**RESPONDING TO THE CALL:**

Do we truly know the voice of Christ? Do we truly respond to the voice of our shepherd with our own distinctive voice? How often we attempt to imitate those around us, appropriating the response of another member of the flock to Christ. Perhaps we need to balance the image of being a sheep of one flock with the image from the second reading, which tells us that we are all children of God. What child has

precisely the same interaction with parents as his or her siblings? Instead, they frequently do and say things to distinguish themselves in the eyes of their parents. Whether we use the image of children or of sheep to understand our relationship with Christ, we believe that we are all known and called by name. With this great gift comes a responsibility: to respond to the call with our own distinctive voice, to take time to discern exactly what our call is, to determine precisely what the will of the Father is for each of us.

**PRAYERS NEEDED:** This week our parish will celebrate the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Communion. What wonderful expressions of faith. We also pray for vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life. Unless our children follow through and come to Mass and help build the Church, we will not have many new priests in the future. Parents and Grandparents: thank you for bringing them to church and encouraging them to practice the Catholic Faith.



**RESPECT FOR CHRIST AND HIS CHURCH:**


**NOTICE OF SUSPENSION FROM PRIESTLY MINISTRY:**

On October 27, 2020, the Most Reverend Joseph C. Bambera, D.D., J.C.L., imposed a suspension from priestly ministry on Reverend James T. Tracy, a priest of the Diocese of Scranton. This suspension prohibits Father Tracy from exercising priestly ministry and includes, but is not limited to the following:

- From presenting himself publicly as a priest
- From exercising any function of priestly ministry in the territory of the Diocese of Scranton or anywhere else
- From celebrating the Eucharist publicly or in private
- From celebrating any sacrament with any member of the Christian faithful in the territory of the Diocese of Scranton or anywhere else

These measures are disciplinary in nature and are the result of an internal canonical process involving the status of Father Tracy's ministry as a priest. Furthermore, should anyone become aware of Father Tracy violating these prescripts, they are to contact the Vicar General of the Diocese of Scranton Immediately.



Particularly regarding the sacraments of Confirmation and Marriage, these celebrations would not only be illicit, but also invalid.
