

MY LORD and MY GOD



DOUBT: The desire to be able to prove the existence of a divinity has troubled humanity since human consciousness first became aware of the divine. To this very day we are fond of saying that a number of things—from sunsets to hot fudge sundaes—are “proof that

there is a God.” We get so caught up in the story of ‘doubting Thomas’ that we fail to notice that today’s Gospel gives us John’s account of Pentecost, the bestowing of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples following the Resurrection. Thomas, evidently, missed out not only on seeing the Risen Christ, but receiving the Holy Spirit as well. This is not to be taken lightly and, perhaps makes Thomas’ disbelief a bit easier to comprehend. It also makes his professing that Jesus is his Lord and God—the only time the New Testament explicitly refers to Jesus Christ as “God”—more remarkable.

NOTICE OF SUSPENSION FROM PRIESTLY MINISTRY:


On October 27, 2020, the Most Reverend Joseph C. Bambera, D.D., J.C.L., imposed a suspension from priestly ministry on Reverend James T. Tracy, a priest of the Diocese of Scranton. This suspension prohibits Father Tracy from exercising priestly ministry and includes, but is not limited to the following:

- From presenting himself publically as a priest
- From exercising any function of priestly ministry in the territory of the Diocese of Scranton or anywhere else
- From celebrating the Eucharist publically or in private
- From celebrating any sacrament with any member of the Christian faithful in the territory of the Diocese of Scranton or anywhere else

These measures are disciplinary in nature and are the result of an internal canonical process involving the status of Father Tracy’s ministry as a priest. Furthermore, should anyone become aware of Father Tracy violating these precepts, they are to contact the Vicar General of the Diocese of Scranton Immediately.
