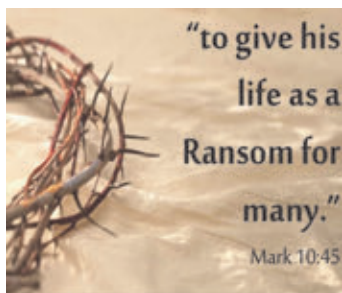
Pre-Cana Class:

SUNDAY MASS READINGS

29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading (Isaiah 53:10-11)

The Lord was pleased to crush him in infirmity.

If he gives his life as an offering for sin, he shall see his descendants in a long life, and the will of the Lord shall be accomplished through him.

Because of his affliction, he shall see the light in fullness of days; through his suffering, my servant shall justify many, and their guilt he shall bear.

Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 33:4-5, 18-20, 22)

**Lord, let Your mercy be on us,
as we place our trust in You.**

Second Reading (Hebrews 4:14-16)

Brothers and sisters:

Since we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin. So let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help.

Gospel (Mark 10:35-45)

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Jesus and said to Him, "Teacher, we want You to do for us whatever we ask of You." He replied, "What do you wish Me to do for you?" They answered Him, "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left." Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" They said to Him, "We can." Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink, you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at My right or at My left is not mine to give, but is for those for whom it has been prepared."

When the ten heard this, they became indignant at James and John. Jesus summoned them and said to them, "You know that those who are recognized as rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones make their authority over them felt. But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many."

This year, World Mission Sunday celebrates the Pontifical Mission Societies' 110th Anniversary of service to the Missions. With the prayers and support of the faithful in Philadelphia, the Societies have helped provide for the needs of Missionaries worldwide for 110 years. The international theme for World Mission Sunday this year is, "Proclaim it with Joy ... We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard." This Mission has always been the hallmark of the Church, for "She exists to evangelize."

Archbishop Pérez invites everyone to pray for missionaries around the world next weekend and provide help as means allow. Monetary gifts will support priests, consecrated religious and lay pastoral leaders in 1,111 Mission Dioceses around the globe as they proclaim the Gospel, build up the Church and serve the poor.
