

FATHER JOHN'S CORNER:

When I was a student at The Ohio State University I would go to Mass at the Neumann Center. It was staffed by the Paulist Fathers and being a college campus, they were all young priests. When the gospel that we hear this weekend of sight being restored to the blind man, Fr. Paul proclaimed the gospel from memory in a way that had me mesmerized. My eyes were opened to see my life and to see Jesus in a deeper, new way. It was the beginning of my finally responding to God's will rather than what I wanted to do with my life.

Who were the people who helped you to see your life in a new light? How were your eyes open to see things as you had not seen them before? It could have been a teacher, friend, spouse, priest or a stranger that you encountered. And how have you helped others to see things anew? To think that God has placed you in others lives to help them to see their life and to see Jesus in a deeper way. This week be attentive to those who challenge or support you to open your eyes and be prepared to bring enlightenment to someone you interact with.


This **Sunday, March 10 there will be a Communal Reconciliation Service at 2pm**. There will be additional priests present to hear confessions. The service provides a time to come together as a community and to acknowledge and repent of our sins and to receive God's merciful forgiveness. In this context we see that we are all sinners in need of forgiveness. And it highlights the need for the support and prayers of one another to overcome sin. The service will be a Liturgy of the Word where we will hear God's call to turn to him for mercy. Having prayed then an Act of Contrition together we will then go individually to a priest to confess and receive absolution and a penance. While everyone is going to confession, we pray for each other and then once everyone has gone, we conclude with a song of praise and thanksgiving.

Going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation holds us accountable for our sins. Often, I hear someone say they don't need to go to confession as they just tell God their sin without the sacrament. Which is good in that we should always be seeking God's forgiveness. But do we? Do we examine our conscience and ask for forgiveness, or do we fall into the routine and busyness of the day? Going to confession holds ourselves accountable and humbles ourselves that we are admitting that we have sinned. And most of all we receive the grace of the sacrament which helps us to overcome sin.

This Wednesday at 7pm, following 6:30 Mass, in the Gathering Area will be the first of a two-part video on St. Ignatius of Loyola. Ignatius founded the Society of Jesus, or commonly called the Jesuits. As a soldier he was very passionate, which after his conversion was directed to serve Christ. His great masterpiece, *The Spiritual Exercises*, is still very popular in the spiritual life. They are used in retreat experiences as well as in daily living.

There are not many days of Lent remaining. Take advantage of the remaining opportunities for prayer and confession and start planning how you will be spending Holy Week. May we keep each other in prayer as we make this final push toward Easter to make our Easter celebration a true renewal of our life.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE:

Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence which means one large meal and two smaller meals as well as abstaining from meat. The law of fasting is for those 18-60 years old.

The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence which means no meat is to be eaten on those Fridays. The law of abstinence is obligatory for all who are 14 years and older.

Why? On Fridays during Lent, we particularly remember the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. In memory of this great sacrifice, we continue the tradition of penance and sacrifice – the abstaining from meat on Fridays is an outward manifestation of an interior reality: the conversion of our hearts.


