## THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER: LUKE 24:13-35

That very day, the first day of the week, two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. He asked them, "What are you discussing as you walk along?" They stopped, looking downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?" And he replied to them, "What sort of things?" They said to him, "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him. But we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel; and besides all this, it is now the third day since this took place. Some women from our group, however, have astounded us: they were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive. Then some of those with us went to the tomb and found things just as the women had described, but him they did not see." And he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the Scriptures. As they approached the village to which they were going, he gave the impression that he was going on farther. But they urged him, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the eleven and those with them who were saying, "The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!" Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

St. Mark, the Evangelist, Feast Day – April 25<sup>th</sup>: St. Mark is the author of the second Gospel, was the son of Mary whose house at Jerusalem was the meeting place of Christians, where St. Peter sough refuge after having been freed from prison. He was baptized and instructed by St. Peter. He accompanied St. Paul and his own cousin St. Barnabas in the evangelization of Cyprus before he became the companion and secretary of St. Peter in Rome about the year 42 A.D. He wrote his Gospel about the year 50 A.D. His Gospel is a record of St. Peter's preaching about Our Lord and pays special attention to the head of the Apostles, and emphasizes the miraculous powers of the Savior. The Gospel was written for Roman Gentile converts. It rarely quotes the Old Testament, and is careful to explain Jewish customs, rites and words. It excels in portraying the emotions and affections of both Christ and His hearers. St. Mark preached in Egypt, especially in Alexandria and was martyred there by the heathen. He died circa April 25, 68 A.D. in Alexandria, Egypt. In the 9th century, his relics were transferred from Alexandria to Venice, where a worthy tomb was erected in St. Mark's Cathedral. https://www.catholicculture.org/culture/liturgicalyear/calendar/



God is the author of life. The people who have encountered God in Jesus at some point in their lives have experienced new life in body and spirit. In this 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Easter both the first and second readings of the day, we see and witness the testimony of Peter about his experience of Jesus. Through his testimony, he reminds the people about the performance of God's deeds of power, wonders, and signs through his son Jesus when he was here on earth amidst them. God, through Jesus, has touched the lives of numerous people directly, especially those who were diseased and unwell and made them whole again. Now this same God has raised Him from the dead so that we may come to believe in the power of God. In the Gospel, we see how the risen Lord becomes a companion to the disciples who were on their way to Jerusalem after the death of Jesus. In their moments of pain, sorrow, and despair, He becomes the source of joy, happiness, and hope as He reveals Himself gradually to them. In the breaking of the bread, the disciples' eyes were opened, and they experienced a new life filled with faith, hope, and charity that led them to become the missionary of God's word. Pray and Practice: Lord, give us the grace so that our eyes may be opened to see the wonders of God in the creation and in our neighbours, and may it enable us to experience new life in You. Good Shepherd Sunday Special Collection Seminarian Education Fund April 29/30 (Previously printed date of May 6/7 was incorrect, the envelope in your box is dated May 6/7) On the Fourth Sunday of Easter, Good Shepherd Sunday, in the Gospel of John, Jesus says, "whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep."

The Diocese of Fort Worth is blessed to have 24 seminarians in various stages of the thorough discernment and formation journey. In imitation of Jesus Christ, they will teach and grow the faith. With your support, the Diocese of Fort Worth is committed to paying for all of the costs associated with their formation and education. Consequently, our seminarians can commit to prayer and studies during their education and formation. This period can span seven to nine years and cost up to \$50,000 annually for each of the men. ## LITURGICAL NORMS IN EASTER SEASON

The 50 days of the Easter Season are accentuated by changes in our liturgical practices so that we can actually experience the differences of this joyful season in our worship together. Some of these changes are required and others are optional. So that we can better enter into the joyful spirit of Easter we are observing the following norms. During Mass we will substitute the Sprinkling Rite for the Penitential Rite throughout the entire Easter Season. You will note that the Sunday Readings are taken from the New Testament only and the first of these Readings is always taken from Acts of the Apostles. The use of white vestments and the characteristic white displayed in the sanctuary emphasizes the new life of Resurrection in which all of us were initiated through our Baptism into Christ Jesus. The Gloria and the Alleluia are once again resurrected to help us express our Easter joy and to praise the Lord of Glory who is risen. Fresh flowers also return and are displayed in our sanctuary as signs of our new risen life through Christ who conquered sin and death once and for all. The Easter Vigil opened up the waters of Baptism to us so that we, Holy Mother Church, now give New Birth to those reborn into the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Baptisms can therefore be celebrated once again during the Sunday liturgies. The Baptismal Font and all of the Holy Water Fonts are also flowing with fresh water to remind us of our own Baptism as we make the Sign of the Cross upon entering the Church. First Holy Eucharist of our children and Confirmation of our adults complete the Easter sacraments of our initiation that bring us into full membership of the Church. They make us the People of God, adopted sons and daughters, coheirs with Christ, disciples of the Risen Lord Jesus. Our theme for the Easter Season is "The Lord is Risen, He is Truly Risen!"
