

Vanity of Vanities

In today's first reading rom Ecclesiastes, we hear that the pursuit of worldly riches is vanity because in the end we have to let them all go. We can spend our whole lives acquiring things, but at the end of our lives everything for which we have worked so hard goes to another who hasn't worked for it. This Old Testament reading sets us up for the Gospel reading from Luke, which begins when a man comes to Jesus complaining that his brother hasn't divided the inheritance equally with him.

Jesus gives us the divine perspective on wealth by telling the story of a wealthy man who has a crop so big it doesn't fit into his barns. His solution is to tear everything down and build bigger barns so he can store up this great abundance of wealth. But God comes to the rich man and tells him that he will die that very night and not be able to enjoy this wealth that he has stored up for himself. Jesus



ends the story by telling his listeners that this is how it will be for everyone who stores up treasures for himself rather than being rich in what matters to God.

The message here is an emphasis on what really lasts. Acquiring wealth is vanity if we acquire it just for ourselves since nothing we build or save up in this world will last forever. But Jesus tells us that there are things we can do in this life that will have eternal significance. If the man in the Gospel reading had distributed his extra wealth to the needy, he would have had treasure in heaven. So Jesus is asking us whether, in our saving and our success, we are focusing on earthly success or investing in that which will have an eternal reward.

Father, please help us to store up treasures in heaven and seek what is above.

Help us to share generously what we have, guard us from all greed, and help us to always remember that life is more than possessions. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son. Amen.

Blessed Among Us: **Blessed Karl Leisner** (1915-1945)

The Path to priesthood for Karl Leisner was both ordinary and extraordinary, marked by the common struggles of discernment and the unprecedented violence of World War II. It culminated in an unlikely event - a secret ordination inside Dachau concentration camp in 1944.

Leisner had grown up in western Germany, one of five children in a close-knit family. As a teenager, he organized a youth group that combined prayer and study with hiking, biking and camping. A retreat as the Marian shrine of Schonstatt in 1933 had a profound effect on him, and the next year he began to prepare for the priesthood in Munster.

His leadership impressed Bishop (now Blessed) Clemens von Galen, who entrusted hm with diocesan youth activities. However, Leisner wrestled with his vocation, feeling both called

to the priesthood and a deep attraction to family life. Another visit to Schonstatt brought clarity, and he was ordained a transitional deacon March 25, 1939.

A short while later, Deacon Leisner was diagnosed with tuberculosis and sent to a sanatorium. Another patient there reported him for speaking against Hitler, leading tohis arrest in 1940. Sent to the priest block at Dachau, he was known for comforting and encouraging fellow prisoners even as his illness worsened.

When Bishop Gabriel Piguet arrived at the camp from France in 1944, an intriguing possibility arose: Could Deacon Leisner finally be ordained a priest? After ecclesial permission and the necessary holy oils were smuggled in, the clandestine ordination took place Dec. 17, 1944. Utterly debilitated, Father Leisner celebrat4ed his first and only Mass on Dec. 26th. Several months after liberation, he died Aug. 12, 1945. His last diary entry read: "Love - charity - atonement. O God, bless my enemies!" Father Karl Leisner was beatified in 1996.


