Footprints.....One night a man dreamed he was walking along a beach with The Lord.

As scenes from his life flashed before him,

he looked at the path of footprints

and noticed that during the saddest times of his life,

there was only one set of footprints in the sand. Troubled, he asked,

"Lord, why did you leave me when I needed you the most?"

The Lord replied, "During your times of trial, when you see only one set of footprints, it was then that I carried you."



The book of the Acts of the Apostles is also known as the ‘**book of the Holy Spirit.**’ A closer look at the book will reveal to us that it is the Holy Spirit who was the prime mover of all the incidents, the Apostles and people we see there. One of the very important things that the Holy Spirit did to the apostles and other disciples was to bring them out of their *limiting boundaries* a little by little. We see in the gospels that when Jesus died, he practically did not have any follower outside the Palestine. Though some non-Jews were the beneficiaries of the miracles of Jesus, in the gospels we see that only a few Jews followed him. After the death of Jesus, Christianity was just a small sect of Judaism. This boundary was partly broken on the day of the **Pentecost.** The message about Jesus reached many more people who had come from different parts of the world. We see that Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs (Acts 2: 9-11) were anointed by the Holy Spirit.

In the gospel, we see Jesus pointing out that the Holy Spirit, the Father sends is also the Spirit of truth. Jesus says, “I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. This is the Spirit of truth.” Now it is important for us to understand that if we want to be in touch with the Holy Spirit, it is important that we constantly endeavor to break all types of boundaries, we have created for ourselves. Without breaking our limiting boundaries, we cannot be faithful to the gospel of Jesus too.

Whatever boundaries which prevent us from finding and experiencing the truth, the Holy Spirit is ready to reveal. Every boundary is a limitation. Every limitation is bondage. As long as there is bondage in our lives, we cannot enjoy freedom and happiness. So it is important that we die to all these human elements so that we are born to the Spirit. **Fr. Bose Jjuvarapu Prayer of John Henry Newman:**

*Dear Jesus, help me to spread your fragrance everywhere I go; Flood my soul with your spirit and life; Penetrate and possess my whole being so completely that all my life may be only a radiance of yours; Shine through me and be so in me that everyone with whom I come into contact may feel your presence within me. Let them look up and see no longer me—but only you, Amen*

## SAFETY PRACTICES and PROTOCOLS FOR OUR PARISHES

### WELCOME BACK BUT WITH GREAT CARE!

My Dear Parish Family,

With Praise on our lips and Thanksgiving in our hearts, we are very happy to inform you that Our Bishop has announced that all the Parishes are to return to Public Masses with the distribution of Communion. The coming few weekend Masses will be different from our “normal” weekend Masses, as we are making sure to follow the guidelines from the State and the Diocese to ensure the safety of everyone who attends the Masses. Please follow these safety steps:

- **Sacred Heart and St. Mary of the Assumption** has resumed regular scheduled masses and confessions.
- In all charity to others, we ask that, if you are not well or are sick, **please stay home** and continue to join us virtually through the live-streaming of the Mass. Your Sunday obligation remains suspended throughout this pandemic.
- **A Mask or face covering MUST be worn by all in attendance.** If you are not comfortable being inside the church for Mass, if you are late to Mass, or if we run out of room in the main church (estimated capacity for Sacred Heart - 65), there will be an overflow space in Mosler hall that you can use or you can remain in your vehicles and participate in the live stream Mass. Communion will be distributed in the hall during Mass and if you drive up. Ushers will escort the Extra-ordinary Eucharistic Ministers and give proper instructions or signals for communion in the hall or by drive up. So please listen and follow them.
- Our pews will be properly sanitized before and after each Mass. Hand sanitizers will be available at each entrance so please use them when you enter and exit the church. Each pew will be marked and spaced for social distancing. Family members can sit together, but individuals **MUST** maintain the 6-foot social distance rule. **Each person is required to wear a face covering or mask when entering the church and throughout the Mass.**
- Please be mindful that **NO** holding hands at the “Our Father” prayer and we encourage folded hands in reverence. The Sign of Peace is suspended.
- There will be no usual lining up at communion time. Ushers will slowly direct each pew to receive the Eucharist so please be patient and follow proper instructions.
- Out of Charity for your neighbor, we will be only receiving the Eucharistic in your hand.
- There will be no passing of the basket at the offertory. Instead, there will be a box basket at the back of the church for your stewardship offerings.
- Please do not rush out of church at the end of Mass and create unnecessary congestion. Ushers will slowly dismiss the congregation – row by row, from the back up to the front – when Mass is finished. So, please be patient and follow their instructions.
- We ask for your understanding as we put into practice these proper protocols for the safety of all. Please be mindful to follow instruction as to slowly enter and exit the church properly as to keep proper social distance in between each individual or family unit.
- We suggest that Mosler hall be reserved for the elderly and the over flow, as we do our best to keep all protected.
- Confessions will take place in the church in the old chapel with a screen. Individuals **MUST** maintain the 6-foot social distance rule. **Your mask must be worn when you go to confession.** Confessions will be daily after the 12:10 noon Masses, Wednesday’s from 6:30 – 7:30 p.m. ; Saturday’s at 5:00 – 5:45 p.m. or by appointment.
- We have removed all the hymnals from the pews in the Church and will use the big screen for hymns, prayers, and readings.
- All of the Holy Water fonts will remain empty.
- **PLEASE REMEMBER:** When we receive the Eucharist under the species of bread alone, we are in fact receiving the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus, as the Church has always taught.
- The Masses will continue to be live streamed on our Sacred Heart’s page for those who are unwell, sick, or have a compromised immune system. **Both Saturday’s 6:00 p.m. Vigil Mass and Sunday’s 10:00 a.m. Mass will be live-streamed. Saturday’s Vigil Mass will also be broadcast live on KSEY at 6 p.m., not Sunday’s for the future weekends.**

Thank you for your cooperation. Please continue to pray for the health and protection of each of us from the spread of this virus. We will keep you informed of any other changes or adaptations that will be made.
