



He is Risen!

What a glorious truth of our faith indeed! But on what basis do we believe? Or do we believe? Do we really believe? During these next few weeks we will hear several eyewitness accounts who saw Jesus after His death but there are no such reports here on Easter Sunday. In today's Gospel. Mary Magdalen did not see Jesus and it never entered her mind that He rose from the dead. She saw an empty tomb. Peter saw exactly the same thing and a resurrection did not occur to him either. John, however, witnessed the very same scene as did Peter and Mary but he saw and "believed" that Iesus was alive. Why? Because he saw two neatly placed burial cloths. His faith told him that if thieves had stolen Jesus' body, they would not have gone through the trouble of tearing the cloths, which would have adhered to the body because of the burial oils, and neatly folded them. And, undoubtedly, the cloths would have had to have been ripped into many pieces and could not have remained in two singular pieces. We can believe in Jesus' Resurrection today because in the midst of the "messiness" of our regular ordinary lives Jesus leaves signs, i.e. his neatly folded burial cloths, everywhere and primarily in the love and goodness that we receive from others. For us though, we need to believe so that we can see. I actually believe that is how it happened with John as well. I think that it is because he believed already that He "saw" that Jesus was alive even though he did not see Jesus in the flesh. Once we believe that Jesus is alive we can truly rejoice and strive through our joy and holiness of life to allow others to believe. But there is more to it than that. This is not the ending, this is only the beginning. There is no 'happily ever after" because this is not a fairy tale. And thank God it isn't. "Happily-ever-afters" are so very boring, and if there is one thing Jesus is not. He is not boring. After His resurrection. He doesn't just live happily ever after, He reigns over heaven and earth. He judges us based on our lives on earth. So, the good news is that because Jesus conquers death we will all live eternally. But it is also true that we will face a judgment. Truly, it might have been easier for Lazarus to have remained in the tomb. Sometimes the thought of a judgment which has eternal implications is pretty scary to me. Because I just know I wouldn't make the grade of my own accord. And I hate to tell you this but I don't know if any of you would make the grade either. But, don't fret, there is more good news. In the First Reading, St. Peter says this: "everyone who believes in Him will receive forgiveness of sins through His name." This means that those who believe in Him will be judged by God the Father in Jesus Christ. So, because Jesus is alive, we have eternal life, and He becomes our judge. That's why we're all here today, folks. So the question is: do we believe and live as we believe or do we take a chance at being judged, not in Iesus Christ, but on our own merits? I know where I stand on that one, I can tell you that! Remember, He is Risen and He reigns! Alleluia!

PARISH POLICIES & PRACTICES FOR RECEPTION OF THE SACRAMENTS

Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month at 1:30 PM in the Upper Church. Please make arrangements with the staff at the Rectory at least one month prior to the Baptism.

Pre-Jordan Program

After meeting with staff and prior to their child's Baptism, parents are required (Godparents are strongly encouraged) to attend this Session, held in the Rectory on the first Wednesday of each month at 7 PM.

Requirements for Godparents

- 1. A Godparent cannot be the mother or father of the one to be baptized.
- 2. A Godparent must be at least 16 years old, a Catholic who has received the Holy Eucharist and has been confirmed. If married, he/she must be validly married in the Church and must not be cohabitating.
- 3. Although one Godparent is required, there can be two Godparents: a man and a woman.
- 4. Non-Christians cannot be Godparents, but a non-Catholic Christian can serve as a Christian Witness to the Baptism.

Becoming A Godparent or Sponsor? You Will Need a Letter of Eligibility

A letter from your parish is required to become a Godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation. This letter indicates you are a practicing Catholic in good standing. It is therefore necessary to be a registered member of the Parish in order to establish eligibility. All Godparents and Sponsors, even if they are from Maternity B.V.M. Church, must present a letter of eligibility issued by their parish.

Holy Eucharist/Reconciliation

Children of the Parish, including those enrolled in the third grade of the Parish School, PREP (Parish Religious Education Program) and Private Catholic Academies, receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation (usually in the Fall) and First Eucharist (Spring) of each year. Children in Private Catholic Academies should contact the Parish School. Prior to receiving a sacrament, children in PREP must be in the program at least two years or come from a Catholic School or another PREP.

Confirmation

Children of the Parish, including those enrolled in the seventh/eighth grade of the Parish School and PREP, are invited to participate in a program of preparation 090 Maternity BVM

for receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. Prior to receiving the Sacrament, children in PREP must be in the program for at least two years or come from a Catholic School or another PREP. Parents of students from Private Catholic Academies and students in Grades 7 through 12 who have not as yet been confirmed, please contact the Parish School. Adults wishing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation must be involved in the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) Program and are asked to please contact the Rectory.

Sponsors for Confirmation

Qualifications to be a Sponsor at Confirmation and to receive a Letter of Eligibility are the same as those of a Catholic Godparent at Baptism (see section under Baptism). Candidates for Confirmation choose a Sponsor other than a Parent.

Matrimony

Couples planning to marry in Maternity B.V.M. Church should notify one of the Parish Priests as early as possible, and no less than six months prior to the desired wedding date, so that appropriate assistance in marriage preparation may be provided. Please be sure to arrange a wedding date and time with the priest before making any commitment for your Reception. Visiting priests are welcome to officiate, but you must still contact one of the Parish Priests to officially set the parish date.

Pre-Cana Instructions

Each couple is required to attend a Pre-Cana Program of Marriage Preparation. Our Parish offers an annual Pre-Cana Session. Registration forms can be obtained at the Rectory. Our next scheduled Pre-Cana Session will be held on February 28.

Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament is given to seriously ill Catholics by calling the Rectory and arranging for this by appointment or whenever there is an emergency. Parishioners scheduled to undergo surgery should contact one of the priests so that they may be anointed before their medical procedure. This can also be done at Church when you come to Mass.

Holy Orders

Those who think they may have a calling to the Priesthood can contact one of the Parish Priests in order to discuss this matter and receive appropriate direction for pursuing such a calling. They may also call directly to St. Charles Borromeo Seminary, Wynnewood, PA.
