MESSAGE FROM THE DEACON

Today's gospel continues the theme preparedness. Today we focus on preparing ourselves to receive the good news of Jesus. Does it seem odd that we have to prepare ourselves to receive something that we already know about? Each year, we have the Advent season as a way of getting ready for the cosmic change of God entering our world. This coming is not meant to be a one size fits everyone type of event. Each one of us has a very unique set of circumstances that filters our experiences.

Throughout our lives, our filters change. Using the obvious example, the COVID virus has had an impact on everyone for the past two years. Many were thankful that the virus did not have an adverse effect on their lives, while others prayed that their life would become normal soon, and everyone wondered whether or not they would be able to get together to celebrate Christmas with family and friends. As the saying goes, "the only thing constant is change." Today, it is good to reflect on what events in our lives will influence our experience of Christ coming, Christ coming again.

Speaking of change, an interesting thing about the gospel reading is that Luke begins by acknowledging the political and religious leaders of the time, which are normally a source of stability in a society. And yet, the word of God comes to John in the desert. Imagine that, the announcement of the coming reign of God comes from a guy who eats locusts and honey, wears animal skins, and lives in the desert. By no means is this the proper respected messenger we would expect. But nothing about Christ's coming is going to be as expected.

John's message about preparing is simply to get right with God. Repent of our sins, remove as many of the day-to-day distractions that impede God being able to speak to us personally, and do the things we need to do to make our hearts more open to the good news that once again Christ is coming into our world to save us for eternal life.
