*TODAY'S REFLECTION:* The Cross and the Crib. We all have great hopes and dreams for our children; but we also seek to protect them from the realities that can destroy such dreams. Joseph and Mary confront those same hopes and fears in today's Gospel. Their spirits must have soared when Simeon proclaimed that their child would be a "light" for Israel; but that joy shattered into anxiety and horror when Simeon prophesied the suffering ahead of them. It is easy to welcome Jesus the innocent Child of Christmas; but God calls us to welcome Jesus, the humble Crucified of Holy Week and Easter. Luke's Gospel of the Child Jesus reminds us that the crib is overshadowed by the cross, that this holy birth is the beginning of humankind's re-birth in the Resurrection
