

### FATHER JOHN'S CORNER:

The Christmas Season ends today with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. After Jesus' baptism he begins his mission. Our baptism impels us to do the same, to share in Jesus' mission. We were anointed with Sacred Chrism as Priest, Prophet and King at our baptism and with the unique gifts and talents that God has given us we live out our role in God's plan. We live out God's will for us in our daily lives through our places of employment, school, family, and community. Also, God may be calling us to share our gifts and abilities through the various ministries in the parish.

Next weekend, there will be a brochure that lists all the ministries and organizations in the parish along with a short description of each one. You are asked to take this brochure and over the course of the week to reflect and pray on how God is calling you to use your gifts by becoming involved in a parish ministry. Then, on the **weekend of January 22/23** you will be asked to sign up for a ministry that you would like further information on with the possibility of joining that ministry.

At our baptism we were anointed with the Holy Spirit. It is with the Spirit that we are able to take the abilities that God has given us to do amazing things. God has equipped us with everything that we need to fulfil the role he has for us in his plan. We, however, have to respond yes to the call of God to use our gifts.

On the **weekend of January 29/30**, we will then be celebrating who we are as a parish community with the many ministries and organizations that are active. At the 4:30pm that weekend Bishop Malesic will be presiding as a part of our 15th anniversary of the parish.

### BAPTISMAL DEATH AND RESURRECTION

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, we also honor our own baptism as our initiation into the Christian life and community. In the Gospel, the baptism of Jesus, with his immersion and then emergence from the water, points to his later submission to God at his death, and his emergence from the grave at his resurrection. This pattern of death and resurrection is our path too, as followers of Jesus. Throughout life, often in small ways, we learn to surrender our limited and self-centered agendas. This surrender often feels like death. The sacrament of Baptism ritually enacts this pattern to remind us of Jesus' death and resurrection, so that we too might embrace the deaths and resurrections of our own lives. As Jesus emerged from the water, he encountered his Father and the Holy Spirit. Like Jesus, we can know we are God's beloved, empowered by the Spirit.

### PLANNED GIVING - YEAR-END GIVING:

In this season of giving, consider making a year-end gift to our parish in gratitude for all the blessings you have received in life. As you plan to make the most of your charitable donations in 2021, know that we gratefully accept gifts of cash and appreciated assets such as stocks or bonds. We wanted to take this time to remind you of some important CARES Act provisions that are scheduled to expire at year's end. These provisions may affect you—and even make it easier for you to make a gift to your parish. They include:

- An expanded charitable giving incentive that allows taxpayers who take the standard deduction to make up to \$300 in charitable cash contributions for single filers (\$600 for married couples) to qualified charities like ours this year.
- For those who do itemize their deductions, the law allows for cash contributions to qualified charities such as ours to be deducted up to 100% of your adjusted gross income for the 2021 calendar year.

And, if you are 70 ½ or older, you may be able to make a gift of a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA that will help us in our ministry and reduce your taxable income. Talk to your advisors and IRA administrator for more information and to be sure that your IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution gift is made directly from an IRA to a qualified charity such as our parish. ### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Merry Christmas! Share that cheerful greeting with some folks today. They may wonder if you have had any Elvis sightings lately, attended Star Trekkie conventions, or were Cleopatra in a previous lifetime. Despite the skeptics, today is solidly within the Christmas season. In fact, in some strands of the Christian tradition it represents the clearest manifestation of the mystery of the Incarnation. On Christmas Day, for example, the Gospel reading is the Prologue of John's Gospel, which reveals the glory of Christ shining through our humanity precisely in his baptism.

At any rate, this is an ancient feast, celebrated first in Egypt sixteen centuries ago. More than most other ancient people, the Egyptians understood the life-giving properties of water. On this day, they drew water from the Nile, so central in the history of their people, and reserved it in honor. Many other places copied the custom, so that St. John Chrysostom wrote of people in Antioch gathering at midnight to collect flowing water into vessels they brought from home since "today there is a blessing on the water." At home for dinner tonight, decorate the table with beautiful bowls of water and white candles, toast one another with goblets of sparkling water, and light a Christmas candle in the window one last time.

### CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

**LOOKING TO THE FUTURE:** As we move forward in looking at the options and feasibility of constructing the building of the second phase of the parish development we hired Changing Our World, a fundraising consulting firm to survey the parish. Changing our World conducted 11 interviews with parish leaders, influencers, and donors to gain their insights about the proposed parish projects and to determine their support for a potential combined campaign.

At the same time this past October, parishioners were encouraged to participate in an online study survey that was prepared by Changing Our World and distributed through email. A total of 124 survey responses have been evaluated.

Changing Our World then prepared a final report of their findings based on the interviews and study surveys of:

- ◆ 12.5% (135/1083) of registered parishioners.
- ◆ 63% (135/214) were regular financial contributors to the parish.
