On that day, as evening drew on, Jesus said to his disciples: "Let us cross to the other side." Leaving the crowd, they took Jesus with them in the boat just as he was. And other boats were with him. A violent squall came up and waves were breaking over the boat, so that it was already filling up. Jesus was in the stern, asleep on a cushion. They woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!" The wind ceased and there was great calm. Then he asked them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" They were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?"

June 24th, 2016 - In the breviary St. Augustine explains the reason for The Nativity of St.

John the Baptist: "Apart from the most holy solemnity commemorating our Savior's birth, the Church keeps the birthday of no other person except that of John the Baptist. (The feasts of the Immaculate Conception and of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin had not yet been introduced.) In the case of other saints or of God's chosen ones, the Church, as you know, solemnizes the day on which they were reborn to everlasting beatitude after ending the trials of this life and gloriously triumphing over the world.

"For all these the final day of their lives, the day on which they completed their earthly service is honored. But for John the day of his birth, the day on which he began this mortal life is likewise sacred. The reason for this is, of course, that the Lord willed to announce to men His own coming through the Baptist, lest if He appeared suddenly, they would fail to recognize Him. John represented the Old Covenant and the Law. Therefore he preceded the Redeemer, even as the Law preceded and heralded the new dispensation of grace."

Today's all three readings draw the readers' attention towards the realization of the unseen hands of God in the daily happenings of our lives. (Job 38:1, 8-11) Job was challenged by God to admit that it's the Lord who gives and that it's the Lord who takes away. If we accept happiness from His hands, should not we accept sadness? He realized his limitation and powerlessness as being a mere mortal. The God who is beyond human comprehension has manifested his image and supremacy through his created world. This sovereignty of God is further emphasized through the miracle of calming the storm. (Mk 4:35-41) The helplessness of the disciples is visible. Here are men, who were thought to be masters of the sea through their acquaintance with the sea as fishermen. They fail to realize that there is a divine power among them who can control and subdue any force within and outside. Jesus is the embodiment of that Divine Power. He manifests it through a command. The narrative ends with a stunning remark from Jesus: "Why are you so frightened? Do you still have no faith?" He chides them about their lack of faith, despite having Him in their midst. God, who created us, knows every minute detail of our journey through life. He wants us to trust him completely. Regardless of our circumstances, God says to each one of us "Trust Me." He will do the right thing at the right time. Having God in our boat doesn't mean that we will not face any storms. It means that no storm can sink our boat. Let's walk in that faith.

Pray and Practice: Lord, nurture the seed of faith in me. May this faith help me to cast my fears and worries into your hands. Happy Fathers day and May God bless Deceased/Living Dad's.

It is a parable of the situation of all of us when cast adrift in the storms of our lives, seemingly without God's presence and care. But God is with us. Jesus does calm the storm for his disciples. Good stewards have faith that they do not live in a world where they should live in fear and chaos, seeing themselves alone and abandoned by God. Reflect this week on your own faith in the promises of Jesus. Do you believe Jesus is in our midst and can calm the storms in our lives?
