At that time Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty

nights, and afterwards he was hungry. The tempter approached and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command that these stones become loaves of bread." He said in reply, "It is written:

One does not live on bread alone,

but on every word that comes forth

from the mouth of God."

Then the devil took him to the holy city, and made him stand on the parapet of the temple, and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down. For it is written:

He will command his angels concerning you

and with their hands they will support you,

lest you dash your foot against a stone."

Jesus answered him, "Again it is written,

You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test."

Then the devil took him up to a very high mountain, and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in their magnificence, and he said to him, "All these I shall give to you, if you will prostrate yourself and worship me." At this, Jesus said to him, "Get away, Satan! It is written:

The Lord, your God, shall you worship and him alone shall you serve."

Then the devil left him and, behold, angels came and ministered to him.

LITURGICAL NORMS FOR LENT:

The Sundays in the Lenten Season are characterized by the use of violet vestments to emphasize that we have entered into a time of repentance in our lives and in our worship together. Some of these changes are required and others are optional. So that we can better enter into the penitential spirit of Lent we are observing the following changes. During Mass we are kneeling for the Penitential Rite as we plead for God's mercy for our sins. We see the color purple displayed in the church and sanctuary as a sign of our call to conversion from sin and to life in Christ. Singing the Gloria and the Alleluia are completely suspended for all Sunday Masses during Lent as a reminder that our joy is suppressed until we can praise the Lord of Glory as his Resurrection dawns at Easter. No fresh flowers are used and the more limited use of music complements this penitential season. All of this helps us to experience the dying of ourselves that must precede our rising to new life. During the entire season of Lent no baptisms are celebrated, except in cases of life-threatening emergencies. Instead, Lent is a time of catechesis preparing us for Baptism. Baptisms will again be celebrated beginning on Saturday night, April 15, at the Easter Vigil. In the meantime, the Baptismal Font and all of the Holy Water Fonts remain dry so that we may experience the dryness of Jesus' 40 days in the desert and so that we might thirst for the living waters of Baptism which make of us a new creation on Easter. As we break out of our usual mode of celebrating the Sundays in Ordinary Time, let these external changes spur us on toward internal changes that are a sign of our response to God's call for a deeper Conversion during this Season of Lent. Our Theme throughout all of the Lenten Season is "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel."

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT - WE CAN FIGHT EVIL: The first reading Gn 2:7-9; 3:1-7 tells us how Adam and Eve deliberately went against the commands of God. Their distrust and disobedience led not to wisdom but to shame and realization of their vulnerability as creatures. This fall had enduring consequences on humanity until the Son of God came to redeem it. St. Paul, in today's second reading Rom 5:12-19 contrasts Jesus Christ with Adam. The good news is that the free gift of grace in Christ supersedes and frees us from the consequences of Adam's sin. He brings justification and opens the door to eternal life. In the Gospel Mt 4:1-11, Matthew presents to us how Jesus resists and foils the attempts of the devil to tempt and entice Him. Firstly, Jesus, as the Son of God, refuses to rebel against the will of God by letting stones be stones and not turning them into bread. Secondly, He refuses to test the providential care of God by taking unnecessary risks. So, he does not jump from the pinnacle of the temple. Thirdly, He resolutely demonstrates His total love for God by refusing to worship wealth and power. As human beings, we are also tempted by the devil in different ways. But the new Adam, Jesus Christ, who came to restore the brokenness of humanity, shows us the way to defeat the devil. By His grace, we can fight the evil within and around us. Pray and **Practice:** Lord, give us the courage and strength to fight against every evil to worship and serve You alone, my God and Creator. Fr. Bose

First Sunday of Lent: In today's Gospel reading we listen to the confrontation between Jesus and the devil, who thought he might tempt Jesus to forget who he was and commit a grievous sin when he was most vulnerable. Jesus had just spent 40 days and nights out in the desert, alone, away from civilization. He was hungry, thirsty, and tired. If there ever was a time to tempt Jesus, that was it. Temptations to sin come at us every day, from many directions and in many different forms. When the temptation to sin tries to overcome us, how do we react? Do we consciously remind ourselves that we are followers of Christ? Is there a time this week when you have needed to confront a temptation to sin? What lessons did you take away from the experience?
