THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: MATTHEW 22:34-40

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a scholar of the law tested him by asking, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."

ADULTS: In a practical sense, what is one thing that would change in your life if you loved your neighbor as yourself? **CHILDREN:** Why is it hard sometimes to love your neighbor? How can you do a better job of following Jesus' commandment?

All Saints Day – Holy Day of Obligation – November 1st:

During the year the Church celebrates one by one the feasts of the saints. Today she joins them all in one festival. In addition to those whose names she knows, she recalls in a magnificent vision all the others "of all nations and tribes standing before the throne and in sight of the Lamb, clothed with white robes, and palms in their hands, proclaiming Him who redeemed them in His Blood." The Feast of All Saints should inspire us with tremendous hope. Among the saints in heaven are some whom we have known. All lived on earth lives like our own. They were baptized, marked with the sign of faith, they were faithful to Christ's teaching and they have gone before us to the heavenly home whence they call on us to follow them. The Gospel of the Beatitudes, read today, while it shows their happiness, shows, too, the road that they followed; there is no other that will lead us whither they have gone. https://www.catholicculture.org/culture/liturgicalyear/calendar

MONTH OF NOVEMBER



Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. As a reminder of our duty to pray for the suffering faithful in Purgatory, the Church has dedicated the month of November to the Holy Souls. The Holy Souls are those who have died in the state of grace but who are not yet free from all punishment due to their unforgiven venial sins and all other sins already forgiven for which satisfaction is still to be made. They are certain of entering Heaven, but first they must suffer in Purgatory. The Holy Souls

cannot help themselves because for them the night has come, when no man can work (John 9:4). It is our great privilege of brotherhood that we can shorten their time of separation from God by our prayers, good works, and, especially, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

All Souls' Day – November 2nd:



<u>PRAYER FOR THE DEPARTED</u> -*Eternal rest, grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen.*

FOR ALL THE DECEASED - By Thy resurrection from the dead, O Christ, death no longer hath dominion over those who die in holiness. So, we beseech Thee, give rest to Thy servants in Thy sanctuary and in Abraham's bosom. Grant it to those, who from Adam until now have adored Thee with purity, to

our fathers and brothers, to our kinsmen and friends, to all men who have lived by faith and passed on their road to Thee, by a thousand ways, and in all conditions, and make them worthy of the heavenly kingdom. Amen.

FOR THE SOULS IN PURGATORY - O Lord, who art ever merciful and bounteous with Thy gifts, look down upon the suffering souls in purgatory. Remember not their offenses and negligences, but be mindful of Thy loving mercy, which is from all eternity. Cleanse them of their sins and fulfill their ardent desires that they may be made worthy to behold Thee face to face in Thy glory. May they soon be united with Thee and hear those blessed words which will call them to their heavenly home: "Come, blessed of My Father, take possession of the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world." Amen.

Today's readings invite us to love our brethren. In the first reading (Ex 22:20-26) God is reminding the people of Israel of the slavery they experienced in the land of Egypt. He calls them to be considerate towards the people who lived among them like sojourners and invites them to be merciful, especially to those who are orphans and widows. They are also given a warning that if the poor are oppressed and their cries reach Him, He will stand for them and deliver justice to them by punishing the oppressors. We can see a clear portrait of a loving and merciful God in this reading. Similarly, we can see how St. Paul in 2nd reading (1 Thes 1:5c-10) is directing the church in Thessalonica on how to be role models for the people who are living in Macedonia and Achaia in loving others and being merciful to others. These two readings remind us how to show mercy to others as God is merciful to us. St. Paul affirms that being merciful to others is the identity of believers of Christ. Today's Gospel (Mt 22:34-40) summarizes the message of both these readings. Jesus condenses the ten commandments of the Old Covenant into just two commandments: love your neighbor as yourself and love your Lord God with all your heart and mind. Loving the neighbors is the way one can express their love for God. That is the greatest challenge in our life but at the same time, it is our vocation as Christians. Pray and Practice: Dear Lord, help us to experience your unconditional love and lead us to share your love with everyone around us. Prayers Fr. Bose

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT:

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time - There is one command that summarizes this weekend's Gospel: to love. For Jesus there is no distinction between these two commands of loving God and neighbor. One naturally flows from the other. In fact, for Jesus, these commands constitute a way of life for Christian stewards; a unique approach to life and to their relationship with others. Our neighbors include everyone with whom we come into contact: family members, friends, people we don't like, strangers and particularly those most in need of our love and compassion. Love calls us to open our hearts and do more to help others grow closer to the Lord. How might we follow Christ's love command more fervently?
