

MISSION STATEMENT



FATHER JOHN'S CORNER:

Thank you to everyone who made all the events of last weekend flow smoothly and successfully. I know it was not easy. Due to the limited space, we usually try not to schedule large events on the same weekend. But then it is difficult to limit the activities when this is such an active parish. The Best Buddies Ball, Helping Hands Food Distribution and PSR were all back-to-back Friday through Sunday. You hear reports from Helping Hands as to the number of people they assist but what you do not see is the amount of space and people it takes to provide the needed assistance. I believe that Helping Hands is a priority because serving the needs of the poor is what it means to be a Catholic Christian. And so is education a priority, as well as providing activities that highlight social awareness. The proposed Parish Center, that would be connected to the church, would offer additional space for events and activities. The additional space is definitely needed now and will also offer us the ability to offer more programs and services.

Speaking of additional activities, please take note of two that are new to the calendar for May. On Thursday May 4th there will be a luncheon for anyone who would like to get together. In the past this was called a 'Senior' luncheon, but some people were turned off by such a label. It could be called the 'Retirees' luncheon, but again who really is retired when they leave the workforce? If you can come up with a name, please submit it. Until then, anyone who would like to come, please come.

On <u>Saturday</u>, <u>May 20</u> there is a Marriage Enrichment Date Night that we are hosting in collaboration with the Diocese of Cleveland. This evening is for those married or engaged and will be a relaxing and enriching boost to your relationship. We are hoping to offer more of these programs that are open to others in the diocese and especially our local area. This weekend is the last PSR class until September. I wish to thank Elizabeth Miketo, our Parish Catechetical Director and all the teachers and aides who assisted her. We had 116 students registered. This is in comparison with St. Joseph in Strongsville which is a much bigger parish that had 165, so we are doing an exceptional job in bringing in students to educate them in the faith. We are looking for additional teachers for the Fall. If you are interested or would like more information, please see Elizabeth or myself.

This **Wednesday, April 26 will be the Confirmation Mass at 7:00pm**. Everyone is invited to come participate in this Eucharist. What a great sign of support to our youth if members of the parish community were there to pray with them as they receive the gift of the Holy Spirit at Confirmation. Due to the small class size of 10 confirmandi, there will be plenty of room after family and friends are included.

Last year Bishop Malesic had delegated pastors who requested to celebrate the sacrament the ability to confirm. Therefore, I will, with the Bishop's delegation, confirm our youth on Wednesday. Now that the diocese has an auxiliary bishop, Bishop Woost, this delegation will not be given next year. Please pray for our youth and for myself as we prepare for the great Sacrament of Confirmation. And I hope to see you there!
