Heavenly Gifts of Christ

It is described as the spotless spouse of the spotless Lamb, (43) whom Christ "loved and for whom He delivered Himself up that He might sanctify her", (44) whom He unites to Himself by an unbreakable covenant, and whom He unceasingly "nourishes and cherishes", (45) and whom, once purified, He willed to be cleansed and joined to Himself, subject to Him in love and fidelity, (46) and whom, finally, He filled with heavenly gifts for all eternity, in order that we may know the love of God and of Christ for us, a love which surpasses all knowledge. (DOGMATIC CONSTITUTION ON THE CHURCH; Lumen Gentium; Chapter 1; number 6; paragraph 6;)

As we enter into the season of Lent, it would be prudent of us to begin reflection on the heavenly gifts given to us by the Lord before and during his time here among us. A reflection that should include the thought of what would we be willing to give up for the sake of the divine will of the Lord to please Him.

It is the divine will of the Lord which nourishes each of us daily with the spirit of love, patience, understanding and forgiveness. We should reflect on these gifts and the other given to us by the Lord during this time of penance. Reflect on the many gifts given to us by the Lord in our personal lives and the many times we have squandered those gifts because of our selfishness.

We should spend this time of the Liturgical Season of Lent with a heavy and burdened heart because of the need we should all have for the divine forgiveness of the Lord because of our many sins and the many times we have been disobedient. Disobedient due to the fact that we would rather satisfy our own will rather than bend our knee to the divine will of the Lord.

It was disobedience by Adam and Eve that brought down the love the Lord shared with them. We should reflect on the generosity given to us by the Lord. We should reflect daily on the gifts the Lord has placed in our lives so that we might bring others to him because of this generosity. We should reflect on the many times we have wasted the precious gift of time the Lord bestows on us daily.

How many times we have wasted this precious gift of time with idle thoughts, thoughts of ill-will, greed, selfishness and the like. We should use this time of reflection to learn the language of the Lord so that when we hear his voice, we understand clearly what is being asked of us. In case we did not know, the Lord speaks a different language than we do. This is why in all four of the gospels the Lord speaks in parables to deliver His divine message to us.

The language of the Lord can only be understood by those who are willing to reflect, be obedient, and listen for the voice of the Lord. Reflecting on the unbreakable love the Lord has for us should make us want to open our hearts and mind to him so that love can be poured into us and over us like a waterfall of spiritual energy. We should allow that spiritual energy to drown us with spiritual contentment, peace of heart and peace of mind, and satisfaction in doing the work of the Lord. Think about how wonderful and fulfilling our lives would feel if we gave ourselves to the Lord in this way? We should allow our hearts and minds to freefall into the divine love of the Lord each day it is offered to us.

Think of it, the Lord offers us his love freely each day we open our eyes and take a breath of His air. A love that is pure, free of any type of toxins associated with this world. Reflect on the unbreakable love of the Lord for us as we enter the Lenten Season. Give as much of yourself to the Lord during this time of penance so he might heal the scars that have overtaken our hearts and our minds. Reflect on what we could do better with the time given to us by the Lord to glorify His holy name. A name that brings joy, peace and stability to each of our lives when we open our hearts to it.


