ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: MATTHEW 9:36—10:8

At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."

Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him.

Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

June 24th- In the breviary St. Augustine explains the reason for The Nativity of St. John the Baptist: "Apart from the most holy solemnity commemorating our Savior's birth, the Church keeps the birthday of no other person except that

of John the Baptist. (The feasts of the Immaculate Conception and of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin had not yet been introduced.) In the case of other saints or of God's chosen ones, the Church, as you know, solemnizes the day on which they were reborn to everlasting beatitude after ending the trials of this life and gloriously triumphing over the world.

"For all these the final day of their lives, the day on which they completed their earthly service is honored. But for John the day of his birth, the day on which he began this mortal life is likewise sacred. The reason for this is, of course, that the Lord willed to announce to men His own coming through the Baptist, lest if He appeared suddenly, they would fail to recognize Him. John represented the Old Covenant and the Law. Therefore he preceded the Redeemer, even as the Law preceded and heralded the new dispensation of grace."." - https://www.catholicculture.org

PETER'S PENCE COLLECTION – JULY 01/02:

On July 1-2 the Diocese of Fort Worth will take up the **Peter's Pence Collection**. Funds raised during this collection support the Universal Church and help the Holy Father as he shows mercy to the neediest people around the world, in recognition of the common humanity shared by peoples of all ethnicities and religious backgrounds.

When we say the Catholic Church is a Universal Church, we are witnessing to our own charity, mercy and love spread throughout the world, not just in our own city. The Peter's Pence Collection is a way to trust in your parish, diocese and Vatican. Begin with praying for the Church and her leaders that they serve with compassion. Last year's Peter's Pence allowed the Holy Father to purchase and donate an ambulance to the Mother and Child Health to assist children displaced by the Ukrainian war. More importantly, in solidarity with the victims of war, the papal almoner, Cardinal Konrad Krajewski, made two visits to Ukraine in March 2022. He first visited the cities of Rivne and Zhovka and other regions directly affected by the early conflict. He returned to Ukraine to celebrate Mass in the cathedral in Lviv and to deliver the ambulance. Your participation in the Peter's Pence collection allows for the Holy Father's charitable outreach to victims of war, migrants and refugees, and the poor affected by illness and natural disasters.

Please prayerfully consider supporting the **Peter's Pence Collection.** When you do you join the Holy Father's efforts to show mercy to all in two ways: you support the ongoing activities of the Holy See, and you contribute to the charitable works of the Holy Father on behalf of those who are most in need. On this XI Sunday of the Year, the three readings are interconnected through the central theme of God's love and compassion towards humanity, urging His followers to extend the same affection and empathy to others. The expression of love and compassion ought to emanate from the heart of every person. It is easy to demonstrate love and compassion towards those who reciprocate, but loving our enemies, as Jesus exemplified, can be arduous. The ultimate expression of God's love for humanity was revealed through Christ's death on the cross, despite our sinfulness. As taught by Jesus, it is important that we extend our love even to our enemies, demonstrating a selfless form of love and a compassionate spirit that is humble and generous towards those in need. In doing so, we will be spreading the Gospel of love and compassion, as we have freely received it ourselves. This bears witness to the fact that the kingdom of God is present among us. In the midst of diverse array of colour, culture, race, religion, and ideologies, what measures can we take to foster a more inclusive society? Can the love and compassion demonstrated by Christ offer a solution to the present-day conflicts and contradictions? If it does, what steps must we take, and how can we go about implementing them? Pray and Practice: Let us pray to Jesus, our Lord and Saviour, for the fortitude to carry out this vocation, by being a beacon of God's love to all we encounter in our day-to-day life.

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT:

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time: In this weekend's Gospel reading from Saint Matthew, we hear of Jesus calling his disciples to enter into a partnership with him to advance his mission of healing, reconciling and proclaiming the Kingdom of God. Good stewards understand this mission to begin with gratitude and trust and a willingness to share the wonderful hospitality of God to all human beings. A good reflection for this week: How do we understand our call to enter into a closer partnership with Jesus and to bring the Good News to neighbors and strangers alike?

MONTH OF JUNE IS DEDECATED TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS: The feast of the Sacred Heart was approved

for specified dioceses by Clement XIII in 1765, and extended to the whole Church by Pius IX in 1856. In 1889 Pope Leo XIII elevated it to the rank of first class, and through an encyclical letter in 1899 dedicated the whole Catholic world to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart was also an essential component of Pope John Paul II's hopes for the "new evangelization" called for by the Church.

"For evangelization today," he said, "the Heart of Christ must be recognized as the heart of the Church: It is He who calls us to conversion, to reconciliation. It is He who leads pure hearts and those hungering for justice along the way of the Beatitudes. It is He who achieves the warm communion of the members of the one Body. It is He who enables us to adhere to the Good News and to accept the promise of eternal life. It is He who sends us out on mission.
