### MASS INTENTIONS (\$10.00 stipend)

Q: The priest simultaneously said a Mass intention for the intention for which I gave a stipend and an intention for vocations. Is this allowed?

A: This is allowed. He may celebrate a regularly scheduled parish Mass for which a parishioner has provided an intention (and a stipend), but at the same time he may perhaps have in mind the intention of his elderly mother. In fact, he may have as many intentions as he likes while offering a Mass, so long as he has accepted a stipend for no more than one of them. While on the surface this may seem illogical, keep in mind that the spiritual value of a single Mass is infinite. The intention for which a stipend was offered is not somehow giving short-shrift if the celebrant offers that same Mass for other intentions as well.

As a rule, a priest may only offer one Mass per day, although there are occasions when he may be permitted to offer more than one Mass in a single day ([canon 905.1](#)). (This is why, when St. Frederic has a funeral scheduled, daily Mass is cancelled for the day. Anyone who wants to go to Mass that day is able to attend the funeral.) On Sundays and Holy Days, for example, a priest may celebrate as many as three Masses in one day (and possibly more in areas with a shortage of priests).

**From July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019 the weekly need is \$3,977.00. This does not include Religious Education, Youth Ministry personnel, which could account for \$16,000 or more, nor does it include the Capital Campaign. ### Divine Worship

Dear Parishioners,

Continuing from Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook Chapter 1C states:

#### Movement and Posture

Section 1.11.1: "The gestures and posture of the priest, the deacon, and the ministers, as well as those of the people, ought to contribute to making the entire celebration resplendent with beauty and noble simplicity, so that the true and full meaning of the different parts, rites and prayers of the celebration is evident and that the participation of all is fostered. Therefore, attention should be paid to what is determined by liturgical norms and the traditional practice of the Roman Rite and to what serves the common spiritual good of the People of God, rather than private inclination or arbitrary choice. A common posture, to be observed by all participants, is a sign of the unity of the members of the Christian community gathered for the Sacred Liturgy. It both expresses and fosters the intention and spiritual attitude of the participants."<sup>38</sup>

Section 1.11.2: "In the dioceses of the United States of America, the faithful should kneel beginning after the singing or recitation of the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy) until after the Amen of the Eucharistic Prayer. Exceptions may be when one is prevented on occasion by reasons of ill health, or for reasons of lack of space, of the large number of people present, or for another reasonable cause. However, those who do not kneel ought to make a profound bow when the priest genuflects after the Consecration. In the Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon, it is determined that the faithful kneel after the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God)."<sup>39</sup>
