

## MISSION STATEMENT



#### **FATHER JOHN'S CORNER:**

We hear in the Gospel this weekend, "So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect." Matthew 5:48. Talk about setting the bar high for us to reach! Another translation will say 'be holy as your heavenly Father is holy'. That doesn't soften the command but sounds better than 'perfect.' Jesus, however, is not giving us an unachievable goal. He is calling us to perfection, to holiness. It is a call to every day seek to be better - which is achievable. And he assures us of that, that the Holy Spirit is always with us to guide, support and encourage us.

The theme this Lent is "Holiness is our way." This Lenten Season can be a great experience of growing in holiness – yes growing in perfection. There are many opportunities that are being offered through the parish as well as many more at the touch of your screen. One of the things we will be offering is the viewing of the video program "Untold Blessing" which the program is described as: Our ultimate goal is to be a saint. It is our greatest calling and what is desired for us by our Creator. Holiness is not just for the ordained or a select few. Jesus Christ issues a 'universal call to holiness' based on his teaching in the Gospel of Matthew to 'be perfect even as your heavenly Father is perfect.' Each week of Lent following the Stations of the Cross in the chapel, we will be viewing this video program.

This weekend there is a brochure that lists the Lenten opportunities that are available to you along with a commitment card. The commitment card is for your personal use to hold yourself accountable to grow in holiness this Lent. Please take time this week to check off those things you plan to do this Lent for yourself as well your family.

I would also encourage you to check out the Lenten programs on FORMED. You can access this Catholic site free by using the button on the parish website. Through the generosity of the Holy Name, Knights of Columbus and Our Lady's Guild all parishioners are able to access the programs and resources on FORMED at no cost. A couple of the programs that caught my attention as I browsed the website was "Living Lent as a Family," "Whole 40: Making a Spiritual Plan for Lent," "Lent with Brother Francis," and "Restore: Lent with Sr. Miriam James Heidland."

For those who like to plan ahead, individual <u>pictures for the Parish Directory will be taken the last two weekends of April</u>. It has been awhile since the last parish pictorial and we hope that everyone will help us to make it a success. This is a great way to put a name with a face which helps so that we are not just strangers gathered every week for Eucharist. The sitting for your photograph is free and there is an option to purchase copies. Watch for details as we get closer to April.

Praying that this will be the best Lent ever for all of us as we seek to grow in holiness on our journey.

## Lenten Schedule

#### **FAST AND ABSTINENCE:**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence which means one large meal and two smaller meals as well as abstaining from meat. The law of fasting is for those 18-60 years old.

The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence which means no meat is to be eaten on those Fridays. The law of abstinence is obligatory for all who are 14 years and older.

Why? On Fridays during Lent, we particularly remember the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. In memory of this great sacrifice, we continue the tradition of penance and sacrifice – the abstaining from meat on Fridays is an outward manifestation of an interior reality: the conversion of our hearts.

<u>Diocesan wide Night of Confession:</u> Wednesday, March 8th, our parish and all of the parishes in the Diocese will offer "An Evening of Confession" from **5:00-8:00pm**. Parishioners are asked to evangelize by inviting family and friends who are away from the Church to join in this special Lenten practice. Priests at all parishes will be present for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Opportunities to celebrate the sacrament will be on:

Saturdays during Lent from 3:30-4:00pm Thursday, March 30th- 9:30am

Monday, April 3rd - 7:00pm

<u>Communal Reconciliation Service</u>: Gather as a community for a Prayer Service followed by the opportunity for Reconciliation with a variety of priests on hand. Sunday, 3/26 at 2:00 pm.

<u>Untold Blessing, Three Paths to Holiness</u>: Fridays following Stations of the Cross. God calls each of us to become a saint, and he's ready to support us along the way by providing abundant blessings. Join us as we seek these blessings by participating in Bishop Robert Barron's DVD-based program: "Untold Blessing: Three Paths to Holiness." The first path is "Finding the Center in Christ;" the second is "Knowing You Are a Sinner" and then the third, "Realizing Your Life is Not About You."

<u>Holy is His Name: The Transforming Power of God's Holiness in Scripture</u>, Scott Hahn Book Study. Sign Up to reserve your book and spot in a two-part Book Study and Conversation. Catholics are taught to prize *holiness* – to admire it in others and to strive for it in their own lives. But we're never quite told what holiness *is* .. Scott Hahn seeks to define the term in order to help us better understand our relationship with holiness. Register by 2/26 in the back of the Church or by calling the Parish Office. The Book Talks will take place, 3/29 and 5/3 at 7:00 pm.

**Sunday Gospel Reflection:** Saturday, March 11 at 10:00am in the hall. We will be looking at the gospels for the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Lent through Easter Sunday. After reading each gospel, time is spent sharing what stood out in the gospel for each individual. In doing this we become attentive to hear what message God has for us through his Word.


Men's Faith Sharing: Gather with us in fraternity to reflect on our faith on Sunday, 2/26 at 6:00 pm.

A Season of Deep and Everlasting Healing: These daily reflection booklets will be available at the doors of the church and in the parish office, along with booklets for children and one for families. These contain a Scripture passage and reflection for each day of Lent.

<u>Daily Lenten Video Reflections</u>: A short video each day reflecting on the daily Mass readings, explaining the Scriptures, and providing a concrete ideas on how to apply them to the Christian life. Sign up by going to FORMED button on the parish website.

<u>Lenten Resources</u>: The Diocese of Cleveland has a list of resources that can be used for personal growth during these 40 days of Lent. These can be found at *dioceseofcleveland.org* 

Operation Rice Bowl: As part of our faith community's Lenten observance, we will participate in Catholic Relief Services' Lenten program, CRS Rice Bowl is Catholic Relief Services' Lenten program for families and faith communities in the United States who want to put their faith into action. Through CRS Rice Bowl, participants are invited to hear stories about their sisters and brothers in need around the world and devote their Lenten prayers, fasting and alms to change the lives of those who suffer in poverty.
