

IN MEMORIAM

Brother Knight, Clifford Richard Jenke, 92, of Spring, Texas was born in Houston, Texas on February 26, 1927 to the late Sam and Jennie (Guerrero) Alvarado. He passed from this life on July 31, 2019. Clifford was a loving father, brother, uncle, and friend. He proudly served his country in the United States Navy from 1942 to 1954 which included facing combat in WWII and the Korean War. Clifford was an outgoing and friendly man who never met a stranger. He was proud to earn his black belt at the age of 55 and continued to stay active for as long as his body would allow.
