SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD: MATTHEW 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet:

And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;

since from you shall come a ruler,

who is to shepherd my people Israel."

Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

ADULTS: What insights about your own faith have you gained from learning about other faith traditions?

CHILDREN: What could you do to be like a star and lead someone to know about Jesus?

The Epiphany of the Lord

Epiphany means manifestation. What the Church celebrates today is the manifestation of our Lord to the whole world; after being made known to the shepherds of Bethlehem He is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East to adore Him. Christian tradition has ever seen in the Magi the first fruits of the Gentiles; they lead in their wake all the peoples



of the earth, and thus the Epiphany is an affirmation of universal salvation. St. Leo brings out this point admirably in a sermon, read at Matins, in which he shows in the adoration of the Magi the beginnings of Christian faith, the time when the great mass of the heathen sets off to follow the star which summons it to seek its Savior.

Stewardship of Mind: Resolve to keep your mind active. Commit to being more informed on the issues of the day. Read your Bible/daily readings. In our political system in the United States, become even more familiar with Catholic social teaching.

Dear Brothers and Sisters, January 1st is the Solemnity of Mary, the holy mother of God, who is also our spiritual mother. In the Gospel, this weekend the shepherds arrive in Bethlehem after being told by an angel that a Savior has been born. The Church today honors the Blessed Virgin Mary, who was chosen by God the Father to be the mother of His Son. As Jesus was both fully human and divine, the Church confesses that Mary is truly "Mother of God" (CCC 495). As a woman of faith, Mary remained close to God. She was a woman of Prayer. It is hard for people to realize that their faith life and their relationship with God depends as much on prayer as it does on discernment, study, or counseling. Luke's gospel opens with the prayer of Zechariah and Mary and closes with that of the apostles. So often we turn to God only after every other resource has been exhausted. Our time spent in prayerful reflection is seldom extended and often shortened. If Mary, who is today celebrated as the mother of God, grew in her understanding of what that means through prayer, we who strive to find meaning in our lives can do no better. Prayer is not saying a lot. Prayer is being with, being present to the God who loves us. May you all have a blessed New Year. God bless.

The Epiphany of the Lord: Today we hear Saint Paul proclaim that he exercises stewardship of "God's grace" for the benefit of the Christian community. Earlier in this letter to the Ephesians, he prayed they would come to realize the actual value of "these riches" of God's grace they inherited. This letter was written to remind, encourage, and spiritually motivate this Eucharistic community to appreciate just how immeasurably wealthy they had become to inherit a life in Christ. What value do we place on our life in Christ? If someone asked us to put a price on this life in today's currency, how would we respond? \$100 million? \$100 billion? Priceless? Do we live as though our life in Christ is priceless?
