I would encourage you to read for yourself this statement but some of the highlights will be printed each week in the bulletin over the summer.

Ch 6 Some Pastoral Perspectives:

- Saint John of the Cross tells us that "old lovers are tried and true." They "are outwardly no longer afire with powerful emotions and impulses, but now taste the sweetness of the wine of love, well aged and stored deep within their hearts." (#231)
- Each crisis has a lesson to teach us; we need to learn how to listen for it with the ear of the heart. (#232)
- Communication is an art learned in moments of peace in order to be practical in moments of difficulty. (#234)
- It is important that the divorced who have entered a new union should be made to feel part of the Church. They are not excommunicated, and they should not be treated as such, since they remain part of the ecclesial community. (#243)
- (Regarding the death of a spouse) Our loved ones have no need of our suffering, nor does it flatter them that we should ruin our lives. (#255)


