## SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: MATTHEW 5:38-48

Jesus said to his disciples: "You have heard that it was said,

An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.

But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil. When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand over your cloak as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go for two miles. Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow.

"You have heard that it was said,

You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.

But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect."

ADULTS: What is the point of "turning the other cheek" in an argument, and why is it so hard to do?

*CHILDREN*: When have you or someone you know insisted on "having the last word" in an argument: What happened afterwards?

# **February – From Feast to Fast:**

Though the shortest month of the year, February is rich in Liturgical activity. It contains a feast (Presentation of our Lord) that bridges two other seasons (Christmas and Easter)! In addition, the faithful may receive in February two of the four major public sacramentals that the Church confers during the liturgical year: blessed candles and the blessing of throats.

The Solemnity of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd harkens back to the Christmas mystery of Light except that now, Christ, the helpless babe, is "the Light of Revelation to the Gentiles who will save his people from their sins." Candles, symbolizing Christ our Light, will be carried in procession this day, as will be the Paschal candle during the Easter Vigil Liturgy.

"The Light of Revelation" shines more brightly with each successive Sunday of Ordinary Time, until its magnificence – exposing our sinfulness and need for conversion – propels us into the penitential Season of Lent. We prepare to accept the cross of blessed ashes on Ash Wednesday (February 26) and plunge ourselves into anticipating the major exercises of Lent – fasting, prayer, almsgiving – laying our thoughts and prayers on the heart of our Mother Mary. She, who offered her Son in the temple and on the Cross, will teach us how to deny ourselves, take up our cross daily, and follow after her Son.

## Lenten Disciplines to be our goals!

We, who want freedom to live a deeper spiritual life, must remember that freedom only comes if we are willing to pay the price of learning to discipline ourselves. Fasting, abstinence, prayer and other practices that we might wish to adopt for our Lenten observance can help us to achieve our spiritual goal—freedom in Christ.

Ash Wednesday-"<u>Dust thou art, and into dust thou shalt</u> <u>return</u>". (Gn. 3:19) "<u>Rend your hearts, not your garments, and</u> <u>return to the Lord, your God"</u>. (Joel 2:13) The month of February gives us an opportunity to evaluate our love for God, others and oneself, with an invitation through Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday, a day of prayer and fasting, marks the beginning of Lent. The 40 days of Lent is dedicated to prayer, fasting, and reflection, in preparation for the celebration of Christ's Paschal Mystery. It is a time to re-focus and to re-enter the place of truth. It is where we find our true identity.

In our present liturgy for Ash Wednesday, we use ashes made from the burned palm branches distributed on the Palm Sunday of the previous year. The priest blesses the ashes and imposes them on the foreheads of the faithful, making the sign of the cross and saying, "**Remember, man you are dust and to dust you shall return**," or "**Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel**."

As we begin this holy season of Lent in preparation for Easter, we must remember the significance of the ashes we have received: We mourn and do penance for our sins. We again convert our hearts to the Lord, who suffered, died, and rose, for our salvation. We renew the promises made at our baptism, when we died to an old life and rose to a new life with Christ. Finally, mindful that the kingdom of this world passes away, we strive to live the kingdom of God now and look forward to its fulfillment in heaven. Wishing you all fruitful holy season of Lent and special prayers for holy Lent. God bless. Fr. Bose Jujuvarapu.
