FATHER JOHN'S CORNER: In the Gospel for this weekend (Mark 12:28b-34) we hear one of the scribes ask Jesus "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus replied, "The first is this: Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." He invites us to see that God alone gives meaning to our lives. And we are to love God totally. This means loving ourselves and one another. To embrace the love of God and to love in return is the greatest gift we can leave our children. This weekend as we recognize our parish's fifteenth anniversary, the Gospel is appropriate as we step forth into the future. In reflecting upon where we have come from and where we are moving to, we can ask the following questions:

- · What legacy are we hoping to leave our children?
- Will they remember the full and rich love we had for God and our neighbor, and the many ways we expressed that love?
- Do they perceive that love of God and love of neighbor is the fundamental value of our lives?

The Joyful Disciples ministry was formed to help the parish to identify our gifts and to seek ways of developing and sharing these gifts. Through the various ministries in the parish as well as through our interactions in the family and community, we reveal the love of God. LOVE GOD

As we near the end of the liturgical year we listen to Gospel readings from the final stage of Jesus' ministry—his teaching in Jerusalem. This Sunday Jesus is in conversation with one of the scribes of the temple. In a rare occurrence Jesus and the scribe agree on the two greatest commandments—to love God with all your being and to love your neighbor as yourself.

In today's selection from Deuteronomy Moses gives this teaching to the Israelites as the core of their life of faith and prayer, and Psalm 18 echoes this prayer with the words, "I love you, O LORD, my strength" (Psalm 18:2). Jews and Christians agree that our greatest responsibility is to love the one and only God, and that we cannot claim to love God without loving our neighbor as ourselves.

ALL SAINTS DAY – **November 1**: Because this Holy Day falls on a Monday this year, the obligation to attend Mass has been dispensed. **Mass will be at 7:00pm**.

An observance of all the saints has been celebrated on November 1 since at least the seventh century, and it originated even earlier, with a feast in honor of all the martyrs in the year 359. "Why should our praise and glorification, or even the celebration of this feast day mean anything to the saints?" asked St. Bernard of Clairvaux in a homily on All Saints' Day. "Clearly, if we venerate their memory, it serves us, not them. But I tell you, when I think of them, I feel myself inflamed with a tremendous yearning. Calling the saints to mind inspires, or rather arouses in us, above all else, a longing to enjoy their company... We long to share in the citizenship of heaven to dwell with the spirits of the blessed... In short, we long to be united in happiness with all the saints." (Office of Readings, Volume IV, p. 1526). All holy men and women, saints of God, pray for us. - Sourcebook 2018, LTP.

REMEMBERING THOSE WHO HAVE DIED: The Church traditionally observes the month of November as a special time to remember the faithfully departed. The following are some of the events and ways we will be recalling those who have died and praying for those who grieve their death:

CEMETERY SERVICE: There will be a prayer service at St. Mary Cemetery (Rt. 57) at **2:00pm on Sunday, October 31st.** We will be remembering in prayer all those buried at the parish cemetery in the past year as well as all those who have died. In case of inclement weather, we will hold the prayer service in the church.

NOVEMBER MASSES: During the month of November, we will be remembering at all the Masses those who are listed in the parish Book of the Dead. You may add the names of loved ones who have died to the book and they will be included in the petitions at each Mass.

ALL SOUL'S DAY – On **Tuesday, November 2nd, Mass will be at 7:00pm**, remembering all those who have died. As we remember and pray for our loved ones who have died, the reality that we ourselves must one day die is also brought home to us as a gentle, insistent reminder. In Mexico, the Day of the Dead is a way of praying for our ancestors, remembering and celebrating them, and making friends with death. As St. Ambrose wrote, "Death is then no cause for mourning, for it is the cause of mankind's salvation. Death is not something to be avoided, for the Son of God did not think it beneath his dignity, nor did he seek to escape it." (Office of Readings, Volume IV, p.1539). May the souls of the all the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace. (Sourcebook 2018. LTP)
