Pentecost Sunday

Acts 2:1–11

Psalm 104:1, 24, 29–31, 34

1 Corinthians 12:3–7, 12–13

John 20:19–23

The giving of the Spirit to the new people of God crowns the mighty acts of the Father in salvation history.

The Jewish feast of Pentecost called all devout Jews to Jerusalem to celebrate their birth as God's chosen people, in the covenant Law given to Moses at Sinai (see Leviticus 23:15–21; Deuteronomy 16:9–11).

In today's First Reading the mysteries prefigured in that feast are fulfilled in the pouring out of the Spirit on Mary and the Apostles (see Acts 1:14).

The Spirit seals the new law and new covenant brought by Jesus, written not on stone tablets but on the hearts of believers, as the prophets promised (see 2 Corinthians 3:2–8; Romans 8:2).

The Spirit is revealed as the life-giving breath of the Father, the Wisdom by which He made all things, as we sing in today's Psalm. In the beginning, the Spirit came as a "mighty wind" sweeping over the face of the earth (see Genesis 1:2). And in the new creation of Pentecost, the Spirit again comes as "a strong, driving wind" to renew the face of the earth.

As God fashioned the first man out of dust and filled him with His Spirit (see Genesis 2:7), in today's Gospel we see the New Adam become a life-giving Spirit, breathing new life into the Apostles (see 1 Corinthians 15:45, 47).

Like a river of living water, for all ages He will pour out His Spirit on His body, the Church, as we hear in today's Epistle (see also John 7:37–39).

We receive that Spirit in the sacraments, being made a "new creation" in Baptism (see 2 Corinthians 5:17; Galatians 6:15). Drinking of the one Spirit in the Eucharist (see 1 Corinthians 10:4), we are the first fruits of a new humanity—fashioned from out of every nation under heaven, with no distinctions of wealth or language or race, a people born of the Spirit

Dear Parishioners,

The Lord is truly Risen, Alleluia!

Masses at St Frederic began on Saturday, May 16 with 25 people or less. The staff called every parishioner we had a phone number for. If you know of someone who would like to attend Mass, please have him/her call the office or sign up on the website.

Thank you to all those who have attended Mass this past few weeks! Your patience while we continue to call people for a scheduled Mass is appreciated. We are working to come up with a schedule where most people have a set time to attend Mass on a weekly basis. But this may change as more people start attending Mass. Unless you have been told that you can attend Mass on a weekly basis, you should receive a call before attending.

As a reminder, please be conscious to practice physical distancing from other people who are not part of your household, including entering and exiting. Even though we've instituted strict safety measures such as sanitizing all touch points after each Mass and removing books and materials from the pews, **there is nothing we can do to completely eliminate all risk**. If you do not feel comfortable attending Mass, you should not attend. We know that may be difficult, as so many of you yearn for the Eucharist and social interactions with our parish family. Archbishop Sample is continuing with the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. This not only releases you from any requirement, but also means that attending Mass any day of the week is equally beneficial. Any opportunity that you have to receive the Eucharist should be counted as a great blessing.

As a reminder, the office is required to keep a list of people who have attended for contact tracing purposes. We will not give out that information unless required by law, but if you are uncomfortable with this, we understand. You should not feel guilty about staying away from Mass.

Finally, there is one last way you could help us: please put your kneeler down when leaving church to help us know which areas need to be cleaned.
