Message from Our Parochial Administrator

My Dear Beloved Brothers and Sisters,

Today we are celebrating the thirteenth Sunday in ordinary time. It is also the first week of July which correlates with the annual transition of priests in our diocese and many other dioceses around the country. It is also my first weekend as your new parochial-administrator. First let me introduce to you a little bit about myself.

I came from a big family with 6 other siblings, and I am the only religious person in the family, all others are married. I was born in Vietnam, but grew up here in Southern California since 1990. Growing up, I dreamt of having a beautiful family with kids, a big home, and a sleek sport car. However, things weren't going as I planned, but of God's. After graduating from college, I had questions about the meaning of life and saw sufferings in our world and our neighbors as something very tragic. Gradually, I began to read spiritual books, prayed more, and went to weekly adoration at my home parish, St. Columban in Garden Grove hoping to make a difference. Finally, one day, I decided to contact the vocation office in the Orange diocese to give the priesthood a try. I entered the seminary in 2005 and was ordained a priest in 2011. My first assignment was St. Joachim, and St. Nicholas is my fourth parish. Assigned by Bishop Vann to be your next administrator, I am looking forward to work with the clergy, staff, all ministries, and all of you to build up a place where we welcome and serve everyone who comes our way.

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus gave us two teachings: one about carrying our cross and the other about hospitality. First, hospitality. It is one of the most important ministries of the Church's life. I have not forgotten the story of the great figure of India, Mr. Mahatma Gandhi. After reading the Bible, Mr. Gandhi stepped into the Catholic church looking for meaning from Jesus and his church, but once at his church, one of the ushers looked at him and said he wasn't welcome. Mr. Gandhi said he never stepped inside the Catholic church again because of that incident. Sad and tragic.

Here at St. Nicholas, we would like to do the opposite. Sometimes, the hospitality of the Church is not the hospitality of a four-star hotel where perfect manners are expected. But here in the Church, in our parish, we have the hospitality of grace, where people who don't have Reader's Digest marriages, picture perfect lives, and who have made mistakes-big and bad ones-can come to begin again. There is room for them here. There is room for you and for me. It would be odd if the community Jesus founded is the only one to throw its wounded overboard. There is a line from a song that I have heard. It's an old song that said, "Send us your weak and we will make them strong." Yes. The hospitality of grace is about helping people put the pieces back together. That's why weekly Mass is important for all of us. We all have our crosses to carry which don't go on vacation for the summer. Here is the place where we can come to renew our vision, revive our commitment to Christ, relight our baptismal candle, reclaim our place at the Lord's table, and slowly remodel our lives. We will begin this vision with our ushers when they greet those who step into this church with courtesy, gentleness, and a big smile of welcome. Each one of us can also do our part with a warm welcome to those we meet in the pews every Sunday.

Moreover, we all know people whose family life, married life and personal life are in a huge difficulty because of the influences by popular culture, the clichés of talk shows. They are people who, St. Paul says in the second reading, were baptized into Jesus Christ, but things went wrong. We all have family members who had marriage problems. If you know of Catholics, ex-Catholics, lapsed Catholics or former Catholics who feel that they are no longer welcome or that too much water has passed over the dam, who have been overwhelmed by their cross in life, let us try to show them the hospitality of grace. Let them know that there is a place for them here.

This is the link with the hospitality of the Shunamite woman in today's first reading. We all know a fellow-Catholics who have made mistakes and committed serious sin of all kinds who now feel that the Catholic Church doesn't want them anymore. They feel that to come to church we have to have our "t's" crossed and "i's" dotted. That is not true. Absolutely not. We gather here to become holy. We are all on the same boat.

Next the cross. Before this section of the Gospel, the Lord said that He came for division, to separate mother daughter, father and son. Here, Jesus says, that if we love our relatives more than we love Him, we are not worthy of Him. These words were on target in the early Church and still happens today in some Muslim countries when the decision to become Christian tore families apart because Christianity was so incompatible with everything around it. When people became Christian, they separated themselves from the whole network of social and business contacts. Becoming Christian was a major decision. It wasn't just a private choice. It had serious consequences.

Today, so much around us is hostile to Gospel teaching: the drug culture, corporate greed, the way marriage is trivialized, the assault on human life and dignity. On almost every front, we are faced with the decision to silently go along with everyone else or to live as Christ teaches. It is a choice as serious for us as for the early Christians. This is the cross we all have to face. If we see unkind manners, injustice, hatred here in our community, we have the duty to speak up. Even though it might bring discomfort, but this is the cross we too have to carry.

The Church, this parish is a place we can call home, where we can renew their spiritual strength, remove the stains form our baptismal garment and relight their baptismal candle. We can make the effort to show others the magnificent hospitality of Jesus Christ. This is what the Lord teaches, and this is the goal that I would like us to adapt going forward. May our good Lord bless us and guide us. St. Nicholas pray for us. God bless you all.

A New Shepherd at St. Nicholas
