MESSAGE FROM THE DEACON

Today's gospel is referred to as the "Road to Emmaus". During my diaconate formation, Father Gabriel Maison gave us a very good teaching on his understanding of this reading. He explained two important points that express the nature of the Church. First, all Christians are on the way or on the path to eternal life where Jesus encounters us. Secondly, Jesus always makes himself known in the Eucharist.

Jesus encounters two of his disciples on the road to Emmaus. Since they were going away from Jerusalem, many interpret this to mean that they were going the wrong way. An interesting thing to note also in this story is that the disciples were talking about the details of Jesus' death and resurrection but did not believe it actually happened. They couldn't see the forest for the trees! And Jesus actually challenges them on it by telling them, "Oh, how foolish you are!"

As the disciples and Jesus are walking along, Jesus opens the scripture to them. He tells them how everything in the Old Testament applies to him. And while they are enlightened by the revelation, they still don't recognize that it was risen Lord that is speaking to them. They only recognize Jesus when he breaks the bread. And once they do, they immediately go back to Jerusalem to tell their cohorts of what has happened!

Notice the movement of the Mass in this encounter. We all enter into Church on our own path or spiritual journey. The Liturgy of the Word is proclaimed to us so that we can get to know and understand the person of Jesus better. But then there is the Liturgy of the Eucharist where Jesus reveals himself to us, to move us to mission and to proclaim the good news! We can be foolish as well. We are quick to believe so much stuff we read, especially on the internet (of all places), and yet, when it comes to what the Church tells us, we are just sometimes foolish when we don't believe or want to believe.

God is good all of the time and all of time God is good! In Christ, Deacon Tim
