante tres días, algunos por la mañana y más por la noche. El Padre Jim Barry nos guió en reflexionar quién es Dios para nosotros, quién y qué es la Trinidad, y cómo escuchamos al Espíritu Santo. Consideramos eso para nosotros mismos, individualmente, pero con un enfoque en nosotros como Iglesia, el Pueblo de Dios, como parroquia y en todo el mundo. Los facilitadores ayudaron con discusiones enriquecedoras alrededor de las mesas. La oración ritual fue un principio y una conclusión para cada reunión. Gracias, nuevamente, a todos los que participaron en esos días. Queremos continuar el diálogo sobre cómo el Espíritu Santo nos está moviendo como parroquia y cómo podemos estar más atentos al Espíritu. Este domingo, 10 de marzo, a la 1:30 pm, todos están invitados a Righini Hall para hacer precisamente eso. También me gustaría ver que planificamos un momento para dar comentarios al Papa Francisco y al Sínodo en curso sobre la Sinodalidad. Una nota más adelante en el boletín habla sobre un par de parroquias que organizan sesiones de escucha para el sínodo y hay un enlace a información en línea sobre el sínodo. Animo a todos a mirar esto para obtener información sobre lo que ha sucedido hasta ahora, así como las preguntas para la entrada en nuestras discusiones posteriores en nuestra parroquia. Si es posible, por favor, planifique venir a nuestra reunión el domingo. Puede ser una notificación breve para muchos de ustedes, así que si no pueden venir, por favor, consideren venir a futuras reuniones. Involucrarán oración y diálogo juntos. Las preguntas en las que reflexionaremos este domingo son: 1) ¿Cómo creamos formas o estructuras en la parroquia para escucharnos regularmente y fortalecer la comunidad y nuestra unidad en Cristo? 2) ¿Cómo utilizamos esas formas y estructuras en el diálogo para involucrar al mundo que nos rodea?

Muchos de nosotros recibimos recientemente el envío que inicia la Apelación de Servicios Católicos en la Diócesis de Reno para 2024. El tema de este año es "Somos su Cuerpo", un tema muy adecuado ya que hemos estado rezando en misa la oración inspirada por Santa Teresa de Ávila durante los últimos nueve meses. Iniciaremos la Apelación de Servicios Católicos en nuestra parroquia el próximo fin de semana, 16-17 de marzo. Nuestro objetivo parroquial este año es de \$126,953. Algunos de ustedes ya han hecho sus promesas y donaciones, dándonos una buena base de más de \$20,000 para nuestro inicio. Si aún no has hecho tu promesa, te invito a traer el sobre que recibiste de la Diócesis, junto con tu promesa y donación inicial, a la misa el próximo fin de semana. Tendremos cestas disponibles y tomaremos unos momentos en oración para llevar nuestros dones al altar del Señor. La Apelación de Servicios Católicos es la apelación anual que apoya los diversos ministerios de nuestra diócesis, que a su vez apoyan los ministerios en nuestras parroquias. Como una Iglesia en todo el norte de Nevada, todo lo que hacemos fluye de nuestro obispo y él necesita nuestro apoyo financiero y espiritual para pastorear y alimentar al Cuerpo de Cristo.


