"Let us agree here at our brother's grave stone that we will never forget him, or each other...Let us always remember how good it was when we were together, united by a good and kind feeling which, for the time we were

loving that poor boy, made us perhaps better men than we are.... Perhaps we may even grow sinful later on, but however bad we may become, yet when we recall...how we have been talking like friends all together, at this grave stone, the cruelest and most mocking of us will not dare to laugh inwardly at having been kind and good at this moment knowing what Goodness God has done for us. "~ Brothers Karamazov, Dostoyevsky

As we get closer to All Souls Day, I cannot help but reflect on the above quote from one of the greatest books of the last 200 years, Brothers Karamazov. A prophetic text, this book is fitting for our current times as we are constantly challenged with endless chaos in our modern world. This quote is an example of our duty to reflect, remember, and make an offering of ourself for the sake of another; namely those who have gone before us. In a world in which is constantly divided, death is the great unifier. No one can escape it; not even Our Lord made it through this world without dying.

The sins of those whom we love often affect us in ways that we do not always recognize. We are all tied together spiritually in ways we may not always see. Death is not the end, and remedy to sin can continue after death as we are purged of

sins. Purgatory is a state of temporary suffering and cleansing not punishment, where souls are purified from the lingering effects of sin and imperfections before they can enjoy God's presence. Thus, it is our duty to pray for the repose of their souls. In addition to praying for our recent friends and family, a forgotten tradition is to pray for the repose of the souls of our families going back seven generations. Asking the good Lord to purge whatever sins need to be cleansed and so they may eagerly receive eternal life.

All Souls Day Remembrance envelopes are now available in the back of the church. Please list as many names as you would like praying for people who may not have had anyone to pray for them in years. We will remember these names through the month of November and at the end compile a list with the names for everyone to remember in prayer.

All Souls Day will be on Sunday November 2nd and the 9:30 mass that Sunday will be celebrated at the cemetery. (Weather permitting). I ask that if you have never been to a cemetery Mass to please consider attending this solemn event.


