

MISSION STATEMENT



FATHER JOHN'S CORNER:

The capital campaign has been occupying much of our time during the past six months and even longer when you figure in the several months of preparation leading up to the start of the campaign. I wish to thank the campaign committee for their time and work, as well as the support of the Parish and Finance Councils. And I wish to thank everyone who made a pledge to the campaign. These are not easy times for anyone, and the pledges made are a sacrifice. I assure you that the proposed buildings will make a major difference as we continue to grow as a community and as we seek to maintain a strong, vibrant faith community for generations to come. We have not yet reached our goal but are continuing to see an increase each week in the total. If you have not yet made a pledge, I would ask you to prayerfully consider how you can be a part of this endeavor. Please feel free to contact me or any member of the campaign committee if you have any questions or concerns.

While we continue to seek our goal of the campaign the parish activities continue to happen, and additional events and ministries are constantly being added. With all that is happening in our parish we must be mindful of what is truly important, and that is the celebration of the Eucharist. It is the Eucharist which is the center of parish life, and it is the Eucharist that empowers us to serve and continue to grow as a faith community. Next weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. In days past, this was often referred to as Corpus Christi and it was common to see parishes have processions through the neighborhoods with the Blessed Sacrament. We will be modifying the Corpus Christi procession next Sunday when we will process from the church following the 11:00am Mass to the chapel where there will be adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until 3:00pm. This is similar to what we do on Holy Thursday at the conclusion of the Mass. Everyone will be invited to join the procession to the chapel at the conclusion of Mass next week. I would encourage that individually or as a family to spend some time during the afternoon before the Blessed Sacrament in prayer.

This weekend we will acknowledge all the children who have made their First Communion during the Easter Season at the 4:30pm Mass and acknowledging those who have graduated at the 11:00am Mass. Please keep these children and graduates in your prayers as they continue on their faith journey.

And if you are keeping track of time, **the parish festival is 2 months away on August 5th**. Plan now by inviting family and friends to join in an evening of food, fun and most of all, the outdoor Mass.


